



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Hunting **THE LIGHT** *On board with Hurtigruten, the view is*

On board with Hurtigruten, the view is constantly changing, which means you will never see the exact same scenery twice.

The Northern Lights. The midnight sun. The dark winter nights and the never-ending summer days. Along the coast of Norway, it is all about the light, or the absence of it. Nothing remains the same for long, as the light is forever changing – that is the one thing we can confidently say is constant. The light colours the landscape and villages in a thousand different shades, it wraps them in darkness or it lights them up; it makes them glow in the sunset or it throws long, dark shadows towards the shore. From our ships you have a great opportunity to experience all of this.

In the northernmost parts of Norway, the polar nights last from the beginning of December until the middle of January. During this time the sun completely disappears below the horizon, and only a vague light separates the day from the night. When the captains on our ships talk about "the blue light", they mean the short period of time in these winter afternoons when the whole landscape seems to be bathed in a deep blue colour. Some people think this is even more magical than the aurora borealis.

> The Greek philosopher Heraclitus once said: "You cannot step into the same river twice". We say: "You cannot see exactly the same coast twice."



And because the light changes, the scenery changes too - the ocean; the mountains; the sky, the landscape. Thus one mountain is many different mountains, and the sky has a thousand colours.

The blue light has its counterpoint in the late summer nights' soothing pastel glow, which is so soft it looks as if someone has dusted the world with powdered sugar. This is the opposite phenomenon to the polar nights, when the sun stays above the horizon 24 hours a day, an orange glowing fireball that never dips into the ocean, even at midnight.

And then there are the Northern Lights. They do not adhere to seasons, but appear when they see fit. They are easier to spot in the winter months, but can be seen from our ships throughout autumn as well. We are constantly in search of all these lights, and you can experience them right here along our beloved coast.





Dear explorers,

One autumn evening, as Hurtigruten sailed past Skjervøy, I saw it for the very first time. We were heading south when a series of lights flashed from the windows ashore, almost in rhythm. Until now, this was something I had only heard of. How mothers, husbands, daughters and friends in houses and cottages salute a member of the crew on board Hurtigruten as it sails by; an engineer, a waiter, a steward or officer. Sometimes it is also just a friendly nod to the ship itself.

Now I was standing on deck, seeing it with my own eyes.

These little flashes of light make me feel grateful and proud. To me they are more important than the midnight sun and the Northern Lights. I see them as everyday real affirmations that Hurtigruten truly is a part of the Norwegian coast – just as the coast has been a part of Hurtigruten for over 120 years.

This is where we come from. For generations, Hurtigruten has been the lifeblood of the coast by carrying local passengers, cargo, post, medicines and other essential commodities, and this is as natural and important to us today as it ever was. When the northbound and southbound ships meet and whistle to each other, it signifies more than just two ships crossing paths. It is a meeting of the coast's very own history.

This might also be why so many guests from home and abroad choose Hurtigruten. They want the original. They want to go where no one else goes, with a crew and a ship that belongs there. They want to experience and learn from someone who is at home.

The knowledge of the coast and the sea is part of Hurtigruten's DNA. The new expedition teams on seven of our ships are giving lectures on nature and culture, and will take you out on excursions on their own home turf. We are also refurbishing four of our ships and introducing a brand new one, which will make it even nicer to sail with us.

Furthermore, we have upgraded our "Norway's Coastal Kitchen", to now include breakfast and lunch. The food we serve is caught or harvested nearby, and prepared in accordance with hundredyear-old local traditions. In some places, the fish is actually so fresh that we can point out the boat that caught it for you. Needless to say, we operate in a gentle and sustainable manner.

We now also offer even more active and educational experiences off our ships along the coast. You will understand coast; be it paddling in a kayak outside Tromsø, or speeding along in a rubber boat in Saltstraumen while you watch an eagle dive towards the sea for fish. We will show you the wild and the beautiful up close. No one else can bring you closer to nature, the locals and the daily life along the coast.

