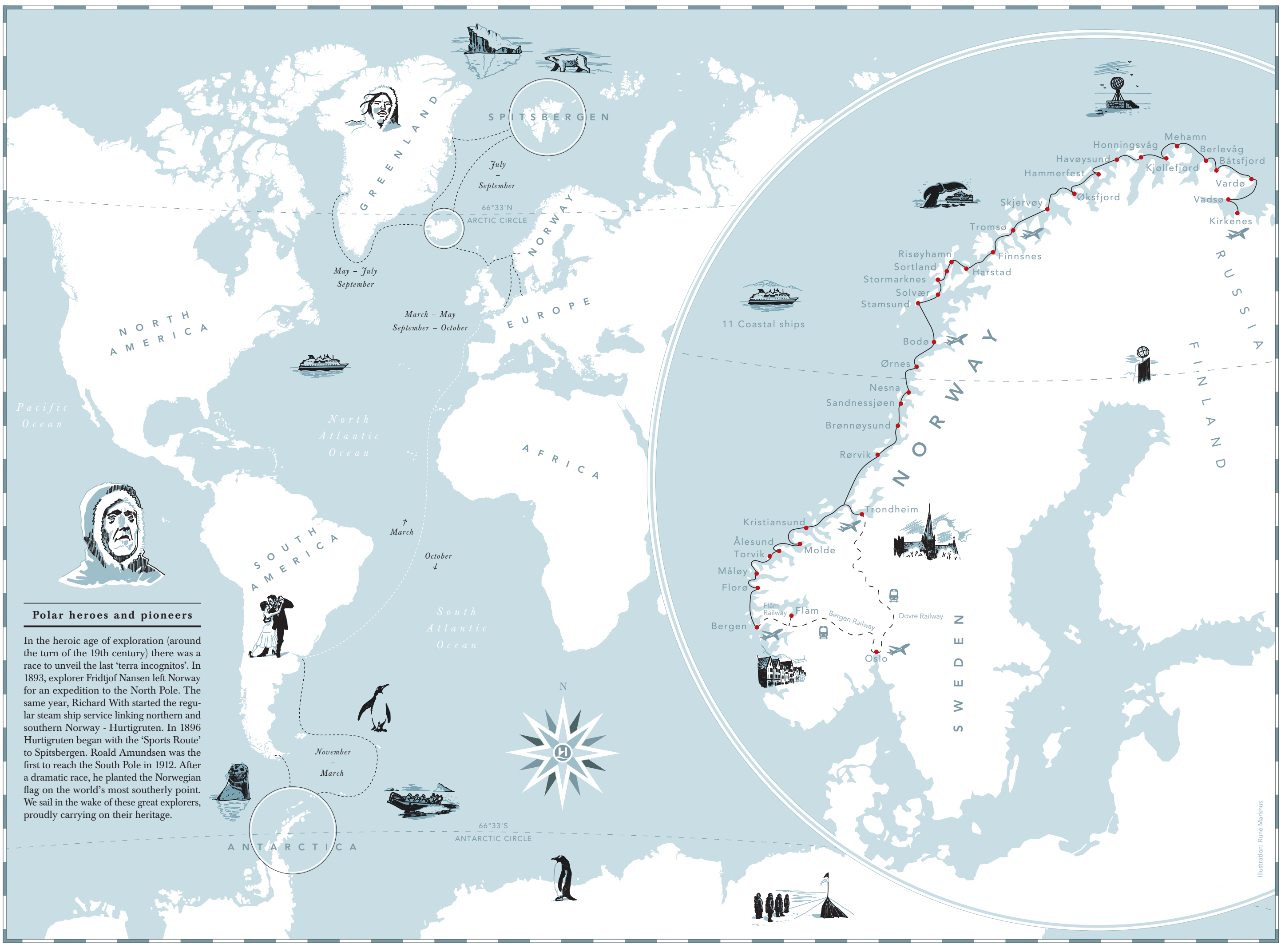

Sailing in the wake **OF GIANTS**

A MARITIME TRADITION OF WHICH WE ARE PROUD

In the late 19th Century, the 1,250km coastline from Bergen to Kirkenes was a busy route for all sort of shipping, from steamers to the single sailed jakts. But services were unreliable, infrequent and rarely sailed at night, making the journey from north to south a long and arduous experience.

The government wished to remedy the situation and invited shipping companies to submit tenders to operate an express route between Trondheim and Tromsø or Hammerfest depending on the season. Back then there were only 28 lighthouses north of Trondheim, making night-time sailing very risky. But the owner of a newly formed company showed an interest for the route despite the dangers. This man was Richard With.

In 1893, Captain Richard With's steamer, DS Vesteraalen, was brought into regular service along the coast of Norway, and a regular sea link was established. The service offered several weekly departures, first from Trondheim to Hammerfest and later from Bergen to Kirkenes in only seven days. He called this important connection 'hurtigruten', meaning the fast route.

The same year as Richard With established Hurtigruten, another Norwegian ship was sailing in more remote and even colder waters. The original Fram was the most famous vessel of its time, and the achievements of her expeditions are unparalleled: With Fridtjof Nansen she was the first ship to drift across the Arctic Ocean.

Then Otto Sverdrup used her to survey a larger area than any previous expedition – the Canadian territory of Nunavut. And most famous of all, she took Roald Amundsen to his starting point in Antarctica, as he raced to reach the South Pole. In 1896 Hurtigruten started the sportsman route to Spitsbergen, the beginning of our Explorer voyages.

More than 120 years later, Hurtigruten's explorer vessel MS Fram takes guests to Spitsbergen, Greenland, Iceland and Antarctica. Hurtigruten's eleven coastal ships still carry freight and passengers along the coast of Norway, and our captains use their extensive maritime expertise to ensure that guests and goods are safely carried from port to port. Our Captains and their Senior Officers are also experienced navigators of Polar waters. They take pride planning routes that minimise the load of the engines and reduce emissions.

Today, as they have been for the last 120 years, the Hurtigruten ships are the best way to explore Norwegian coastal life. And just like it was in the days of Nansen, Sverdrup and Amundsen, the new MS Fram is still a vessel for broadening its guests' understanding of the world.

I'M AT THE SOUTH POLE

Hallvard Nilsen is a designer, living in Oslo, Norway. When we interviewed him he was just about to leave to Antarctica, on what he calls 'the biggest adventure of my life'.

As a kid, Hallvard grew up in a small coastal village called Rødøy, located between Hurtigruten's port of calls Nesna and Ørnes. He took his first trip with Hurtigruten when he was three years old, and back then the family used it to visit friends in other coastal cities or to shop. "I remember that we relied on Hurtigruten when receiving things like furniture and fridges. Hurtigruten was an integral part of the community where I grew up and we depended on the ships", he says.

Fjords and authentic experiences

His first Hurtigruten voyage as a grown up was work related, travelling from Ålesund to Trondheim. "That was a great trip, we even went on one of the excursions to break up the day a bit. In Hjørundfjord, we participated in *A taste of Norway*, visiting several highlights such as Hotel Union Øye and the small community of Urke. Having an English guide actually gave me a whole other view and experience. It is really fun to be a tourist in your own country. These authentic stories about real places and people are things you can relate to!"

The thing he remembers best about the voyage was the possibility to work effectively during daytime, and relax during the calm evenings: "I spent my evenings alone in the Panorama lounge, had a glass or two of wine, and watched as we sailed past the beautiful landscape. It was lovely to be on board. I got time to relax and take some time out, so I will go again, just to re-experience this feeling.

The joke that turned into an epic voyage

Going to Antarctica in January 2014 started out as a joke between Hallvard and his friend. They were talking about great excuses for not accepting invitations to parties that he was receiving on Facebook. The best excuse was "I'm sorry; I'm on the South Pole that day." A lot of Norwegians go south to warmer climates in winter. And being able to say "We're leaving the Norwegian winter, going south – to Antarctica" was one of their gags.

But the idea of going to Antarctica grew on them. Hallvard had been to Spitsbergen and loved the remoteness and the feeling of experiencing something exotic. They realised that they either had to go now – or when they retired. Wanting to live life to its full, they decided to go now! After a lot of research they called Hurtigruten to check for tickets last summer, only to get the message that there were only one available cabin left. They decided there and then to book it.

When asked about what he is expecting he replies: "I really look forward to first spend a week in lively Buenos Aires. Then we leave from Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world, only to go even further south. Leaving civilization behind – knowing just a few people have travelled here before. Meeting penguins up close in their natural habitat is also something I am very excited about. It feels very special to go there, and my expectations are a big part of the journey", he says.

HALLVARD'S TIPS FOR THE BEST POSSIBLE VOYAGE

- Booking early can ensure that you get the cabin you want, and the best prices!
- Pack lots of layers! Us Norwegians like to say "There's no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothing".
- Invest in a good camera (with a good zoom lens) and bring spare batteries and memory cards!
- A good pair of sunglasses or ski-goggles will go a long way!

THE GATEWAY TO THE FJORDS

The 12-day Classic Round Voyage starts in Bergen, a city surrounded by seven mountains. Before departure you may wish to explore this cultural gateway to the fjords.

Bergen was founded in 1070 AD, and was the capital of Norway for several years. The city is a central point for Norwegian travel, yet has retained a great deal of local character and history. One example of this is the historic UNESCO-listed Bryggen district with colourful wharfs that date back to the 14th century. Take a stroll around this charming and compact city, spend some time in one of the outdoor cafés and restaurants, enjoy a trip on the Fløibanen Funicular or visit the Fish Market.

In autumn there will be a mini concert performed by students from the Grieg Academy before leaving Bergen. After embarkation we invite you to enjoy our tasty dinner buffet, based on the best ingredients from the coast. We sail north from Bergen along the Hjeltefjord, the same route the Vikings once sailed to the Shetland Islands and beyond – we are heading to the high north. Spend the rest of the evening relaxing as you take in the spectacular landscapes, either from deck or in our panorama lounges.

Before departure, you can explore more of Norway as part of one of our pre-voyage programmes. **Norway in a Nutshell** takes you through some of the most magnificent scenery in the area with breathtaking fjords, rural idyll and the spectacular Flåm Mountain Railway. With **Hardangerfjord in a Nutshell** you can experience majestic mountains, thundering waterfalls, small communities and idyllic orchards. **Sognefjord in a Nutshell** lets you discover the dramatic landscape that is claimed to be one of the most beautiful travel destinations in the world. These are all great ways to transform your voyage into a total Norwegian holiday; one that you will remember for the rest of your life.

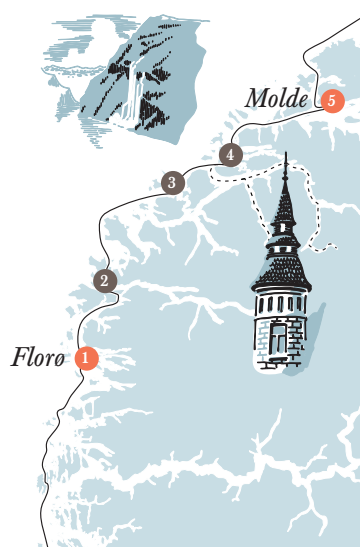
Fun fact:

Close to our port of call Torvik, you find Runde. This island is known for its bird-life that contains more than 500,000 birds. A Dutch ship was lost close to Runde in 1725. Sports scuba divers found the shipwreck in 1972 containing 57,000 gold and silver coins.



Art Nouveau, Geiranger and other MASTERPIECES

We continue north to Ålesund, a beautiful town filled with perfect examples of Art Nouveau architecture. If you travel in summer or autumn, there is a fjord experience awaiting today - in summer we will sail into the Geirangerfjord and in autumn we visit the Hjørundfjord.

If you wake up early the next day you have the chance to enjoy the breathtaking beauty of the Nordfjord, followed by a delicious breakfast. As we sail past the West Cape, we experience one of the voyage's few ventures into open sea. Then the ship navigates through skerries and islands before reaching Ålesund.

Distinguished by its numerous spires, towers and highly detailed ornamentation, Ålesund is a town renowned for its beautiful Art Nouveau architecture. It owes this to the devastating fire, which burned a large proportion of the city to the ground in 1904, following which the entire town was rebuilt in the fashionable style of the time, Art Nouveau. Join the city walk to get a closer look. On this excursion we will also visit the national centre for Art Nouveau.

If you like life in the sea, join us to Atlanterhavsparken - one of Northern Europe's largest salt-water aquariums. The tour includes a diving show and a visit to the open-air pool to see the resident penguins. After the visit to Atlanterhavsparken we continue onwards and upwards to Mount Aksla where you will get an amazing panorama of the area.

In the summer months we set course for the spectacular UNESCO-listed Geirangerfjord passing sheer, 800m cliffs and impressive waterfalls en route. If you join the excursion, your day begins with a drive up Orneveien,

enjoying magnificent views of Geirangerfjord en route to the beautiful Eidsdalen Lake. From there you take a picturesque ferry ride from Eidsdal to Linge. Back on dry land, we head for the stark, wild, high-alpine areas. One of the many highlights of this trip is the series of 11 hairpin bends down the winding Trollstigen Pass. We conclude with a dinner in Molde before embarking the Hurtigruten ship again.

In autumn we explore Hjørundfjord, situated amidst the majestic Sunnmøre Alps. Its seclusion and unspoiled natural landscape are what give this fjord its special character: far from the tourist bustle, taking passengers past steep rock walls, green meadows, lonely mountain farms and small villages. Join the excursion 'A taste of Norway' for a different experience in magnificent scenery. We anchor outside the village Urke, where a tender boat takes us to shore. We continue by bus through 'Norway's narrowest valley' - Norangsdalen. Arriving at Lyngstøl Lake you can see sites of ancient settlements in the water that was naturally dammed in 1908 after a large landslide - a fascinating sight. We will also visit the historic Hotel Union Øye and the community of Urke that offers local history in various forms.

In winter you can enjoy a colourful and enlightening lecture about the Aurora Borealis on board.