Finally, I am going to share a secret with you: April. No other time of the year has as much raw nature. The light is never as clear and bright. The white mountains against the deep blue fjords. The days are long, but you still have the red sunsets. It may be summer in Bergen and winter in the north. The contrasts in the areas we sail across are huge. The weather, the light and the landscape changes constantly throughout the journey.

Welcome aboard! I would encourage you to spend an evening on deck and see if you get to experience a house that flashes to you.





WE ARE PROUD OF OUR MARITIME TRADITION SAILING IN THE WAKE OF GIANTS

The 2,500 nautical-mile coastline from Bergen to Kirkenes was a busy route for all sorts of shipping, from steamers to sailboats. But services were unreliable, infrequent and rarely sailed at night, making the journey from north to south a long and arduous experience.


The Norwegian government wished to remedy the situation and invited shipping companies to submit tenders to operate an express route between Trondheim and Tromsø or Hammerfest depending on the season. At that time, there were only 28 lighthouses north of Trondheim, making night-time sailing very risky. But despite the dangers, the owner of a newlyformed company showed an interest in the route.

In 1893, Captain Richard With's steamer, DS Vesteraalen, was brought into regular service along the coast of Norway, and a regular sea link was established. The service offered several weekly departures, first from Trondheim to Hammerfest and later from Bergen to Kirkenes in only seven days. He called this important connection "hurtigruten," which simply means "the fast route" in Norwegian.

In 1896, Hurtigruten launched the Sportsman route to Spitsbergen, the beginning of our Explorer voyages that have since expanded to visit Iceland, Canada, Greenland and Antarctica.

Hurtigruten's eleven coastal ships still carry freight and passengers along the coast of Norway, and our captains use their extensive maritime expertise to ensure that guests and goods are safely carried from port to port. As they have done for more than 120 years, our ships remain the best way to explore the Norwegian coastline.





HISTORY



1893

Captain Richard With establishes the Hurtigruten steam ship service to link northern and southern Norway. On 2 July, the first Hurtigruten steamship DS Vesteraalen travels from Trondheim to Hammerfest.

1896

Hurtigruten starts the "Sports Route" between Hammerfest and Spitsbergen using DS Lofoten. Captain With ships his hotel from Trondheim to Spitsbergen on board the Raftsund steamer. Otto Sverdrup, captain of the original Fram ship, serves as honorary captain.



1898

The route along the Norwegian coast is extended to the south and now includes Bergen. There are three departures each week.

1908

Kirkenes, near the Russian border, becomes the northern turning point of the coastal voyage.



1910-45

Roald Amundsen and his team cross the Ross Sea on Fram, and become the first humans to set foot on the Geographic South Pole.

1922

1910-1912

The archipelagos of Lofoten and Vesterålen become the latest ports of call along the Norwegian coast.

The reconstruction of Hurtigruten after World War II is given the highest priority. New ships are built.

Since 1949, seven new ships have been added to the fleet. The entire fleet is fully equipped with diesel engines and transports 500,000 passengers a year. The separation into different classes is gone.



1968

Hurtigruten launches an express route to Spitsbergen in the summer months.

1982

The new vessels MS Vesterålen, MS Midnatsol and MS Narvik replace older ships. The Midnatsol is the first ship with a side hatch for easier loading and unloading.

1993-07

1993

Hurtigruten celebrates its 100th birthday. The construction of the MS Kong Harald marks the dawn of the modern era for Hurtigruten. 11 of the 14 ships are in permanent regular service.

2001

On 30 May, the MS Lofoten (built in 1964) is declared a national monument by the Norwegian government.

2002

A new generation ship is in use in Chile and travels from Cape Horn to the Antarctic Peninsula. Two new ships, MS Trollfjord and MS Finnmarken, commence their maiden voyages along the Norwegian coast.

2003

The new MS Midnatsol is christened in Hamburg.

2007

The new Hurtigruten expedition ship MS Fram is added to the fleet. MS Fram is the most modern ship of its kind at the time and the maiden voyage goes to Greenland.

2010

In addition to Greenland and the waters of the Antarctic, MS Fram now also operates along the coast of Spitsbergen and Europe.