Be enlightened **BY THE MEDIEVAL SPIRIT**

Should you prefer a guided tour of Nidaros Cathedral or a casual walk through the Bakkland district, the architecture and surroundings in Trondheim create a beautiful and almost mythical setting for any outing.

Few large cities have managed to preserve their intimacy as effectively as Norway's third largest city, Trondheim. The Viking King Olav Trygvason founded this ancient city as early as 997. While you are here, be sure to enjoy the views from Gamle Bybrua (the Old Town Bridge) dating back to 1861 and the restored wooden buildings of the Bakkland district.

We also offer tours of Norway's national shrine, Nidaros Cathedral, Norway's only Gothic style cathedral built over the burial place of St. Olav, Norway's patron saint. Here you can marvel at the cathedral's incredible architectural details and exquisite works of art.

On one of these excursions we continue to the Ringve Museum of Musical History, where the history of Norway's music will be brought to life. This beautiful manor house is surrounded by a wonderful botanical garden,

and you will have fantastic views of both the city and the fjord.

In autumn you can join the trip out to Munkholmen. Originally this was an ancient place of execution, before becoming a Benedictine monastery around the year 1000. In 1658 it was made into a fortress and prison, and later a customs station. A boat trip on the beautiful Trondheim Fjord is an experience in itself, where you can see the city from the sea, and a visit to the fortress on the island will take you back in time thousands of years.

In the afternoon the ship sets a northwest course, passing the beautiful Kjeungskjær lighthouse and numerous charming islets and rocky outcrops. In autumn you can learn more about navigation and lighthouses along the Norwegian coast during the Captain's talk. After passing through the narrow Stoksund, the ship arrives at charming Rørvik.

DAY 4

BRØNNØYSUND – SVOLVÆR

Cross the Arctic Circle AND FACE THE CONSEQUENCES

Even if you aren't awake to see the border marker, the captain will make sure that the occasion is a memorable event. If you are sailing in Arctic waters for the first time you can participate in the Arctic Circle ceremony on deck.

The Arctic Circle marks the border to the Arctic region. In summer this means 24-hour daylight - often referred to as the 'Midnight Sun'. During winter, being above this degree of latitude that gives you the best chance of experiencing the Northern Lights.

Near Ørnes you find Svartisen, Norway's second largest glacier. Join us for a trip to the Svartisen Tourist Centre, where you can admire the beauty of this enigmatic ice world. Afterwards the journey continues along the beautiful coast of Helgeland up to Bodø where you rejoin the ship.

In Bodø you can enjoy an adventure in harmony with nature, eagles and the deep blue sea. We head to Saltstraumen in a RIB, where you will witness the world's most powerful tidal current. On this exciting journey through the wild landscape, there is also a good chance to observe sea eagles.

In spring there will be a presentation on deck 'Birds of the Nordic Coast – The Arctic Awakening'. Learn more about the millions of migrating birds returning to the Arctic Coast during the nesting period.

Later this afternoon the sight of the 1,000m high Lofoten Wall will appear on the horizon. The charms of the Lofoten Islands are revealed in all the small, picturesque fishing villages with their bohemian atmosphere. Tucked in between majestic granite cliffs and white sandy beaches, Lofoten is an experience that is out of the ordinary. Take a stroll between the stockfish racks and 'rorbuer', the traditional fisherman's huts.

In Stamsund you can join us on a historical journey to the Lofotr Viking Museum. We are invited into the Chieftain's house, a full size reconstruction featuring exhibits of finds dating back to the Viking age. The Chieftain and the lady of the house then invite you to join them for a real Viking feast in the banquet hall, giving you a taste of the Viking age, complete with traditional food, drinks, costumes, singing and dancing.

In winter, crossing the Arctic Circle is when the hunt for the Arctic light begins. We celebrate this with a presentation of 'The Magic Light, Aurora Borealis', where you can experience this phenomenon via pictures, words and music. After sailing through the narrow Raftsund, we stop at the entrance to Troll-fjord. Here we serve freshly made fish cakes out on deck. You will also hear the story of 'The battle of Trollfjord', which took place here in the winter of 1890.

If you look closely, you might see trolls up in the steep mountains. Or you might not.

Fun fact:

The famous Saltstraumen tidal current flows through a 150 m wide strait, which is spanned by a magnificent bridge. Four times a day (between high and low tide), huge quantities of water are forced in or out of the strait - 372m³ of water with an average speed of 29 km/h.





SURROUNDED BY EXCITEMENT IN THE ARCTIC

Get ready for a day full of exciting activities, whatever the season! Visiting Risøyhamn, Harstad, Finnsnes and the capital of the Arctic, Tromsø, you can join several excursions like whale watching, dog sledging, polar history walks and kayaking.

In summer, earlybirds can go ashore in Risøyhamn for our whale watching excursion. We will find the whales grazing at the edge of the vast deep basin by Andenes. The whales need to resurface in order to breathe, so we've got a great chance of sightings. It is breathtaking to see their flukes before they dive down again to feed. After several intense hours on the open sea, we set our course to Senja, known as 'Norway in Miniature' and re-join the Hurtigruten ship at Finnsnes, just in time for lunch!

From Finnsnes you can join an extraordinary winter experience at Lyngsfjord Adventure and Camp Tamok. On this thrilling wilderness adventure you can enjoy reindeer driving with either dog sledging or a snowmobile safari through the frozen landscape.

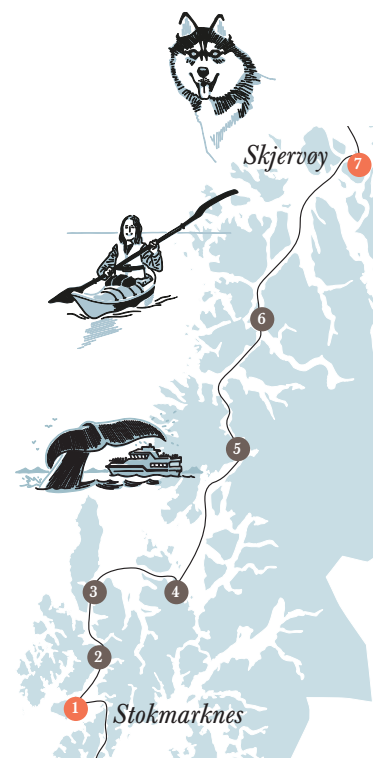
The ship continues to Tromsø for a prolonged stay. Many epic Arctic expeditions used Tromsø as a starting point. Join our Polar History Walk to learn more about explorers, arctic hunters and taste the beer from the northernmost brewery. On our all year excursion, 'The Arctic capital Tromsø', you will visit the Polaria centre, where you'll find an Arctic aquarium, seal pool, educational displays and a panorama cinema. The tour also includes a stop at the famous Arctic Cathedral, an architectural masterpiece and town landmark.

In winter and spring you can complete your stay in Tromsø with a thrilling husky dog sledge ride. On this miniature polar expedition the huskies pull us over the frozen landscape while we enjoy stunning views of the ocean, mountains and open plateaus. During the polar night, the only light we'll

see will come from our headlamps, the starry sky, and if we're lucky; the magical Northern Lights. In summer you cannot go dog sledging, but you can still meet the more than 250 huskies and puppies who live at the Wilderness Centre. You will also learn more about dog sledge driving and the world's longest dog sledge race, the Iditarod.

If you want to experience the peace and tranquillity of the sea, why not join us on a kayaking excursion? Paddle in the waters off the coast of Tromsø with the mountains as a stunning backdrop. This is a great way to silently travel through these pristine waters and get close to the marine wildlife.

After an exhilarating day in Tromsø, we continue our northbound journey. In autumn you can enjoy folk music preformed by local artists before departure, and in winter the Captain invites guests to taste stockfish on deck. The ship is now sailing into the area along the coast where you have the best chance of seeing the Northern Lights between October and March, and we gather on deck to search for this breathtaking phenomenon.

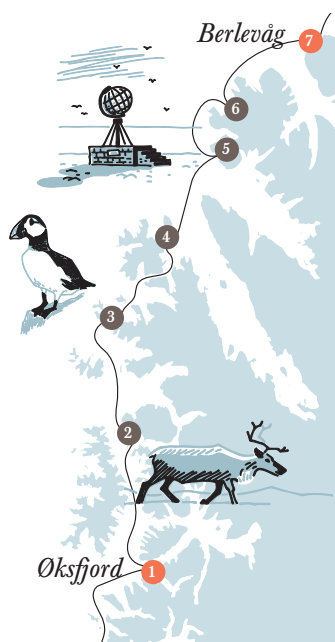

EXPLORE THE NORTHERN SOUL AND CAPE

Enjoy the magnificent sub-Arctic landscape as we cross the 71st parallel on our journey towards the North Cape, the northernmost point on the continent. In summer, you might see herds of grazing reindeer and a small camps belonging to the indigenous Sámi people.

After brief early stops in Hammerfest and Havøysund we arrive in Honningsvåg, the gateway to the spectacular North Cape. The optional excursion to the North Cape Plateau puts you at 71°10'21"N, only 2,000km from the Geographical North Pole. Standing on top the 307m North Cape plateau gives you a sublime feeling of being at the end of the world. While admiring the view, make sure you get some photographic evidence of this amazing place. After all, you can't get any further north in mainland Europe.

The tour includes a visit to the North Cape Hall, where you can see an impressive panoramic film about Finnmark and the North Cape, buy souvenirs, send postcards or just relax with a coffee and a bite to eat.

Close to the North Cape you find one of the world's most exciting nature reserves, Gjesværstappan. Join the bird-watching safari to experience Finnmark's largest flock of puffins, together with large numbers of kittiwakes. During the nesting season this area is teeming with life as mighty sea eagles hover above in search of prey. Meanwhile guillemots, razorbills, cormorants, Arctic skuas, northern fulmars, Brünnich's guillemots, and the large northern gannet fill the air with a cacophony of shrieks and screeches. In the autumn you can also catch a glimpse of Europe's smallest seabird, the British storm petrel.

The Hurtigruten ship continues north, sailing in the heartland of the indigenous Sámi people. We pass their ancient sacred site, the

rock formation Finnkirka, as we approach our next stop, the fishing village Kjøllefjord. Here you have the opportunity to learn more about the Sámi people, as well as exploring the wonderful scenery, all year on our different excursions. On 'A taste of Lapland' we head to a Sámi camp and meet the reindeer herders the Utsi family, who will welcome you into their lavvo dressed in traditional costumes. Learn about the traditions and the Sámi people's way of life, and hear traditional Sámi joik (song). You then go out to see the reindeer where you can try your hand at lassoing. The trip continues up to the Finnmark plateau, 300m above sea level, where you might also see reindeer in their natural habitat.

In winter you can join us on an unforgettable snowmobile trip to one of Europe's most extreme and exciting natural areas. Along the way, the guides will tell you about the Sámi people, the geographic and climatic conditions, what life is like on the Finnmark coast, and how the local population utilises nature in both the summer and winter months. Experience the snow-clad valleys, the fresh winter air and perhaps the mesmerising Northern Lights in the clear, starry sky.

'Sámi Autumn' is an excursion where you can learn about the arctic nature's 'pantry and pharmacy.' Here you can sample dried reindeer meat, crowberry juice, herbal tea (nettle) and roseroot mixture. And maybe you will feel the presence of the Noaidi, the Sámi shaman.

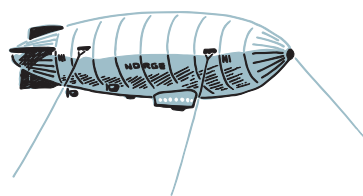

Fun fact:

People living north of the Arctic Circle are used to long, dark winters with Northern Lights and 24 hours of Midnight Sun during summer. One of the most popular sayings up here is 'Sleeping is something you can do down south'.

On the island of Vadsøya you have a chance to see the airship mast used by Umberto Nobile and Roald Amundsen for their expedition over the North Pole with the airship Norge in 1926, and used again on Nobile's flight with the airship Italia in 1928.



Step into the arctic WILDERNESS

The vistas become more dramatic as we approach Kirkenes, just a few kilometres from the Russian border. This is Hurtigruten's turning point. Kirkenes is known as the capital of the Barents region and the gateway to the east. As we turn south, the northbound ports previously visited by night are now seen by day.

We arrive in Vadsø early in the morning. Located in the Varanger region, this is one of the most attractive and popular bird-watching areas in the Arctic due to it being directly in the path of birds migrating from east to west. The advantageous biotopes combined with the rich resources in the adjacent Arctic Ocean attract myriad species and numbers of birds.

Just after breakfast we arrive in Kirkenes, putting us at 30° East, further east than Istanbul and St. Petersburg. The Russian border is close by, and you may find it intriguing that the road signs are written in both Norwegian and Russian. Depending on the season, there are several ways to make a visit to the Russian border. You can either go by bus (all year), enjoy a riverboat safari or an action filled trip on ATV/quad-bike. Kirkenes also boasts several fascinating small museums recounting the history and heritage of this remote frontier. Spending time in Kirkenes gives you an opportunity to take part in some of the adventurous activities offered in this Arctic environment.

In winter Kirkenes is home to the fantastic Snow Hotel, the base for several exciting excursions. During spring you may still be able to participate in our winter activities and excursions. You could explore the Arctic winter on a snowmobile, driving over a frozen fjord. During the trip your guides will tell you about the history of the Sámi people, the extreme Arctic climate and the unique wildlife that inhabits the area. On our husky sledge adventure the huskies eagerly transport you across the frozen landscape, taking you through the arctic wilderness. You can also visit the Snow Hotel and meet

the reindeers living in the grounds. Our Arctic bushcraft excursion in autumn provides you with an insight into this season; how people have harvested, stored, hunted and fished for centuries.

As the ship starts its voyage south, you can first enjoy a wonderful lunch followed by views of arctic wilderness from deck or the panorama lounge. There will be a presentation on Sámi history in the autumn season. Leaving Kirkenes, you've only seen half of what the coast has to offer. Prepare yourself for many new experiences. The ports previously visited by night on the northbound journey are now seen by day.