2011

The northbound journey with MS Nordnorge from Bergen to Kirkenes from 15 to 22 June is broadcast live on Norwegian television. At 134 hours, 42 minutes and 45 seconds in length, it made it into the Guinness Book of World Records as the world's longest live broadcast.

2013

Hurtigruten celebrates its 120th anniversary.

2015

Hurtigruten Foundation was established.

2016

MS Fram is accompanied by MS Midnatsol in Antarctica, more than doubling the capacity for bringing explorers and adventures to the South Pole. MS Midnatsol also explores the Chilean fjords and the highlights of Antarctica on these voyages.

The new Hurtigruten expedition ship MS Spitsbergen is added to the fleet. Expedition Teams are introduced on the Norwegian Coast.

2017

With the new expedition ship MS Spitsbergen, Canada joins the list of destinations to strengthen Hurtigruten's position as a world leader in exploration travel. New expeditions along the South American coastline are also launched.

THE MAGNETISM OF THE NORTHERN LIGHTS

Nobody wants to go inside when the Northern Lights make an appearance.

For those who have never seen the Northern Lights, they are missing out on an experience which mere words cannot really capture. And those who have seen it will always want to see it again, drawn to the lights' magnetic attraction and mesmerising combination of greens and purples.

It is evening and dark outside. We move slowly across the black water. But we are not looking down, nor are we looking at the landscape where islets and reefs, villages and mountains slowly fade into darkness. No, this time we stand on deck with our heads back, looking up. The air is chilly, people whisper quietly to each other, and then...THERE! THERE IT IS! The aurora borealis, the incredible light for which the dark polar night is so famous.

The Northern Lights are a physical phenomenon that occurs when the solar wind is stronger than normal, and electrically charged particles from the

sun hurtle towards Earth. The particles, electrons and protons, form a magical light when they collide with gases in the Earth's atmosphere. The electromagnetic radiation creates an undulating ribbon of light that varies in shape, colour and strength, from dark blue to yellow, red and orange, but most often green.

Tonight it is green. The lime, emerald light sweeps across the sky like a giant scythe at first, it then be-

comes a bright veil which stretches eastwards, westwards, down to the sea and then up towards the North Star. And look; there is another one! And another! LOOK OVER THERE! The polar sky has decided to materialise in all its beauty, from east to west, north to south. It is like a canvas of light is being pulled across the sky and we cannot keep ourselves from pointing eagerly, forgetting that the person next to us sees the same as we do. How long have we been standing here, mouths open, just looking and photographing, feeling awestruck, inspired, privileged? Five minutes? Ten minutes?

Well, how long does it take to create

a memory for life? Hardly a sound is heard. "The Northern Lights change without moving" writes British author Kathleen Jamie. "It is like a work of art that is never finished, that is constantly drawn, altered, done again." She stares up at the sky again, speechless, like us, like most people who are fortunate enough to have this wonderful experience.

The Northern Lights feature significantly in Norse mythology. One legend implies that the lights were reflections from the shields and armour of the Valkyries, the female warriors who decided who would live and die in battle. The Aurora Borealis was also believed to be "Bifrost Bridge", the rainbow bridge that connects Asgard, the world of the Æsir tribe of gods, with Midgard, the world of humanity.



Northern Lights Occurrence is defined as a sighting from the ship which is recorded by the ship's deck officers and which is an-nounced to passengers on board. An occurrence can last anything from a few minutes to a matter of hours, and the ships decision as to whether the Northern light occurred is final. They will take you on hikes while letting you know how to get the most out of your experience without leaving too much of a mark behind you. They are handpicked for their local expertise and specific knowledge in relevant fields. They are also known for their enthusiasm, curiosity and love for the areas we visit. Our expedition team consists of modern day explorers who love sharing stories, interpreting what we see and leading us to all the best spots.