In the afternoon the ship docks in Vardø again, Norway's easternmost port. Weather permitting, we may invite you to experience ice bathing in the Arctic Ocean. On board there will also be a presentation of the birds of the Nordic coast in spring, and in winter local Arctic divers will bring displays and give a lecture out on deck about life in the ocean. We continue along the Varanger peninsula to Båtsfjord before reaching Berlevåg in the evening – the home town of one of Norway's most famous men's choirs consisting mostly of local fishermen.

Lyngenfjord FOR YOUR EYES ONLY

Why not start the day with breakfast at North Cape?

In spring we sail into the spectacular Lyngenfjord on our way to Tromsø, known as 'the Paris of the North'. As we arrive in this charming city you may choose to book a seat at the Midnight Concert at the Arctic Cathedral, or you could check out one of the town's many friendly pubs.

In the middle of the night we dock at Mehamn, where it is possible to join an unforgettable snowmobile trip through one of Europe's most extreme and exciting natural areas. Experience the snow-clad valleys, the fresh winter air and perhaps the mesmerising Northern Lights in the clear, starry sky. During summer the 24-hour daylight allows you to explore the Norwegian coast around the clock. On the excursion 'Arctic Summer Night' you can experience the magnificent scenery of mainland Europe's northernmost peninsula, Nordkyn. While looking for the area's endemic reindeer, your guide will tell you about the Sámi people and how humans have adapted to deal with both the weather and extremes of light and darkness at 71 degrees north. When the clock strikes three in the morning we head back to the waiting ship for some well-earned sleep.

In Honningsvåg you can enjoy an excursion and breakfast at the North Cape while discovering hidden parts of Finnmark. Before stopping in Hammerfest, you can enjoy an 'Energy coffee' and a short introduction to 'Melkøya - The northernmost natural gas terminal' on board. In autumn we invite you

to taste dried reindeer meat on deck. Hammerfest itself was founded in 1789, and in its time was Norway's polar capital, acting as a base for hunting expeditions to the high Arctic. Here you can see the UNESCO-listed Meridian Column, erected in 1854 to commemorate the first precise measurement of the globe.

We continue south to Øksfjord. In winter our crew will teach you how to tie maritime knots on deck. After crossing open water, we will make a brief stop at the old trading post of Skjervøy before sailing through the beautiful Lyngenfjord in spring. Surrounded by the snowy peaks of the Lyngen Alps, we may be visited by a local fisherman and enjoy a taste of local freshly-caught prawns.

We dock in Tromsø just in time to enjoy a Midnight Concert at the Arctic Cathedral. Alternatively a walk around this town will give you the chance to enjoy a local brew in one of its many friendly pubs.

The Lofoten region is renown for its natural beauty with steep mountains, wild nature and small, picturesque fishing villages. This day also offers several exciting excursions that will make you feel like a natural born explorer.

Fun fact:

Houses in the Lofoten Islands are red, yellow or white. In ancient times a red house meant poor while white house exhibited wealth. At this time red was the cheapest colour used for paint, consisting of a mixture of cod liver oil, rust and animal blood. Yellow houses had ochre mixed with cod liver oil while the white houses used zinc oxide in the oil.



We arrive at Harstad this morning, where you have the opportunity to participate in one of the classics in Hurtigruten's excursion programme: A taste of Vesterålen. Experience history, beautiful scenery and a selection of breathtaking sites that include a visit to Trondenes Church, one of Norway's premier cultural heritage sites from the late middle age. Those who choose to stay on board can enjoy the views of this old church as they sail towards the Risøyrenna. This shallow channel is just 7m deep, and was made especially for Hurtigruten in the 1920s, providing an 'inside route' between Harstad and Sortland. The sand banks are visible through the clear, green water. The island groups of Lofoten and Vesterålen offer some of the most stunning scenery you will see during your coastal voyage.

Risøyhamn is a small village with only 200 inhabitants, and we make a short stop here to deliver passengers, groceries and mail. As a tribute to the fishing history in this region, our chef shows how to fillet the catch of the day on deck in spring. Then we continue via Sortland to Stokmarknes, where Hurtigruten was founded more than 120 years ago. You find the Hurtigruten museum here, and entry is included for all passengers. Continuing south it looks like we are sailing straight into the mountain wall, but the captain finds an opening and sails through the narrow Raftsund. This 20km passage between Lofoten and Vesterålen takes you through mountains reaching up to 1,000m.

Now we reach the spectacular Trollfjord, only 2km long and 100m wide, with majestic mountains surrounding it. If the weather and time permits it – the captain will take a detour in here. The steep cliffs hug the ships side, and the dramatic landscape will take you to

a land of trolls and fairy tales. In winter we will serve freshly cooked fish cakes on deck at the fjord's entrance.

Trollfjord is the realm of the sea eagle. Just north of the fjord a smaller vessel lies ready to take you out to see the king of the birds close up on our optional sea eagle safari. First we accompany the Hurtigruten ship into the Trollfjord, where we will see the ship turning around in the narrowest of spaces, a magnificent sight alone! The eagle safari begins in earnest when we leave the Trollfjord, passing through a narrow seaway flanked by a range of steep mountains. This is where the sea eagles dwell and can be viewed. These beautiful, rare birds of prey circle the boat a few times, before we throw fish into the sea for them to dive in and collect. Taking a camera on this trip is a must!

Reaching Svolvær, you can choose from several excursion options in summer and spring. Join our Lofoten Islands tour to learn more about the fishing communities, beautiful scenery and art from this area. You can enjoy a horseback ride and experience the wonder of a sunset trot through the powdery white sand. If you'd like a bit more of an adrenaline rush and action, our high-octane excursion by RIB into the fantastic Lofoten archipelago is the thing for you. On this high-speed experience you will visit a lagoon with white sandy beaches surrounded by small islands and skerries that protect it from the mighty ocean outside.

From Svolvær we continue on to Stamsund, where the majestic peaks of the huge Lofoten wall can be viewed. We leave the islands during the evening and set course for the mainland.

A date with THE SEVEN SISTERS

The Helgeland coast with its hundreds of islets, fertile farmland and steep granite walls is rich in local lore. Legends include of how an arrow fired by the troll Hestmannen formed the hole in Torghatten Mountain.

Crossing the Arctic Circle at 66°33'N is an important 'rite of passage' today. We celebrate this with a taste of our Arctic traditions out on deck. Another highlight is sailing past the Seven Sisters mountain range. All seven mountains are between 900 and 1,100 m high, and it is easy to understand how these 'ladies' have influenced ancient myths. According to Norwegian folk tales, trolls are turned to stone if they do not hide before the sun rises. This was also the case for these seven beautiful sisters who, whilst still beautiful, are now also mountains.

We take a short stop in Nesna, an idyllic old trading post before moving on to Sandnessjøen.

The UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Vega Islands is close to our call in Sandnessjøen and can be visited on an optional excursion during summer. Norway is one of the world's major exporters of fish and seafood. In Brønnøysund we offer an excursion to the Norwegian Aquaculture Centre. Here you will learn about salmon farming and the surrounding environment. You can even meet the salmon, see what they eat and how they live. Don't expect the fish to say much about themselves, though. Your guide will take care of that.



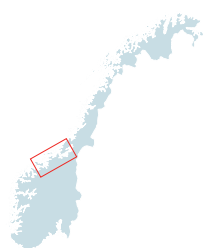
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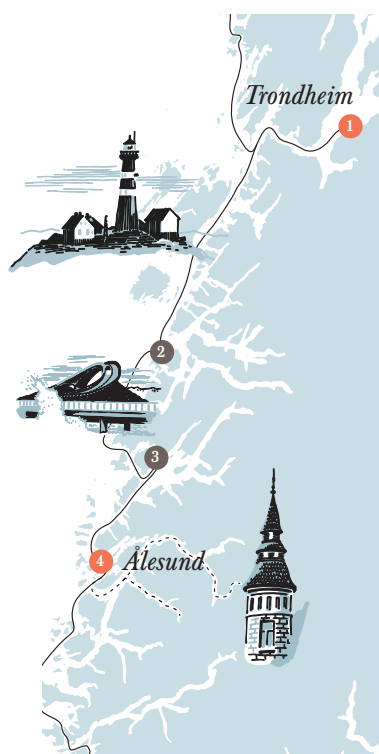

Today gives you another opportunity to explore the city of Trondheim. Passing the islands of Munkholmen, Hitra and thousands of islets and skerries, we make stop in Kristiansund and then cross the open sea on our way to Molde.

The city walk through Trondheim is a journey through its 1,000-year history. We start with Stiftsgården, the royal residence in Trondheim, and continue to the market square. From here, we continue to Nidaros Cathedral, the national monument of Norway. After crossing the old city bridge with its red gateway, known to the locals as ‘the portal of happiness’, we enter the area of the city called Bakkland, which has managed to preserve its charming wooden architecture. Back on board, the ship head out of the majestic Trondheimsfjord, which is 170km long and up to 25km wide. Like all other Norwegian fjords it is deep, 577m at most.

As we sail along the coast you’ll realise the importance of fish to Norwegian coastal communities. Kristiansund’s location has provided the town with a wealth of opportunities in the fishing, shipbuilding and

oil industries. This town is now regarded as Norway’s ‘cured cod capital’ because of its long time export of salted dry fish. Here you can join a trip to the Atlantic Road, one of Norway’s most visited tourist destinations. It is 8.2km long, built on a total of eight bridges and surrounded by a picturesque landscape. After a short sightseeing tour in Kristiansund we continue to Averøy, and visit Kvernes Stave Church.

As we cross the open sea to Molde, known as the ‘city of roses’, you will notice the steep, grey, pointed peaks of the Romsdal Alps.

The last chapter of THE FERRY TALE

During the night, the ship will call at Ålesund, Torvik, Måløy as the *world's most beautiful voyage* starts to draw to a close. Make the most of your final impressions of Norway.



Before we dock in Bergen there are still a few nautical miles of fascinating scenery ahead of us, such as the picturesque Nordfjord below the enormous Jostedal glacier. The fjord widens to the east and forges 90km inland to Loen and Olden. The rugged coastal areas are a striking contrast to the inner fjord areas where the wind is less fierce and there is less rain. Fertile fruit gardens and the fingers of glaciers stretch out towards glistening lakes and gushing rapids. Both types of landscape have their own distinctive charm and tourists are well advised to experience both.

In the morning we will make a call at Florø, a modern town representing the Sogn og Fjordane region's oldest and Norway's most western town. Despite constant changes, the city of Florø has managed to maintain its special features, appearing as a busy and charming conurbation. The small-town atmosphere is very much alive with a charming high street and a good selection of shops.

A few nautical miles south of Florø we navigate the estuary of the mighty Sognefjord. You also get the best views of the archipelago en route. And finally you disembark in Bergen, taking with you memories of a unique journey filled with impressions, experiences and meetings with the locals, wildlife and the stunning nature.

And even though all good things must come to an end, like this journey, we hope to see you on board for new adventures in the very near future.

Gareth Williams studied history at the universities of St Andrews and Bergen, writing his PhD on aspects of Viking settlement in Scotland. Since 1996 he has been a curator at the British Museum, and he is the lead curator of its major Viking exhibition in 2014. His research covers most aspects of the Viking Age, with a particular focus on warfare, and on coinage and other forms of exchange.

He is a regular guest expert on TV and radio programmes concerning the Anglo-Saxons, Vikings and Normans, and in addition to extensive academic publications, his books for non-specialists include *Eirik Bloodaxe*, *Treasures from Sutton Hoo*, *Early Anglo-Saxon Coins*, *The Vale of York Hoard* (with Barry Ager), *Viking Ships* and *Viking Britain and Ireland* (with Jayne Carroll and Stephen Harrison). He is currently writing an academic textbook on Viking warfare and military organisation.

Join us on an educational voyage of discovery and find out more about these fascinating people, their empire and their legacy. Here, you will join our Trondheim with Nidaros Cathedral excursion taking you under the skin of this charming city and its magnificent Gothic house of worship. Founded around 997AD by the Viking King Olav Tryggvason, Trondheim has grown to be Norway's second largest city but has retained the charm and warmth of a provincial town with its handsome civic architecture, colourful wooden wharfs and the wooden royal palace of Stiftsgården. Nidaros Cathedral is the final resting place of King Olav who was later canonised and is now Norway's patron saint.

We'll also sail through the Lofoten and Vesterålen Islands, an area rich with sagas of the Norsemen. It is here that you can enjoy our Viking Feast excursion (included in your voyage). Join the chieftain and his wife in a reconstruction of the largest Viking longhouse ever discovered. Here you will be regaled with stories and given traditional Viking food & drink.

From here, we sail the coastline north to Kirkenes on the Russian border. En route we'll be stopping at the friendly university town of Tromsø, the world's northernmost town, Hammerfest and the gateway to the North Cape, Honningsvåg.

As we make our way south, a midnight call in Tromsø allows you the chance to go ashore and enjoy the spectacle of the midnight concert at the Arctic Cathedral.

Further down the coast we enjoy a daylight sailing through the spectacular narrow channel, the Raftsund, a possible diversion into the even narrower Trollfjord and impressive vistas of the Helgeland coast with the Seven Sisters mountain range.

LECTURES MAY INCLUDE

Who were the Vikings?

This lecture provides an introduction to the Vikings, looking at the changing interpretation of the word 'Viking' over time, and providing an overview of Scandinavian society and the breadth of Scandinavian contacts and achievements in the Viking Age.

Viking Treasures

Vikings have been seen as both raiders and traders, but both raiding and trading are driven by the desire for wealth. This lecture explores the notion of wealth in the Viking Age on the basis of the gold and silver treasures that they left behind them, set in their historical context.