Special hikes & Norwegian "friluftsliv"

Norwegians are known for their obsession with the outdoors. Whether we work in an office or already work outside, we constantly desire to step out into the great outdoors. This connection with nature is in our blood. This is Norwegian 'friluftsliv'. We would like to inspire the same sense of 'friluftsliv' in you with a hiking package that takes you into the beautiful landscape that surrounds us. The purpose of the hike isn't about lectures or facts on local history, but on the hike itself, reaching a view point or a point of interest. We focus more on the silence and ambience of being "outdoors", feeling, smelling, just being in the moment. Some of these hikes are physical demanding, and possibly on slippery and uneven terrain, so a good physical condition is required. In April and October/November, we will focus more on Norwegian "Friluftsliv" on some of our new additional excursions. Here, the emphasis will be on experiencing nature the way Norwegians do and learning how to survive in the raw Arctic Wilderness.

Languages

Our activities and lectures will be mainly offered in English. A written summary in Norwegian, German and French will be handed out before the lecture starts. When we have German-speaking staff members, we will do our utmost to offer parts of the programme in German.

Recommended equipment

When going on hikes you should choose your equipment based on the weather and the season. As a general rule of thumb, you should remember to pack good shoes for walking, such as boots for rainy and muddy conditions. A wind and water proof jacket, preferably with a hood and hiking trousers. Gloves, a hat, water bottles and sunglasses are also recommended. It's also a good idea to bring a pair of lightweight binoculars and a camera.







FACTS ABOUT THE HIKING PASS:

Hikes you have access to with the hiking pass are adjusted by season and are weather dependent.

With our hiking pass you have access to a minimum of 4 hikes during a full round trip.

A «Hiking kit» containing backpack, map, water bottle and energy bar is sold on board.

The hikes will be carried out with your expedition team and sometimes in collaboration with local guides.

The hikes are first and foremost guided in English.





THE JOURNEY BEGINS BERGEN

Hurtigruten's Classic Round Voyage lasts 12 days and starts in our southernmost port, Bergen. Before your departure, why not arrange some extra time to explore one of Norway's most beautiful and distinctive cities. There was a time when travelling from here across the sea to the UK or the Netherlands was actually far easier than walking across the mountains to Oslo. This is the start and end point for the traditional shipping lanes across the North

Sea, for Hurtigruten and for the fjord liners. Even the railway from Europe ends here, in the City of the Seven Mountains.

Bergen was founded in 1070 AD and was for many years Norway's most important centre of trade with Europe. Numerous traces of this ancient commercial and seafaring culture can still be found throughout the city.

RECIPE FROM NORWAY 'S COASTAL KITCHEN





3 carrots ¹/₂ celeriac 1 small sliced leek 300 ml double cream ready-made fish stock 1 tbsp vinegar, 7% 300 ml sour cream ¹/₂ kg cod fillet 3 tbsp flour salt and pepper 1 can of fish dumplings (optional)

While the stock is boiling, prepare the ingredients for the soup. Cut the vegetables into thin slices or 0.5 cm wide sticks. Add the cream and vegetables to the stock and bring to the boil. Then turn down the heat slightly. Mix together vinegar and cream and add to the soup. Stir well while cooking. Thicken the soup with a little flour mixed with water. Bring to the boil again and simmer for at least 10 minutes. Mayonnaise can also be used to thicken. NB! Don't thicken too much! You're not making porridge! Cut the fish into spoon-sized pieces and add to the soup. Let the fish simmer for around 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Serve and savour each spoonful!

A DAY FOR MASTERPIECES FLORØ-MOLDE

Wake up early to see Hornelen (860 m.s.l.) the mountain which according to the saga was climbed by the Viking King Olav Tryggvason. After sailing past West Cape, we then set course towards what is often considered to be Norway's jewel in the crown. In the summer months, we sail into Geirangerfjord, which is surrounded by majestic mountain peaks, steep cliffs and cascading waterfalls. In autumn, we explore the idyllic Hjørundfjord. Only Hurtigruten ships sail into this gem of a fjord.

2 THE JEWEL IN THE CROWN: GEIRANGERFJORD

We set course for the spectacular UNESCO-listed Geirangerfjord, passing sheer 800 metre cliffs and impressive waterfalls en route. Our excursion starts with a drive up Ørneveien (the Eagle Road). From the top, there is a magnificent view over the fjord itself. We then continue to the serene Eidsdal, from where you can enjoy a picturesque ferry ride to Linge. Back on dry land, the excursion continues into wild, high-alpine areas. One of the many highlights of this trip is the drive down the winding Trollstigen Pass, renown for its 11 hairpin bends. This day of great experiences concludes with a dinner in Molde, before you continue your expedition with Hurtigruten.