Vikings and the 'North Way': The coastal voyages of Ottar

The modern name Norway derives from the Old Norse words for 'North Way', which was used to describe the sailing route up the west coast. A unique account from the late 9th century describes the lifestyle of Ottar, a chieftain from northern Norway, and his voyages round the northern tip of Norway to Russia, and south to the Oslo Fjord and Denmark. This lecture explores Ottar's account, and how it fits with archaeological evidence.

MS MIDNATSOL

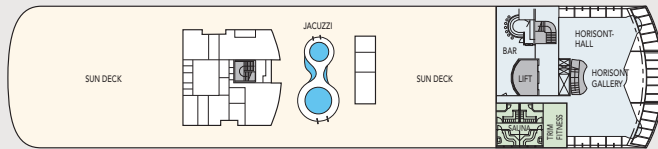
The name Midnatsol (Midnight Sun) is something to live up to, and this ship, dedicated to the Norwegian summer, does just that. The interior's bright, colourful décor is inspired by the warm sunny climate, a motif also reflected in the many pieces of Norwegian modern art on display. MS Midnatsol was put into service on 15 April 2003 and is the fourth Hurtigruten ship to bear this name. The ship has a strong environmental profile and a modern design, with Norwegian materials used extensively throughout its interiors. Together with her sister ship, MS Trollfjord, MS Midnatsol is among the newest in the fleet. What characterises both ships is the large, two-storey panorama lounge above the bow and the large glass expanses that allow natural light to enter as well as providing extraordinary views. 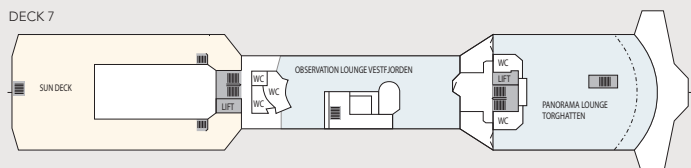




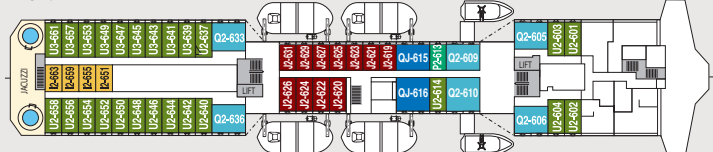
MS NORDNORGE

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MS NORDKAPP

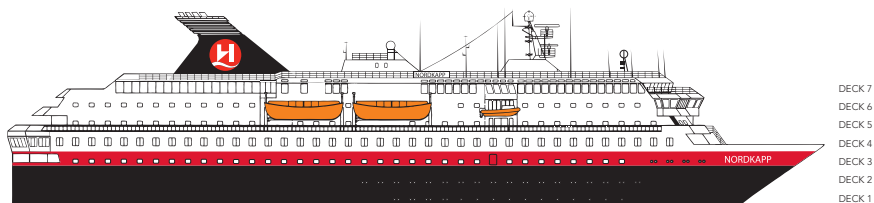

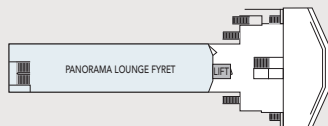




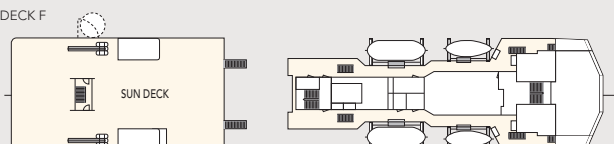
MS VESTERÅLEN

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Correspondence

If you make your booking through a travel agent all communication between you and Hurtigruten must be via that agent. If you book your holiday direct with us all correspondence will be sent to the Lead Passenger. Please quote your booking reference number in all communications. When you or your agent contact us we will usually confirm your holiday at the earliest opportunity and advise current flight times, prices, including any applicable supplements or extras, etc. For high season dates, when demand is greater, or if you book within eight weeks of departure, we may have to request your cabin, flight or hotel space and it may take slightly longer to confirm your holiday. An invoice will be sent to confirm your arrangement. If you are travelling with friends but would each like to receive separate documents please advise us at the time of booking. Travel documents are generally sent approximately 7–14 days prior to departure.

Special requests

If you have any special requests (e.g. dietary or medical), please inform us at the time of booking. We will do our best to meet such requests but cannot guarantee to do so and in no circumstances will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of our contractual agreement.

Mobility

We are happy to welcome passengers who are not fully mobile and all ships (except MS Lofoten) have at least one cabin equipped for travellers using a wheelchair. Our sales consultants will also try to book appropriate hotel rooms. Passengers who use a wheelchair must bring their own, standard size, foldable chair. Guests who are able to navigate around the ship unaided in a wheelchair need not to have a travel companion. Those who need assistance may need to be accompanied. Please discuss with your booking agent. In mainland Norwegian ports there is a ramp for embarkation/disembarkation. Excursions have not been adapted specifically for passengers with walking difficulties. Please contact us or the Tour Leader when you are on board who will be able to advise which excursions are suitable. It is essential you advise us of special requirements at the time of booking to enable us to make the necessary arrangements for you.

Changes to the itinerary/excursions

All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change – weather, sea and ice conditions may affect the itinerary.

As Christmas approaches itineraries may change in order for ships to host dinners and celebrations for local communities. Please take care that you are back in time on board, especially when your ship arrives with a delay but departs in time to keep the schedule. The departure time is displayed at the gangway. Please note that ships can't wait for belated passengers. If you miss your ship you need to arrange by yourself and at your own expense the trip to the next harbour.

Minimum numbers

Some holidays are subject to a minimum number of participants to enable them to take place. Should the minimum not be reached we will advise you at least 60 days prior to your departure, when we reserve the right to cancel the holiday and refund all monies paid to us. Alternatively, you may choose another holiday with us but if the alternative arrangement is at an additional cost, the difference will be payable by you.

BEFORE YOU GO

Passports

All guests have to present a valid passport (valid for six months after the date of return) when they check in.

Vaccinations

At the time of printing there are no compulsory vaccinations or health requirements for travelling to Norway. It is however the responsibility of all passengers to ensure they comply with any health requirements at the time of travel. We suggest you consult your doctor or relevant health authorities about any precautions you should take with regard to Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT).

Currency in Norway

We suggest that you take a small amount of local currency (Norwegian Kroner-NOK) in cash. Major credit cards are widely accepted except possibly at smaller businesses. You may be asked to provide

identification when you pay by credit card or exchange money. Please also see: Payment options on board under **On board information**.

GENERAL

Brochure Accuracy

The information and descriptions contained in this brochure have been checked by our staff and/or local agents to ensure they are correct. However, changes may occur after the date of publication and there may be occasions when Hurtigruten or local suppliers may withdraw some facilities. Should we become aware of any significant change which may be considered to have an effect on the enjoyment of your holiday we will do our utmost to advise you. Public holidays and religious festivals may also affect the availability of resort and hotel facilities. Tourist offices can provide details of such events. Some areas we visit are very remote, affected by prolonged cold weather or difficult terrain. Provision of facilities will be subject to local conditions, and customs and lifestyles may differ from those to which you are accustomed.

Hotel accommodation

The standard of the hotels we use is equivalent to 3 or 4-star. There is no official hotel rating system in Norway. All rooms have private facilities (except for the Snow Hotel in Kirkenes). Single rooms may be smaller and less conveniently situated and may be double rooms for sole occupancy or purpose built single rooms. Hotels may charge for some facilities e.g. saunas.

Tour arrangements

The voyages and tours in this brochure are based on independent travel, however all ships and many of our featured hotels have information staff who will advise you on excursions and offer general assistance. Some of our holidays are part escorted.

Transfers

Transfers are included as shown and are usually unaccompanied. They may be operated by private coach, scheduled airport coach or train, minibus or taxi. Full details will be forwarded with your travel documents. Please be aware of the information in the brochure **Arrival and departure information** which is part of your travel documents.

Wildlife & Natural Phenomena

The Hurtigruten brochures include pictures and descriptions of wildlife, which may be seen from the ships and during excursions. Spending time on outside decks increase your chance of spotting wildlife and natural phenomena, but there is no guarantee of sightings.

ON BOARD INFORMATION

Activities on board

The emphasis on board is on relaxation and getting away from the commercial entertainment which is so often a part of conventional cruises. Our aim is to get closer to unique environments and share the experience with fellow passengers. As a part of Hurtigruten's seasonal product concepts, we offer some interesting on board activities, demonstrations and presentations during the voyages. The activities which take place both inside the vessels and outside on deck, have relevance to the season we are sailing in. It is up to the guest to join and the activities will be announced in our day to day programmes or announced on board.

Cabins

The times for checking out of cabins are according to the ship's timetable and may vary from day to day. On arrival in Bergen, Kirkenes and Trondheim (southbound) special rules apply:

- Cabins for departure from Bergen are available from 18:00 hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Kirkenes is before 8:00 hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Trondheim (southbound) is before 8:00 hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Bergen is before 10:00 hrs.

Please contact the reception for more information. If you are travelling in a suite, different check-out timings may apply, please contact the reception. The facilities of the cabins vary between the ships and the various cabin grades. Towels and shower gel/liquid soap are provided in all cabins, in addition to this all cabins (except for MS Lofoten and some cabins on board MS

Vesterålen) also have a hair dryer. Tea/coffee making facilities are available in suites only. It is possible to hire cots on board; a limited number can be pre-booked. Please note that cots do not fit into all cabins. Please contact Hurtigruten for further information. For bookings with unspecified cabin grades/numbers, requests for adjacent cabins or accommodation in a specific area of the ship etc cannot be guaranteed. During winter months some cabins have portholes which may be covered due to weather conditions. There are no safety deposit boxes in the cabins (exceptions: some suites on board MS Trollfjord and MS Midnatsol and all cabins on board MS Finnmarken have safety deposit boxes). Hurtigruten cannot accept liability for any loss. Valuables may be handed in at reception to be kept in the ship's safe. Please note that cabins on decks with passenger access to outside areas may sometimes have an obstructed view due to other passengers walking past. Please ask our reservations team for advice on the best cabin location for you.

Cabin numbers

For our Bergen - Bergen and Bergen - Kirkenes - Trondheim voyages and all suite bookings you will be able to choose a cabin number at no extra charge (subject to availability), for all other voyages 5 nights or longer you have the option to choose a cabin number at a fee subject to availability. Please see the applicable price panel for details of such fees. For all other voyages and if you decide not to pay the separate fee, your cabin number will be assigned upon embarkation.

Cafeteria

Hot and cold drinks and snacks may be bought in the cafeteria, usually open 24 hours a day. During the winter, times are advised on board.

Dietary requests

Special diets, e.g. vegetarian can be catered for if requested in good time. Passengers on strict diets, e.g. vegans, may find that there is a limited choice.

Electric current

220v AC. – 2 pin Continental-type for which an adapter is required. If you need an adapter/converter, please bring your own with you.

Embarkation/disembarkation

In Bergen the Hurtigruten ships sail from the Hurtigruten Terminal, Nøstegaten 30, N-5010 Bergen. Taxi drivers will understand if you ask to be taken to the Hurtigruten Terminal and it is sign-posted as such locally. Luggage lockers are available in the terminal at a charge of NOK 30 (3 x 10 kroner coins are required.) The terminal is staffed and open for luggage check-in from 13:00 hrs. Passenger check-in begins at 15:00 hrs and embarkation takes place from 16:00 hrs. Cabins are available from 18:00 hrs.

There are no restaurant facilities in the terminal and

passengers are free to explore Bergen until embarkation time. A buffet dinner is served in the evening of departure from Bergen, usually between 18:00-21:00 with open seating this evening only. Round Voyage guests will find their table assignment for the rest of the voyage in the envelope they receive at check-in. When disembarking in Bergen, luggage will be delivered to the baggage belt in the terminal. On the last day of the round voyage you will be asked to vacate your cabin a few hours before arrival. Information regarding luggage handling and disembarkation at other ports is available on board.

Gratuities policy

It is not common practice to tip on Hurtigruten ships on the coastal voyage, but if you feel that crew members should be rewarded for providing exceptional service, tip boxes are placed in the restaurant together with envelopes.

Information

There will be an information and safety meeting on board on the evening of departure from Bergen and Kirkenes. Each ship has a Tour Leader on board who sells and advises on excursions, issues a daily programme and news bulletin, and makes announcements regarding

places of interest, disembarkation, etc. Occasionally this service may be carried out by the reception. All Tour Leaders speak Norwegian, English and German.

Internet

There is an internet café on board all ships except MS Lofoten. There is wireless networks in most public areas to connect laptops, mobile phones etc. Be aware that the bandwidth is narrow and reception intermittent.

Languages

Norwegian and English are the official on board languages. The personnel at the reception and some of the service crew often also speak German. The Tour Leader speaks Norwegian, English and German.

Laundry

Laundry rooms with washing machines, dryers and irons are available on most ships. Tokens can be purchased at reception.

Meals

The usual meal times are: breakfast from 07:30 to 10:00 hours (open sitting); lunch from 12:00/13:00 hours (open sitting); dinner from 18:30/19:00 hours (assigned seating). On the evening at departure day from Bergen a buffet dinner with open seating is served and the information about the table assignment for the rest of the voyage can be found in the information envelope handed over at check-in. During busy periods, there may be two sittings, the times of which will be shown on board. Full board begins with a buffet dinner on departure from Bergen and ends with brunch on the arrival day back in Bergen. The food is Norwegian and breakfast is buffet style with a selection of cold meats, cheese, eggs, cereals and fruit. Lunch is the famous cold table with a choice of fish dishes, cold meats, salads, a selection of hot dishes, desserts and fruit. Dinner is a three-course set meal, please note there is not usually a choice of menu. Occasionally a cold table may be served in the evening and the set meal at lunch time. All vessels are fully licensed; the prices on board are the same as in mainland Norway. Wine and/or water packages may be purchased on board for the restaurant where only bottled mineral water is served. In the café and bar glasses of water are complimentary.

Medical assistance

There is no doctor or pharmacy on board. However, officers are trained in first aid and can provide emergency medical assistance. The ships are also close to land.

Payment options

Norwegian currency is used on board. Most major currencies may be exchanged. Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Diners Card are all accepted. A cruise card can be obtained and used for payment for extras and settled at the end of your voyage. This may be subject to change.

Porterage

Luggage handling is not included in the cost of your holiday. Apart from Bergen you need to carry your own luggage on and off the ship.

Safety

It is a safety requirement that all Hurtigruten passengers attend a compulsory safety briefing in Bergen before the ship leaves port. After check in and before embarkation please go to the first floor of the terminal building where the safety briefing will be given at intervals by Hurtigruten staff. This will last between 10 – 15 minutes with the first taking place at 15:45 (embarkation is from 16:00, also from the first floor). The talk will include a demonstration of how to put on a life jacket and the instructions to be followed in the unlikely event of an evacuation or other emergency during the voyage. The briefing is compulsory for all passengers including those who have travelled with Hurtigruten on previous occasions. There will be an opportunity to ask questions if you have any concerns. When you have completed the safety briefing please embark straight away. The last briefing will take place at 19:30. Guests who arrive after this time will be required to attend a safety meeting on board at 20:00 before the ship leaves Bergen. Please familiarise yourself with the emergency procedures as shown in the cabins

(there is a diagram on the cabin door and in public areas), and ask at reception if in doubt. In many ports there may be a good deal of activity on the quay with cars joining/ leaving the ships and/or goods being loaded or unloaded. Please be alert to such traffic when embarking and disembarking. Take care during winter months when it is icy underfoot, particularly on the outside decks and when disembarking the ship or alighting from coaches. Ice spikes and other winter clothing can be purchased in the ships store. Do not carry large amounts of cash and keep valuable items, including mobile telephones and cameras, out of sight.

Shops

There is a shop on board all ships. They sell souvenirs, knitwear, books, postcards, postage stamps and a limited supply of toiletries. On MS Lofoten this service is handled by the cafeteria.

Shore excursions

Pre-booking excursions, where possible, is recommended as only remaining places will be sold on board. Excursions booked on board will be payable in Norwegian Kroner and the price may vary as a result of exchange rate fluctuations. Pre-booking of shore excursions is possible until 4 weeks prior to departure. If you choose to pay by credit card, pre-bookings can be made until 2 weeks prior to departure. Please bring your driving license if you have pre booked or are planning to go on any of the snowmobile or ATV excursions. Excursions and their contents are subject to maximum/minimum numbers, sailing times and weather and/or local conditions. Language is mostly English and Norwegian, no guarantee for other languages. If booked excursions have to be cancelled you will receive a refund on board in NOK.

Smoking

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas on the outside decks. It is not permitted when the ships are in port and fuelling. The staff will advise when its not allowed to smoke outside. Smoking in the cabin is prohibited and subject to a fine.

Stabilisers

With the exception of MS Lofoten, all of our vessels are equipped with stabilisers. On the Norwegian coast the ships enter the open sea, for a few hours, on only a few occasions during the whole voyage. The majority of the time the ships sail between mainland Norway

and the coastal islands where the sea is generally calmer.

Suite service

We are pleased to introduce a range of extras if you book a suite on board one of our ships. They include a welcome present, tea/coffee making facilities in your cabin, complimentary free tea/coffee on board throughout your voyage and late check-out. For a fee you also have the option to have breakfast served in your cabin and the use of a minibar. If there is capacity available you may book and pay for an upgrade to a suite when on board.

Telephone/mobile phones

Private mobile telephones may be used on board although reception may vary. Check with your provider for costs when using your phone abroad.

What to wear

On board dress is informal. Although some passengers choose to change for dinner the dress code is casual rather than formal. The weather in Norway can vary during the course of each voyage or even during the day. To cater for these variations we recommend the layered dress approach that enables you to adapt to changes in temperature, wind and precipitation conditions easily. For all voyages we advise you to take breathable rain and windproof clothing. A warm hat, gloves, scarf and thermal clothing can be useful, together with thermal underwear, during the winter months. On land where it may be icy, sturdy shoes are important for shore excursions and a walking stick/trekking pole may be useful. You should pack a pair of UV protective sunglasses, even during the winter as the reflections of snow and ice can be harmful to the unprotected eye.

Working ships

Hurtigruten ships are working vessels operating a regular service to a set timetable. Our ships carry goods, vehicles and passengers between ports, by night and day, as an integral part of Norwegian daily life. Our ships are calling at ports around the clock. You may expect some noise and vibration in a few cabins during loading of goods. This varies depending on the location of your cabin and the type of ship. Also, noise affects people differently and what may be a problem for one person may not be a problem for another. Please ask our reservation team for advice on the best cabin location for you.

During the next eleven days we will explore the Saga Island to its full, and visit a variety of islands, towns and settlements.

CLIMATE VOYAGE

This expedition takes us from Iceland towards the Svalbard Archipelago, following the Global Climate Conveyor Belt. Crossing the Barents Sea we may encounter a variety of large-bodied marine mammals. We will also hopefully make a stop at one of the most isolated islands in the world, the exotic and beautiful Jan Mayen.

Reykjavik, the capital of Iceland is the starting point of the Climate Voyage. Our route is the same as the Vikings pioneered more than 800 years ago. Arriving in Ísafjörður you can take a stroll around the town or join one of our many excursions. After sailing across the open ocean, we head to Jan Mayen - one of the most isolated islands in the world. If weather and sea conditions permit, we will visit this exotic outpost.

Our first stop in Spitsbergen is Ny Ålesund, one of the world's northernmost permanently populated communities. Depending on ice conditions we will make a try to cross the 80th parallel. If we are lucky we will spot the walrus, whales and polar bears that use these waters as hunting grounds. Isfjord is the largest fjord system in

Spitsbergen almost slicing the island in half. After a last expedition landing, we will wrap up everything with festivities and Polar barbecue on deck, or on a secluded bay. Then we sail towards Longyearbyen where the Climate Voyage will end.

This voyage is one of a kind. Arriving at North-West Spitsbergen National Park, MS Fram is small enough and uses 'clean' petrol to allow us to visit a multitude of landing sites. Before leaving the ship we will give you a proper introduction on how to explore the land with utmost respect for the vulnerable and exotic wildlife and nature. Kayaking, trips with our Polarcirkel boats, hikes and other activities on land will be offered in the areas near Kongsfjord, Ny Ålesund, the Monaco Glacier and Magdalenefjord. We will also spend some days exploring the Eastern Svalbard Nature Reserves and South

Spitsbergen National Park. Places we visit include Sorgfjord, Alkefjell, Kapp Lee and Storfjord. These two large nature reserves in East Svalbard were established to protect some of the most pristine High Arctic environment on Earth. In Eastern Svalbard the density of polar bears is higher than other areas of Svalbard – now it's just up to you to spot one!

This journey will take you from Spitsbergen through the hidden gems of coastal Norway before ending in Bergen. Discover the fascinating history of explorers and whalers, experience the wildlife of the Arctic and enjoy the iconic coast of Norway. Settlements, national parks and exciting wildlife

After an overnight in Longyearbyen, we visit the Russian settlement of Barentsburg with its industrial architecture and genuine Russian atmosphere. North-West Spitsbergen National Park is scattered with islands, fjords and has a long history of exploration. See a whaling station from the 16th century, including a graveyard for the whalers that died during the first 'oil gold rush'. Mofen is a high latitude islet, above the 80th parallel and is popular with walrus. On our way to the Norwegian mainland, and halfway between Spitsbergen and the North Cape we visit the isolated Bjørnøya.

The diversity of the Norwegian coast

Upon reaching Norway we call at Tromsø, the Gateway to the Arctic. This lively, colourful town is rich in Arctic history and surrounded by beautiful mountain views, blue fjords and hundreds of islands. Our stay in Lofoten starts with a visit to the magnificent Trollfjord before we visit Å, one of Norway's most authentic traditional fishing villages. We will also call at several of the small islands along the Helgeland coast before our journey ends in Bergen.

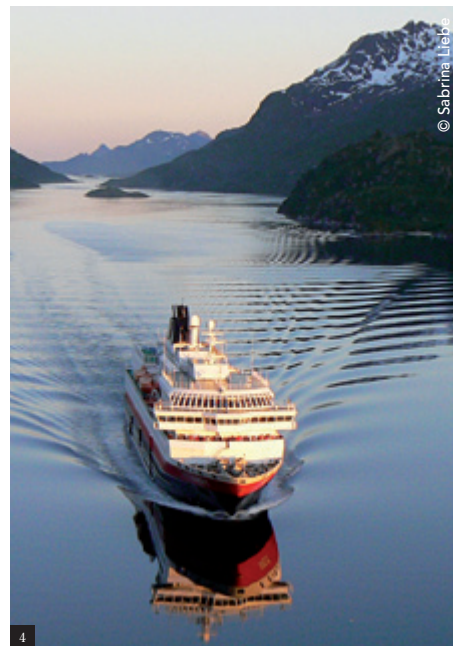

LANDINGS

Antarctica is home to millions of penguins and thousands of seals, and is a rich feeding area for large number of whales. There is no hunting here, and the animals are not afraid of humans. We sail in the wake of the great explorers, take only photos and leave only footprints. These are some of the possible landing sites in Antarctica, depending on your voyage.

Deception Island, South Shetland Islands

Deception Island is a distinctive ring-shaped volcanic caldera, with a navigable opening into the flooded interior. We go ashore in the natural harbour within that includes Whalers Bay, home to an abandoned whaling station as well as a derelict British base.

Half Moon Island, South Shetland Islands

Enjoy a stay on this staggeringly photogenic island. It is blessed with some of the most spectacular Antarctic scenery imaginable. Half Moon Island is a glittering gem amongst these island treasures. We will explore the serrated and creviced cliffs that are home to a large colony of chinstrap penguins, as well as Antarctic terns, kelp gulls, snowy sheathbills, Wilson's storm petrels and several species of seals that regularly visit the island.

Yankee Harbour, South Shetland Islands

Early sealers used Yankee Harbour on Greenwich Island as a frequent base of operations. It provided a natural safe haven, and remnants of those early days can still be

seen littering the shoreline. One of the main sights here is the large colony of Gentoo penguins, estimated to be 4,000 breeding pairs.

Cuerville Island

Situated in the scenic Errera Channel, Cuerville Island boasts the largest known colony of Gentoo penguins in the Antarctic Peninsula. We will sail through the narrow Errera Channel, to and from Cuerville, and see the icebergs that have become trapped and grounded in the nearby shallows.

Neko Harbour

The Gentoo penguin colony lies nestled in Andvord Bay, surrounded by the mountains and high glacier walls of the peninsula. Neko is one of the rare places in this area where we actually land on the Antarctic mainland.

Paradise Harbour

Paradise Harbour offers another rare opportunity for a mainland landing and some of the finest vistas the Peninsula has to offer, as well as a research base and penguin colonies.

Lemaire Channel

This 11km long and 1.6km wide channel is one of the most beautiful passages in Antarctica. Sailing through offers spectacular views and amazing photo opportunities.

Petermann Island

Located in the picturesque Penola Strait, this a great spot for iceberg- and whale spotting, with views across the channel to the Antarctic Peninsula.

Port Lockroy

The British base of Port Lockroy on Goudier Island has become one of the most popular sites in Antarctica, and our visit here offers a unique peek into life in an Antarctic base in the 1950s.

Wilhelmina Bay

Enjoy the sights of mountains and high glaciers around Wilhelmina Bay. We will go ashore and see dramatic scenery and sculpted ice from tiny floating pieces to large bergs. The bay is a choice feeding ground for whales and seals and therefore was a rich hunting ground for whalers of the past.

Antarctic Sound

The huge ice shelves of the Antarctic continent give birth to mile-long tabular icebergs. The strong currents of the Weddell Sea bring these massive flat-topped bergs north into the Antarctic Sound at the northeast of the Antarctic Peninsula, and we will hopefully enjoy this breathtaking sight as we sail through.

Brown Bluff

Brown Bluff lies on the coast at the tip of the Antarctic Peninsula. The 745m high, rust-coloured bluff is volcanic and the beach is peppered with lava 'bombs'. The wildlife we will see up close here includes Adélie penguins, Gentoo penguins and kelp gulls. Cape petrels can be found breeding here and Weddell seals are also regular visitors.

We travel in close contact with the elements on this voyage. The sight of mighty glaciers calving into the sea, flocks of thousands of excited penguins, humpback whales and killer whales in the icy ocean will be a part of your experience.

You can also participate in exciting outdoor activities such as hiking and kayaking – or maybe spend a night ashore in a tent! This adventure starts in Buenos Aires, and before departure you should discover the ‘Paris of South America’ for yourself. As the voyage gets underway in earnest there will be a number of presentations about the history and wildlife of the areas we will be visiting.

The remote Falkland Islands’ unique ecosystem offers about 70 different sub-Antarctic animal and bird species. The capital Port Stanley is one of the places where it’s possible to go hiking or kayaking or spend the night outdoor in a tent with your fellow polar adventurers. In South Georgia we will explore old whaling stations, visit Sir Ernest Shackleton’s grave and see a King penguin colony at Fortuna Bay before we sail south.

Antarctica is an unending, white wilderness full of fantastic impressions, and we will spend two full days here discovering and exploring! We sail in the wake of historical explorers and see Antarctica as they saw it; an endless white wilderness, with nature at its most sublime and haunting. Three days later our voyage ends in the Argentinean town Ushuaia, counted as the southernmost town in the world. Your journey home continues with our flight to Buenos Aires.

Guests are respectfully reminded that only beverages purchased from the ships restaurants and bars can be consumed on board. Alcoholic beverages purchased in ports-of-call and from our on-board shops will be stored by the ship and delivered to your cabin on the last day of the sailing. According to Norwegian law, persons over the age of 18 are allowed to purchase beer and wine. Spirits are only available to persons over the age of 20 years.