3 WORLD CLASS ART NOUVEAU ARCHITECTURE

After it was destroyed by fire in 1904, Ålesund was rebuilt in the fashionable Art Nouveau style of the era. The beautiful buildings are well preserved. Climb up the 418 steps to the top of Mount Aksla right in the centre of the town. On the way up, you'll encounter the statue of the Viking King Gange Rolv, who married a French princess and founded the Viking kingdom in Normandy, becoming ancestor to William the Conqueror. [EXCURSION: ART NOUVEAU WALK]



Today you are as far west as Amsterdam and Marseilles. (In five days you will be as far east as St. Petersburg and Istanbul). In 1725 a Dutch ship carrying 57,000 gold and silver coins sank near Torvik. Divers retrieved them in 1972.

VIKING COUNTRY

As we leave Ålesund you have a clear view of genuine Viking country in the west. The great Viking kings ruled from the island of Giske. From here, they travelled to England, Scotland and Ireland to trade, pillage and plunder.

HJØRUNDFJORDEN

A fjord is a deep, narrow and elongated ocean inlet, cut into the landscape, with steep mountains on three sides. The fourth side, called the mouth of the fjord, is open towards the sea. The fjords were formed when the glaciers retreated and are a prominent feature of the Norwegian coastal landscape - from Hurtigruten's southernmost port of Bergen all the way north to Kirkenes. The Norwegian fjords are world famous. And Hjørundf-

jord is perhaps the most idyllic and beautiful of them all.

This 33-kilometre long fjord is an arm of the larger Storfjord, just south of the city Ålesund. It has a wide mouth but the further in you go, the narrower it gets. And it is deep. On the eastern side the mountains plunge straight into the fjord and, although there is not

much space for settlements here, a few tiny farms cling to the steep terrain. The mountains to the west also slope steeply, and here you'll find small villages connected by dramatic mountain roads.

But you are not travelling by land, you are travelling by water. You are standing on deck on board one of our ships absorbing the feeling of being completely enveloped by sea and mountains. You raise your eyes to the stunning Sunnmøre Alps, one of Norway's most famous mountain areas. The pointed, jagged peaks have names reminiscent of European

The highly popular and visited mountains here are regarded as a national treasure but the fjord itself is something of a secret, left out of all other tourist routes. You travel past steep rock walls, green meadows and isolated mountain farms - all offering a window to the past. Off the beaten track, you discover a fjord treasured by royalty. No wonder this is known to be one of the most beautiful fjords in the world!

A truly imperial experience

climbing history: Saksa. Kolåstind. Kvitegga. Slogen. They are so-called nunataks, meaning they are so high that they protruded through the ice during the last ice age.

Emperor Wilhelm II of Germany visited this fjord and the famous Hotel Union Øye in the late 1800s. So did King Oscar II and Queen Willemina of Hol-

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land and many others from the European aristocracy. They were searching for a scenic and exciting destination, and that is exactly what they found in Hjørundfjord. And then there were the climbers and hikers, those who came here to experience the alpine landscape. The most famous of them all was the British mountaineer Charles W. Patchell, who was an annual guest at the Hotel Union


Øye from 1923 to 1939. He was the first person to climb 15 of the routes around Hjørundfjorden. He even had a cabin built at the foot of the mountain Slogen, which today goes by the name "Patchellhytta" (the Patchell hut).

Now it is your turn. You can stand on deck and just feast your senses on the breathtaking scenery- the lush hillsides, the snowy peaks, the green-blue sea. And you may wonder: How deep is the water under me? How high are the mountains above me? Why did nature turn out like this, right here?

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF VIKINGS KRISTIANSUND - RØRVIK

Trondheim, Norway's third largest city, was founded by the Viking King Olav Tryggvason back in 997 AD. Trondheim's architecture and surroundings create a beautiful, almost mystical atmosphere for any outing, whether you prefer a guided tour of the Nidaros Cathedral, kayaking on the river Nid and into the city's smaller channels, or a casual walk or bicycle ride among the

beautifully restored wooden buildings in the Bakklandet district.