Changes to the itinerary and the excursions

All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change – weather, sea and ice conditions may affect the itinerary. Excursions may also be subject to minimum/maximum numbers. Hurtigruten ASA reserves the right to change the itinerary and the content of excursions without prior notice.

Charter flight to Ushuaia

The flight from Buenos Aires to Ushuaia and vice versa is part of your voyage and usually operates early in the morning and arrives to Buenos Aires in the afternoon upon return. Please note that the airline will confirm the final flight times between Buenos Aires and Ushuaia only a few days prior to the day of departure. For final flight times and your boarding pass please contact our hospitality desk at Emperador Hotel in Buenos Aires one day prior. If you do not plan an overnight stay at the end of your voyage, please do not book your international flight from Buenos Aires in any case before 20:00! Please note that the flight to/from Ushuaia departs/arrives at the Jorge Newberry National Airport. You

need at least 3 hours to change airports in Buenos Aires for your connecting flight from Ezeiza airport. We are unable to accept responsibility if you miss your return flight in the event of any delay

Children

Hurtigruten ASA cannot accept children under the age of 5 to travel with us to Antarctica. There is no age restriction on our other destinations. For safety reasons, children under 12 years of age will be considered on each landing. It is entirely at the Captain's discretion to allow children on shore landings.

Disabled cabins / Mobility

The ship is suitable for wheel-chairs. Persons in need of special assistance must travel with a companion. Please note that the ship's gangway must be used in order to embark/disembark wheelchairs. In ports where tidal conditions or other circumstances require use of a portable gangway, or during landings with Polarcirkel Boats, there is no possibility to use/take wheelchairs. Embarkation and disembarkation in Kangerlussuaq/Greenland is by Polarcirkel boat and therefore we regret that any voyages starting and ending in Kangerlussuaq are not suitable for wheelchair users.

Our Captains take pride in route planning that minimises the load of the engines and reduces emissions. All waste is stored on board until it is deposited for treatment ashore. We never dump waste in the sea and we ask you not to leave any waste when you are on shore excursions. In populated areas there are containers for depositing waste,

please use them. We ask you to respect the saying: “Leave nothing but footprints, take nothing but pictures.”

Expedition Team

The on board Expedition Team is composed of an Expedition Leader, an Assistant Expedition Leader and several lecturers and experts. Your Expedition Leader will regularly update you on the progress of the trip as well as the different points of interest and wildlife sightings that may occur. Biographies of the Expedition Team can be found on the Information bulletin board located close to their Information desk. At the Expedition desk you will be able to find information regarding the trip and book optional excursions.

Life saving equipment, life vests and safety on board

The ship complies with all safety requirements and is a modern vessel suitable for sailing in icy waters. Upon arrival on board all passengers will be instructed in safety procedures, and the use and location of the safety equipment. There is a safety plan situated on the inside of the cabin door. We stress the importance of becoming acquainted with the ship's safety plan. Special safety regulations will apply on landings with the Polarcirkel boats. Please follow the instructions given by the Expedition Leader and crew/staff. Special lifejackets for use during landings will be handed out to all passengers before first landing. A mandatory briefing regarding the safety guidelines will also be given.

Medical Declaration Form

In accordance with Hurtigruten ASA requirements, all travellers to Antarctica and North East Greenland must complete a confidential medical declaration form, signed by a doctor, stating that they are fit to travel. This form will be sent to you well in advance. The form must be filled out, brought on board the ship and personally delivered to the doctor upon embarkation. Boarding may be denied if these forms are not presented at time of embarkation.

Medical emergencies and medication

There is an English-speaking physician and nurse on board at all times. The ship has a small medical facility with the necessary equipment and drugs to handle small emergencies. In the event of a serious emergency, the nearest hospital will be contacted. Medical consultations as well as medicines will be charged to the passenger affected. We strongly recommend to carry sufficient travel/health insurance. If you depend on medication, remember to bring sufficient supplies to last through any unforeseen delays. We also recommend that you keep your medication in your hand luggage properly labelled and with clear instructions for its use. If you depend on vital drugs, please inform the ship's doctor upon arrival. Illness on board can lead to quarantine and orders from the ship's physician and captain, must be followed.

Mobile phone

Depending on the operator with whom you have a contract, mobile phones will function in some places on shore. Check with your carrier company for details. Guests may use their own GSM telephones on board the ship at all times as long as we have connection at an international price level. The price will vary depending on which mobile operator you use. Please check with your carrier company for rates and if your subscription is valid on the MCP Satellite System on board.

Passport and VISA requirements

Please take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with the required travel documents you will be asked to provide prior to boarding the ship. It is the sole responsibility of the guest to identify and obtain all required travel documents and have them available when necessary. Passport is the only valid identification for all of our voyages aboard MS Fram. ID-cards are not accepted. The passport needs to be valid for more than six months after you return to your home country. At check-in passports will be collected by the crew on board the vessel, in order to clear immigrations and customs. Passports will be kept throughout the whole voyage and returned at the end of the trip. Please bring a photocopy of the passport with you. It is the guests' responsibility to identify and to obtain the necessary visas before commencing their cruise. Based on nationality, many countries still require an entry visa.

We regret we are unable to accept any liability if you are denied access to a flight or entry into a country or are otherwise affected by difficulties or costs resulting from your passport not being approved or if you have not obtained the required visa or other documentation.

Polarcirkel boat landings

These sturdy boats enable both water-based exploration and safe landings in otherwise inaccessible areas. You will need to be fairly agile to board these but there is otherwise no need to worry about travelling in them. The crew will show you what to do and as long as you follow their instructions, after a few days it will become second nature. On all landings in Polarcirkel boats guests are expected to wear proper footwear. In Antarctica it is mandatory to use rubber boots for all landings. For all other destinations boots can be useful. You are welcome to bring private boots, or you can rent a pair on board. See separate point 'Rubber boots'. Landing operations depend on favourable conditions.

Ship's security

MS Fram complies with the ISPS-regulations (International Ship and Port Security System) where all luggages are subject to X-ray/metal detector inspection upon arrival port facility or ship. You are kindly asked to keep this in mind packing your luggage for the voyage. The ISPS regulations also include hand baggage scan in all ports of call throughout the course of the voyage.

Special requests

If you have special requests such as vegetarian, diabetic or gluten free please inform us at time of booking and contact the Head Waiter when on board. We will do our best to meet such requests but can not guarantee to do so and under no circumstance will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of a contractual agreement.

Vaccinations

Check with your General Practitioner regarding the recommended vaccinations for your journey.

What to wear

On board dress is informal. Although some passengers choose to change for dinner the dress code is casual rather than formal. The weather can vary during the course of each voyage or even during the day. To cater for these variations we recommend the layered dress approach that enables you to adapt to changes in temperature, wind and precipitation conditions easily. For all voyages we advise you to take breathable rain and windproof clothing. A warm hat, gloves, scarf and thermal clothing can be useful, together with thermal underwear, during the winter months. On land where it may be icy, sturdy shoes are important for shore excursions and a walking stick/trekking pole may be useful.

FLIGHTS

Please see the price pages for available flight packages. We can also offer regional supplements and upgrades, please contact us for details and prices.

The airfares offered are special package tour fares which cannot be altered or cancelled without charge. All flight package prices are based on specific booking classes, if the relevant booking class is not available a supplement may apply. Our reservations team will advise you of this.

Most flights within Europe do not offer a complimentary meal/drinks service, please check with your airline. On intercontinental flights this is usually included. We can offer upgrades to business class on some routes, this will usually include a higher luggage allowance and access to the lounge at the airport. Depending on the airline this may also include seats with more legroom. Please note that upgrading may not apply to all sectors if your flight is via another airport. Our reservation team will be able to advise you of availability, prices and other details.

Luggage allowance varies between airlines and a charge may apply if you exceed this or carriage may be refused, please check with your airline. If you are planning to take a wheelchair or need assistance at the airport please advise us at the time of booking so we can inform the relevant airline.

Any flight times advised at the time of booking are provisional and subject to change, please check before you travel.

ON BOARD INFORMATION

MS Fram was specially built for comfortably sailing the remote waters of the Arctic and Antarctic, and you may enjoy her many services whilst she takes you close to nature and wildlife. No dressing up for dinner – no fuss, no frenzy – our aim is to sail calmly through the crisp clean air, close to the ever-changing environment.

Announcements

To hear all announcements in the cabin, the TV has to be set to a channel number. Check your cabin folder for specific channel number once on board. Important updates to our programme and emergency information will be announced to the cabins via separate speakers overriding all other audio in the cabin.

Artworks

Local artists from the Arctic have contributed to making the MS Fram a modern masterpiece. There is a permanent exhibition of original artefacts from the original Fram used by Nansen and Amundsen.

Bar service

The ship has a bar with an excellent selection of spirits, wines, beers and soft drinks at moderate prices, and a lounge with coffee service.

Cabins

There is a wide range of comfortable cabins on board, all with private bathrooms. Please note that check in hours in reception may open before the cabin is ready for use. You will be informed at check-in when your cabin is ready for you. You may expect some noise and vibration in some cabins. This varies depending on the location of your cabin. Also, noise affects people differently and what may be a problem for one person may not be a problem for others. Please note that cabins on deck 5 with passenger access to outside areas may sometimes have an obstructed view due to other passengers walking past. Please ask our reservation team for advice on the best cabin location for you.

Cruise card

A cruise card will be issued upon arrival on board as part of the check in procedure in accordance with ISPS regulations. All our guests are requested to wear this card when disembarking the ship in all ports of call and landings. The card serves as a control system on the gangway enabling the ship to know which of our guests are on board and ashore at any time. This card, in addition to being the key card for your cabin, is also your payment card on board. The card is the only means of payment for the on board facilities. To activate the cruise card account you must have a Visa, American Express, Diners or

Mastercard. The credit card must be valid more than 3 months after your stay on board. We regret that our system does not support Maestro Card. Please note that when using your credit card on board the ship, your account will be debited in NOK. The rate of exchange will be the one validated by your credit card company. The evening before the voyage ends the account will be totalled and settled on board, and a receipt brought to your cabin. We regret that there is no facility for cash withdrawals or currency exchange on board.

Electricity

The plugs in your cabins are all 220V/50hz. Suites have 110V for shavers. The plugs are continental two pin plugs. Adapters are available for purchase in the shop.

Entertainment

The emphasis on board is on relaxation and discovery, and not on the commercial entertainment which is so often a part of conventional cruises. Our aim is to get you closer to unique environments and to allow you to share the experience with your fellow travellers. Occasionally there may be some musical entertainment on board in the evenings.

Fitness room, sauna and jacuzzi

On deck 7 you can find our modern fitness room and comfortable sauna with a fantastic view on the landscape passing by. Two outdoor Jacuzzis invite you for a warm bath.

Gratuity Policy

We in Hurtigruten ASA have learned that many of our guests wish to give a special thanks to our service crew on board. It is at your discretion to honour service rendered by the crew in bars, restaurant and cabins. In order to give you some guidelines, we recommend 80 NOK (approx 9 Euro, 12 USD) per guest per day as an average gratuity. Whatever amount you decide to give, please fill in the form you will find in your cabin and give it to the receptionist two nights before the end of the cruise. The amount will then be debited to your cruise account.

Information and services

On deck 4, you will find our reception and expedition desk, where our staff are available to answer your questions. In this area, you will also find our internet café, our lobby with wireless access and our lecture rooms.

Language

The language on board is English. Announcements, lectures and written information are also given in German.

Laundry

A laundry service is available on board at low cost. No self-service or dry-cleaning is possible.

Lectures

The ship's experienced lecturers' command an in-depth knowledge of the areas in which we sail. They will conduct, on a regular basis, lectures on topics such as biology, history and geology throughout the course of the trip. The lecturing schedule will be announced everyday in the on board daily program. Do not hesitate to contact our Expedition Team for any questions or concerns you might have.

Library

The ship has a small selection of books on different topics that is available to guests while on board.

Observation Lounge

Qilak means 'sky' in Greenlandic, and the name of this lounge sets the standard. Here you find large panoramic windows, ample comfortable seats and even a pair of binoculars so you can view the wildlife and details of the ever changing landscape.

Outdoor decks

MS Fram has spacious outdoor areas. Enjoy the views from the very front of the ship where there is a large viewing area or from the back on deck 7. Both are perfect vantage points to sit back, relax and watch the world go by.

Post

You can hand in your mail in the reception,

and for a limited amount covering service fee and stamps we will forward the post in every port where it is possible. The time used from sending the postcard to when it gets to the receiver may be relatively long. Hurtigruten has no responsibility for lost mail.

Resident Photographer

Our resident photographer will invite you to photography workshops and practical sessions out on deck to enable you to take the best possible pictures from your voyage.

Restaurant & cuisine

Your voyage includes breakfast, lunch and dinner. Our restaurant is named Imaq – the Greenlandic word for 'ocean', offering scenic views from every table. At the far end of the restaurant is a balcony, an ideal place from which to take photos. The open seating for the breakfast and lunch buffet creates a relaxed atmosphere. Dinner varies between buffets, set meals and barbeques. The type of dinner is announced in the daily programme. Our Head Waiter will assign tables prior to arrival. Information about table number and meal times will be in your cabin upon arrival. Please provide information regarding special requests for seating arrangements to your sales office/travel agent. At some voyages we might serve the dinner divided into Boat groups. Where possible, we plan our menus around seasonal ingredients, taking advantage of local produce to satisfy healthy appetites stimulated by the fresh sea air. Regular coffee/tea is complimentary throughout the whole voyage. Other beverages and refreshments during the day are not included but can be purchased on board in the restaurant, cafeteria and bar.

Room service

The cabins are cleaned daily. We regret that meals or drinks cannot be served in the cabins.

Rubber boot rentals

Onboard you may rent a pair of high quality boots for a low cost to wear during landings and hikes. These boots will be kept on the ship's tender deck, and you will have your private pair during the whole voyage. We also offer high quality binoculars, walking sticks and a small selection of warm thermo suits for rent at a low cost.

Seasickness

Seasickness pills are available for purchase in the reception. If you are prone to seasickness it is recommended that you bring pills that you are familiar with. You may also buy 'sea bands' on board.

Shop

In our on board shop you can buy modern clothes suitable for Explorer voyages. Our Expedition Team will be happy to give you expert advice on how to dress properly in polar areas. We offer a great range of both warm and practical clothing, and we focus fabrics with natural fibres. We also offer souvenirs, handicrafts, and postcards at good prices. In addition we also stock a small

selection of soap, toothpaste and other personal effects.

Shore excursions

A selection of shore excursions is available to pre-book. Where available we will supply you with excursion information in advance, otherwise you will receive full details and prices on board. Excursions and their contents are subject to maximum/minimum numbers and local and weather conditions.

Smoking

On board MS Fram, smoking is only permitted in designated areas on outside decks. Do not smoke in your cabin. To show respect for the environment, please use the provided ashtrays when smoking. Throwing cigarette butts overboard is strictly prohibited. A cleaning charge of 1,500 NOK will be applied for smoking in your non-smoking cabin, to cover for the cost of cleaning linen and curtains to return it to a non-smoking standard.

Suite service

As a suite guest on MS Fram, we offer you an exclusive suite check-in area at deck 5 with a chilled glass of champagne to begin your voyage. Special amenities come with our magnificent suites including a welcome on board gift, complimentary beverages for lunch and dinner inclusive of chilled filtered water by the carafe, sodas, soft drinks, beer and a selection of wine by the glass. We also offer an exclusive breakfast area with speciality buffet products. If local products are available, we will do our best to provide them to you. In the suite you will find a kettle for your convenience with coffee, teas, sweeteners and cream, and the mini bar has a complimentary selection upon your arrival. Replenishment of the mini bar is chargeable.

Water

The tap water in your cabin is potable, but we recommend buying bottled water or our self-produced filtered water by the carafe in the restaurant for the quality and freshness.

Walking on board

We kindly remind you to be careful walking on board the ship while at sea, especially venturing out on deck, mind the signs for warning of wet and slippery decks. Be aware the doors toward the outer decks on 5, 7 and 8 are potentially dangerous in windy conditions. Please adhere to the signs and announcements when it is not advised to go outside. While walking inside, hold on to railings but not to door frames to avoid injury.

Welcome meeting

Upon arrival on board, there will be a mandatory passenger safety drill before departure. There will also be a welcome meeting where security information as well as practical information about the cruise will be given, and an opportunity to meet some of the crew and be introduced to the key personnel on board.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. YOUR CONTRACT

Your contract is with Hurtigruten Ltd., a company wholly owned by Hurtigruten ASA, on the basis of these conditions and the information contained in the brochure, and shall be governed by English law and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. You may however choose the law and jurisdiction of Scotland or Northern Ireland if you wish to do so. When you book an air package holiday or sailing with us the contract between us will exist as soon as you or your travel agent asks us to confirm your booking. We then become responsible to provide you with the voyage arrangements or air package holiday you have booked and you become responsible to pay for them, in each case subject to these terms and conditions. You will also become responsible to pay for any additional arrangements made by us on your behalf including International Flights not included in any air package, optional excursions, travel insurance or other arrangements requested by you and booked.

When you make a booking you guarantee you have the authority to accept and do accept on behalf of your party the terms of these booking conditions and accept responsibility for making all payments to us for all members of the party. We are unable to accept provisional or conditional bookings. We will send all documents and other information to you and you will be responsible for ensuring that all other members of the party are kept fully informed.

A confirmation invoice which you should check as soon as you receive it will be sent on receipt of your deposit. If you wish to change or cancel any arrangements later you may have to pay an amendment or cancellation charge and additional costs (see below) which may be as much as the whole of the original price of your arrangements. Only one invoice and one set of documents will be issued. No verbal amendments may be made by either party to these written booking conditions; any change must be in writing signed by the Chief Executive of Hurtigruten ASA.

If you confirmed arrangements include a flight, we (or if you booked via an authorised agent of ours, that agent) will issue you with an ATOL Certificate and a confirmation. Upon receipt, if you believe that any details on the ATOL Certificate or confirmation or any other document are wrong you must advise us immediately.

If you book your holiday through a travel agent all communication must be through that agent. Please quote your booking reference number in all communications.

You are responsible for complying with any visa or other entry requirements for you or any of your party who are not full European Union Passport Holders.

2. YOUR FINANCIAL PROTECTION

We hold an Air Travel Organiser's Licence granted by the Civil Aviation Authority under number 3584. When you buy an ATOL protected flight or flight inclusive holiday from us you will receive an ATOL Certificate. This lists the flight, accommodation, car hire and/or other services that are financially protected, where you can get information on what this means for you and who to contact if things go wrong. In the unlikely event of our insolvency the CAA will ensure that you are not stranded abroad if you have booked a package holiday from this brochure and will arrange to refund any money you have paid to us for an advance booking. For further information visit the ATOL website at www.atol.org.uk.

If you book arrangements other than an air and/or packaged holiday from this brochure your monies are protected by our bond held with ABTA. We are also a member of the Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA).

3. PAYMENT

Once you have asked us to confirm your booking the total price of the arrangements you have booked is due and is payable as follows:

(i) If you book more than 70 days before your scheduled departure date a non-refundable deposit of 20%. The balance is due 70 days before your scheduled departure date. No second invoice will be sent. Travel documents will be issued 7 to 14 days prior to departure.

(ii) If you book less than 70 days before your scheduled departure date the full price is payable when you book.

Balance payment may be made by cash, credit card or cheque (providing there is time to clear it to meet the payment schedule shown above – you should allow 5 working days for clearance from the time we receive it).

Credit Card Charges

If you pay by credit card, a fee will be charged to your voyage/package price for deposits and balances paid by credit card. Fees differ by card type. Contact us to obtain applicable surcharge fee for your card type. Your booking may be cancelled if we do not receive payment by the due date (if we do not normally send reminders) and cancellation charges as set out under 'If You Cancel' (see below) will be payable by you.

4. FITNESS TO TRAVEL ON THE SHIP, PREGNANCY, DISABILITY OR REDUCED MOBILITY, MEDICAL/MOBILITY EQUIPMENT

In order to ensure that the Carrier is able to carry passengers safely and in accordance with applicable safety requirements established by international, EU or national law or in order to meet safety requirements established by competent authorities including the ships flag state every Passenger warrants that he/she is fit to travel by sea and that his/her conduct or condition will not impair the safety of the ship or inconvenience the other passengers. We reserve the right to require any Passenger to produce medical evidence of fitness to travel in order to assess whether that Passenger can be carried safely in accordance with applicable international, EU or national law. If we consider it necessary, we are entitled to administer a health questionnaire prior to boarding.

If it appears to us, the Master or the Company's nominated medical representative that a Passenger is for any reason unfit to travel, likely to endanger safety, or likely to be refused permission to land at any port, or likely to render the Carrier liable for Passenger maintenance, support or repatriation, then the Carrier or the Master shall have the right to take any of the following courses: (i) Refuse to embark the Passenger at any port; (ii) Disembark the Passenger at any port; (iii) Transfer the Passenger to another berth or cabin; (iv) If the Company's nominated medical representative considers it advisable, to place or confine him/her or to transfer the Passenger to a health facility at any port, at the Passenger's expense (v) to administer first aid and administer any drug, medicine or other substance or to admit and/or confine the Passenger to a hospital or other similar institution at any port provided that the ship's nominated medical representative and/or Master considers that any such steps are necessary.

Where a Passenger is refused embarkation as a result of safety and/or fitness to travel, neither we nor the carrier shall be liable for any loss or expense occasioned to the passenger thereby, nor shall the passenger be entitled to any compensation from the Carrier.

Passengers who need assistance and/or have special requests or need special facilities or equipment with regard to accommodation, seating

or services required or need to bring medical equipment must notify us at the time of booking. If there are any particular conditions, disabled or reduced mobility which require personal care or supervision then such personal care or supervision must be organised by the passenger and at the passenger's expense. Those passengers confined to wheelchairs must furnish their own standard size foldable wheelchairs but needn't be accompanied by a travelling companion. Unless we and/or the Carrier agree otherwise and in writing Passengers are limited to bringing 2 items of such mobility or medical equipment on board per cabin with a total value not exceeding \$4,000. All equipment must be capable of being carried safely and must be declared before the sailing. The Carrier may decline to carry such equipment where it is not safe to do so or where it has not been notified in time to enable a risk assessment to be carried out.

Pregnant women are highly recommended to seek medical advice prior to travel at any stage of their pregnancy. Women who are up to 23 weeks pregnant at the end of the cruise are required to produce a medical certificate of fitness to travel. The Carrier cannot for safety reasons carry pregnant passengers of 24 weeks or more by the end of the cruise.

4. B SPECIAL REQUESTS

If you have any special requests (e.g. dietary or medical), please inform us or your travel agent at the time of booking. We will do our best to meet such requests but cannot guarantee to do so and in no circumstances will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of our contractual agreement.

5. A PRICES

All voyage/package/tour prices shown in this brochure are in Australian Dollars (AUD) and are per person based on full occupancy of the cabin/room accommodation unless otherwise stated and are current at time of printing (24 May 2014). Prices shown in this brochure are a guide only and applicable prices will be quoted at time of booking.

Single/Sole occupancy of cabins with more than one berth is at our discretion as single/sole use of multiple berth cabins will be limited. Prices in this brochure were calculated using foreign currency exchange rates. Where exchange rate fluctuations occur of more than 2.5%, or any other increase in the price of services provided which are beyond the control of Hurtigruten ASA including any fuel surcharges, local and foreign taxes (including VAT and UK taxes), we reserve the right to adjust the package prices accordingly, at any time up until the delivery of service, irrespective of reservation payment status. Acceptance of this arrangement is a condition of booking. Prices are subject to availability at time of booking, are capacity controlled and may be withdrawn at any time without notice.

Should it be necessary to make any surcharges we will notify you of the relevant adjustments by issuing a new invoice. In any event we will absorb all such increases where they form less than 2.5% of the total cost of your voyage or air and/or package holiday (excluding any cancellation or amendment charges). Only amounts in excess of 2.5% will be invoiced to you, together with an administration charge of \$3.00 per person together with an amount to cover agent's commission. In the event that any surcharge means you paying in excess of 10% more on the original cost of your voyage or air and/or package holiday, you will be entitled to cancel your trip with a full refund of all monies paid (except amendment fees). Should you wish to cancel under these circumstances you must exercise your right to do so within 14 days from the date of the invoice we send you showing the

increase.

Should the price of your voyage or air and/or package holiday go down due to changes above by more than 2.5% of your holiday cost then any refund due will be paid to you. Please note that travel arrangements are not always purchased in local currency and some apparent changes have no impact on the price of your travel due to contractual or other protection in place.

5. B VOYAGE AND AIR PACKAGE HOLIDAY Prices Do Not Include

- Travel Insurance
- Luggage Handling
- International/Domestic Flights except where included in the Air Package Holiday Price
- Optional Excursions
- Beverages except where stated
- Gratuities

Optional Excursions booked before you travel or local excursions or other activities that you may choose to book and pay for whilst on holiday are not part of your voyage or air and/or package holiday arrangements provided by us nor are we agents for the provider of the service. For any excursion or other activity you book before departure or with which you are assisted in arranging whilst on holiday, your contract will solely be with the supplier of the excursion or activity and not with Hurtigruten. We are not responsible for the provision of your excursion or activity or for anything that happens during the course of its provision by the supplier.

6. IF YOU CHANGE YOUR BOOKING

If you wish to change your travel arrangements after they have been confirmed we will do our utmost to help but it may not always be possible. Any request for changes to be made must be in writing by the person who made the booking or your travel agent. You will be asked to pay an administration charge of \$150 per person and any further cost we incur in making this alteration. NB: most airlines will charge a fee for ticket changes. Costs may increase the closer to the departure date that changes are made. For example, the transfer within 70 days of departure of arrangements involving a scheduled flight will mean the cancellation and re-booking of this flight and a significant additional charge.

If you change the number of people in your party, the price of the arrangements will be recalculated for the new party size e.g. this may mean that accommodation is under-occupied and each member of the party may have to pay an increased price.

Any increase in price caused by changes you have requested is not a cancellation charge even though it may arise because a member of your party has cancelled. Any change by you to your confirmed arrangements after departure is in all cases subject to availability and any relevant costs.

7. IF YOU CANCEL

You, or any member of your party, may cancel your travel arrangements at any time. Written notification from the person who made the booking or your travel agent must be received at our offices. We recommend 'Recorded Delivery'. Cancellation takes effect the day we receive your letter or email. Since we incur costs in relation to your arrangements from the time we confirm your booking you will have to pay the applicable cancellation charges as shown in the table below (which also applies if we cancel because you have failed to make payments on time - see 'Payment' section) together with the cost of any air fare for which we have had to pay at the time of the booking and will be payable immediately on cancellation.

8. IF WE CHANGE OR CANCEL YOUR BOOKING

We reserve the right to change any of the details, and correct any errors in this brochure or invoices at any time. If changes are made before you have made your booking we will advise you before we confirm your arrangements. We reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your travel arrangements (for example if a minimum number of participants for a particular travel arrangements not reached, we may have to cancel it) and to change airline, aircraft types, vessels and itineraries without liability for any subsequent loss. Even after we have confirmed your booking we may have to make alterations but we will not cancel your travel arrangements less than 60 days before your departure except for reasons of force majeure or failure by you to pay the final balance in full.

Most alterations will be minor and while we will do our best to notify you or your travel agent of any changes as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before your departure, we will have no other liability to you.

Occasionally we may have to make a significant change to your confirmed arrangements. Significant changes include the following:

- Change of UK departure airport. A change from one London airport to another is not considered a major change. London airports are Heathrow, Gatwick, Stansted, Luton and London City.
- Change of your time of departure or return by more than 12 hours.
- Change of your flight from a day flight to a night flight if this also includes a change to your departure time of 3 hours or more.†
- Change of resort.
- Change of holiday accommodation to accommodation of a lower official rating.

† For the purposes of the contract night flights are those which depart from the UK between 2200 and 0600 hours or arrive in the UK between 2400 and 0600 hours.

If we have to make a significant change we will notify you as soon as possible and you may either:

- (a) accept the change and the contract between us will then be varied to incorporate the change; or
- (b) take alternative arrangements altogether (subject to availability). If the alternative arrangements selected are a lower price than those originally confirmed the difference will (if already paid) be refunded to you.
- (c) withdraw from the booking completely in which case we will as soon as possible, refund all money paid to us.

Passengers must give notice of their decision as soon as reasonably possible and not later than 7 days of being informed of the alteration. If you choose (a) or (b) above, you will receive as compensation a credit towards the cost of your arrangements, or any alternative selected, the amount shown in Scale A below. If you choose (c) we will pay you compensation shown in Scale B below. In all cases we will have no liability for any other or greater compensation or for expenses or losses incurred.

*The compensation shown above applies to full fare paying adults only. Children or others travelling at concessionary rates will receive compensation pro rata based on the concessionary price against the full adult price as shown on the confirmation.

The above rates do not apply when we are forced to make changes which cause you to withdraw or cancel your arrangements, by reason of unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control and which we could not have avoided by the exercise of all due care and our only liability will be to refund, as soon as possible, all money paid to us by you. We are unable to accept liability or pay compensation where the performance or prompt performance of our contractual obligation is prevented or affected by reason of circumstances amounting to 'force majeure' i.e. any event which we or the supplier(s) of the service(s) could not, even with due care foresee or avoid. Such events may include, but are not limited to, war, threat of war or civil commotions, riots, terrorist activity, industrial dispute, natural or nuclear disaster, adverse weather, fire, flood, drought, government action, airport and port regulations and closures, technical transportation problems, maintenance to vessels, scheduling of transport and similar events outside our control.

A flight or ship delay does not constitute a change to holiday arrangements.

9. COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

If there is a problem during your holiday, you must report it on board immediately or to the relevant airline, ground handler, hotelier or other supplier, so that prompt efforts can be made to resolve the problem. In the unlikely event that a problem cannot be resolved at the time and you wish to complain, you must send us full written details within 28 days of your return. Failure to take either or both of these steps will prejudice our ability to resolve your problem and / or investigate it fully. In consequence, any right to compensation you may have will be extinguished or, at the very least, substantially reduced.

Where the port of embarkation for your sailing is in the EU then any complaints relating to EU Regulation 1177/2010 on Passenger Rights when travelling by Sea and Inland waterways must be made to the Company in writing no later than 2 months after return from travel or the date on which the service complained of was performed. The Company will provide a final reply within 2 months. You must supply full details to enable the Company to deal with your complaint.

10. OUR LIABILITY TO YOU

(i) Except where otherwise expressly stated in these booking conditions, we regret we cannot accept liability or pay any compensation where the performance of our contractual obligations is prevented or affected by or you otherwise suffer any damage or loss as a result of 'force majeure'. In these Booking Conditions, 'force majeure' means any event which we or the supplier of the service(s) in question could not, even with all due care, foresee or avoid. Such events may include war or threat of war, riot, civil strife, actual or threatened terrorist activity, industrial dispute, natural or nuclear disaster, adverse weather conditions, fire and all similar events outside our control.

(ii) We will accept responsibility for the arrangements we agree to provide or arrange for you as an 'organiser' under the Package Travel, Package Holidays and Package Tours Regulations 1992 as set out below. Subject to these booking conditions, if we or our suppliers perform or arrange your contracted holiday arrangements negligently, taking into consideration all relevant factors, we will pay you reasonable compensation.

(iii) Where death or personal injury and/or loss of or damage to property occurs during carriage by air or by sea then liability and the extent of damages recoverable will be dealt with by International Conventions as set out in paragraphs (v) and (vi) and not otherwise.

(iv) As set out in these booking conditions we limit the maximum amount we may have to pay you for any claims you may make against us which do not involve personal injury, illness or death. Except where loss of and/or damage to luggage or personal possessions is concerned if we are found liable to you on any basis the maximum amount we will have to pay you is twice the price (excluding insurance premiums and amendment charges) paid by or on behalf of the person(s) affected in total unless a lower limitation applies to your claim under clause 10(vi) below.

(v) Where any claim or part of a claim (including those involving death or personal injury) concerns or is based on any travel arrangements (including the process of getting on and/or off the transport concerned) provided by any air, sea, rail or road carrier or any stay in a hotel, the maximum amount of compensation we will have to pay you will be limited. The most we will have to pay you for that claim or that part of a claim if we are found liable to you on any basis is the most the carrier or hotel keeper concerned would have to pay under the international convention or regulation which applies to the travel arrangements or hotel stay in question. (for example, the Warsaw Convention as amended or unamended and the Montreal Convention for international travel by air and/or for airlines with an operating licence granted by an EU country, the EC Regulation on Air Carrier Liability No 889/2002 for national and international travel by air, the Athens convention for international travel by sea).

Please note: Where a carrier or hotel would not be obliged to make any payment to you under the applicable International Convention or Regulation in respect of a claim or part of a claim, we similarly are not obliged to make a payment to you for that claim or part of the claim. When making any payment, we are entitled to deduct any money which you have received or are entitled to receive from the transport provider or hotelier for the complaint or claim in question. Copies of the applicable International Conventions and Regulations are available from us on request. We do not have any liability to you by virtue of the Regulation 261/2004 which applies solely to the operating carrier. Any liability we may have to you under our contract with you, arising out of the same facts, is limited to the remedies provided under the Regulation as if (for this purpose only) we were a carrier; any sums you receive from the carrier will be deducted from any amount due from ourselves.

(vi) Travel by sea is governed by the provisions of the Convention Relating to the Carriage of Passengers and their Luggage by Sea 1974 as amended in 1976 ("The Athens Convention") and where applicable from 1 January 2013 EU Regulation 392/2009 relating to the Liability of carriers of passengers by sea in the event of accidents ("EU Regulation 392/2009"). For the purposes of the Athens Convention and EU Regulation 392/2009 we are the Contracting Carrier.

The Athens Convention and EU Regulation 392/2009 limit the Carriers' liability for death or personal injury or loss or damage to luggage and makes special provision for valuables. It is presumed that luggage has been delivered to you undamaged

unless written notice is given by us and/or the performing Carrier.

- a) in the case of apparent damage, before or at the time of disembarkation or redelivery; or
- b) in the case of damage which is not apparent or of loss, within 15 days from the date of disembarkation or redelivery or from the time when such redelivery should have taken place.

Damages for cabin luggage payable by the Carrier are limited up to the Athens Convention limit of 833 SDRs or 2250 SDRs if EU Regulation 392/2009 applies.

Limits shall be reduced in proportion to any contributory negligence by the Client and by the maximum deductible specified in Article 8(4) of the Athens Convention or EU Regulation 392/2009.

In so far as we may be liable to a Client in respect of claims arising out of carriage by sea, we shall be entitled to all the rights, defences, immunities and limitations available, respectively, to the actual carrier and under the relevant Conventions and nothing in these Booking Conditions shall be deemed as a surrender thereof. To the extent that any provision in these Booking Conditions is made null and void by the Athens Convention or EU Regulation 392/2009 or any legislation compulsorily applicable or is otherwise unenforceable, it shall be void to that extent but not further.

Any liability in respect of death and personal injury and loss of and damage to luggage which we may incur to you shall always be subject to the limits of liability contained in the Athens Convention or EU Regulation 392/2009 for death/personal injury of 46,666 Special Drawing Rights (SDR) or 300,000 SDR under Athens Convention or 400,000 SDRs under EU Regulation 392/2009 except in the case of liability for war or terrorism 250,000 SDRs.

We are not liable for valuables, monies or other securities including jewellery and watches. If they have been deposited with the reception desk on the ship for safe keeping and a receipt issued then in those limited circumstances the Carriers liability will be as set out in the Athens Convention or EU Regulation 392/2009. The use of safes on board a Vessel is not a deposit with the ship or with the company under the Athens Convention or EU Regulation 392/2009 or otherwise. The limits are 1200 SDRs pursuant to Athens or 3,375 SDRs pursuant to EU Regulation 392/2009.

(vii) Where there is any loss of or damage to property including luggage which is not covered by any international convention and where liability is not limited by reference to any enactment, terms of conditions, then any legal liability that we may have for any such losses or damage will not exceed £500 per guest.

(viii) You must provide ourselves and our insurers with all assistance we may reasonably require. You must also tell us and the supplier concerned about your claim or complaint as set out in clause 9 above. If asked to do so, you must transfer to us or our insurers any rights you have against the supplier or whoever else is responsible for your claim or complaint (if the person concerned is under 18, their parent or guardian must do so). You must also agree to cooperate fully with us and our insurers if we or our insurers want to enforce any rights which are transferred.

11. INDEMNITY

When you book arrangements with us you accept responsibility for the proper conduct of yourself and your party. If your actions or omissions cause damage to any property in the provision of the contracted arrangements, or cause delay or diversion to any flight or other means of transportation, you agree to fully indemnify us against any claim (including professional fees and legal costs) made against us by or on behalf of the owner of such property or the operator of the flight or other means of transportation. The Captain of an aircraft or Master of a ship has authority over the aircraft/ship and passengers at all times when they are boarding or on board. There will be no liability on our part, or that of any supplier, for any refund, compensation, or costs thus incurred. Additionally, we will have the right to recover full costs resulting from the incident from the passenger.

At any port or place we may refuse to embark or may disembark any passenger who, in the opinion of the ship's authorized personnel, might be excluded from landing at further destinations by local authorities or who may be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or whose presence may be detrimental to the wellbeing of passengers or crew. In cases of quarantine of the ship, or individual passengers (passengers may be required to remain in their cabin or as instructed by authorised personnel on board if they or any other occupant of the accommodation presents any symptoms or may be considered to put other passengers at risk) we will not be liable for expenses thus caused and in such cases as above there will be no entitlement to any refund or compensation and we will have no liability for costs incurred as a result.

Your specific passport and visa and health requirements and other immigration requirements are your responsibility and you should confirm these with the relevant Embassies and/or Consulates. We do not accept responsibility if you cannot travel because you have not complied with the latest requirements. If you have made independent travel arrangements you accept responsibility for joining the ship in good time, regardless of any change to the sailing time or date, or to the itinerary. We are not able to refund monies paid to us, or any third party acting on our or your behalf, or make compensation or other payments where, for whatever reason, you fail to join the ship. Passengers going ashore are responsible for re-boarding the ship prior to departure from port.

We reserve the right to substitute another vessel for the scheduled vessel whether or not owned or operated by Hurtigruten. Any part of the travel arrangements and the voyage is subject to cancellation, delay, modification, or island/mainland visit cancellation for any reason, including medical disembarkation of crew or passengers or any other circumstances beyond our or our suppliers' control. You therefore acknowledge and agree that the scheduled itinerary for the voyage and the announced departure and arrival times are not guaranteed and we shall not be liable to passengers for any damages or other claims in the event of any delay, changes in itinerary or inability to perform services by reason of any event or events beyond our or our suppliers' control.

12. TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is a condition of the contract with us that every member of the booking has travel insurance in force for the entire duration of the booking, covering at least the cancellation of the booking and providing medical cover for illness or injury and repatriation while overseas. Please provide us with the name of your insurer, together with their 24-hour emergency number when you book or as soon as possible.

13. TIMINGS & DELAYS

Timings are estimates only and cannot be guaranteed, even if shown on tickets. They may be changed due to regulatory authority requirements, weather conditions, maintenance or technical reasons, and the ability of passengers to check in and board on time. Sometimes delays cannot be avoided but in such situations, in conjunction with our local agents or representatives, we will try to ensure your comfort during the course of any delay.

Where the port of embarkation is in the EU and the company reasonably expects the departure of a cruise to be delayed for more than 90 minutes beyond its scheduled departure time, passengers departing from port terminal shall be offered free of charge snacks, meals or refreshments as are appropriate given the waiting time, provided they are available and can reasonably be supplied. If the delay in departure necessitates a stay of one or more nights or a stay additional to that intended by the passenger where and when physically possible the Company shall, subject to the Package Travel Regulations 1992, offer passengers departing from port terminals free of charge adequate accommodation on board or ashore, and transport to and from the port terminal and place of accommodation in addition to the snacks, meals and refreshments previously referred to. The maximum amount that the company will pay for accommodation ashore and transport to and from the port terminal shall be equivalent to 80 Euros per person per night for a maximum of three nights. The company will not have an obligation to provide such accommodation ashore where the delay is caused by weather conditions endangering the safe operation of the ship.

14. BROCHURE VALIDITY

This brochure was published in May 2014 and the details and prices contained in it are valid to December 2015 but may be superseded by subsequent brochures.

15. DATA PROTECTION

In order to process your booking and ensure your travel arrangements run smoothly and meet your requirements we, Hurtigruten Ltd, need to use the information you provide such as name, address, any special needs/dietary requirements etc. We take full responsibility for ensuring that proper security measures are in place to protect your information. We must pass the information on to the relevant suppliers of your travel arrangements such as airlines, ships, hotels, transport companies etc. The information may also be provided to security or credit checking companies, public authorities such as customs/immigration if required by them, or as required by law.

Additionally, where your holiday is outside the European Economic Area (EEA), controls on data protection in your destination may not be as strong as the legal requirements in this country. We will not pass any information on to any person not responsible for part of your travel arrangements. This applies to any sensitive information that you give to us such as details of any disabilities, or dietary/religious requirements. (If we cannot pass this information to the relevant suppliers, whether in the EEA or not, we cannot provide your booking. In making this booking, you consent to this information being passed on to the relevant persons.) Please note that where information is also held by your travel agent, this is subject to your agent's own data protection policy.