WHAT TO SEE

Make sure you catch the view from the bridge Gamle Bybrua which dates back to 1861, and wander around the restored wooden buildings in the Bakklandet district.

THE BAKKLANDET DISTRICT

The first people settled in the **Bakklandet** district as early as the 1600s, which makes this area one of Trondheim's very first suburbs. The beautiful wooden buildings, which today are fully restored, were actually not part of the original city design, so the buildings and streets have a less planned appearance. Here lived artisans, small traders and labourers, and the houses, often single storey, are therefore smaller and simpler than those in the centre of Trondheim.



A TASTE OF HURTIGRUTEN

The landscape around us is packed full of delicacies, and this has inspired us to develop a cuisine based solely on fresh local produce. On this stretch, we have tastings on deck, where you can learn more about our fantastic Coastal Kitchen concept.

3 A GOTHIC CATHEDRAL

Nidaros Cathedral is Norway's most famous church, and the only one built in the Gothic style. Raised over the burial place of St. Olav, the patron saint of Norway, the construction of this enormous building started as far back as the 1100s. [EXCURSION: TRONDHEIM AND NIDAROS CATHEDRAL]

THE ARCTIC CIRCLE

You are now entering the Arctic, home of the midnight sun.

There are a few invisible borders in the world that are a magical experience to cross. The Arctic Circle is one of these. Even though you can't see this border, you can still feel it, if only perhaps as a barely noticeable shift in the atmosphere, a sudden breath of northerly wind, maybe a sense of excitement and anticipation, or as a tiny change in the light. Travelling north on Hurtigruten, you know you are close when you see the island of Lovund to the west, famous for its huge puffin colony. Shortly afterwards, you pass the beautiful archipelago of Træna, where Norway's trendiest music festival is held every summer. On the island of Hestmannøy, a bit further to the north, you see the peculiar rock formation Hestmannen. In the east, the majestic glacier Svartisen rises towards the sky, and in the daytime you can see a large globe on Vikingen island marking the exact point. And then you know you are there, that you are floating silently across this imaginary geographical line called the Arctic Circle, which forms a circular border around the globe at 66 degrees 33 minutes north, cutting through Nordland in Norway, Sweden, Finland, Russia, Alaska, Canada, Greenland and Iceland. This is where the untamed north begins. This is where the Arctic begins. Above this line lies the land of the midnight sun and polar nights.


The area north of the Arctic Circle is known as the Arctic.



On voyages with Hurtigruten, we often celebrate crossing the line of the Arctic Circle with rites such as whistle signals and symbolic on-deck baptisms welcoming you to the Arctic. Above this line, you can see the sun 24 hours a day throughout the summer – or the Northern Lights during the winter.

WELCOME TO THE ARCTIC! BRØNNØYSUND - SVOLVÆR

Today we cross the Arctic Circle. This invisible border at 66 degrees 33 minutes north marks the southernmost point for the midnight sun, which shines 24 hours a day in the summer. The chances of catching the Northern Lights in winter are also higher above this line. This is where the Arctic begins. Norway's second largest glacier, Svartisen, is located near the old trading village and port of call Ørnes. The journey continues along the beautiful Helgeland coast, considered by many to be just as spectacular as Lofoten. In the afternoon, we sail from Bodø across Vestfjord, and the 1000 metres high mountain Lofotveggen will appear on the horizon. And then you are finally in Lofoten.



WHAT TO SEE



2 THE CHIEFTAIN'S CASTLE

In Stamsund, you will be invited into the Viking Museum Lofotr and the longhouse. This is a full-scale architectural reconstruction of the seat of a chief of the Viking Age. The interior blends the ultramodern with how it was originally. [EXCURSION: MEET THE VIKINGS]



[COD FROM THE BARENTS SEA]

From mid-February until late April, Lofoten is literally teeming with life as millions of skrei undertake their annual journey from the Barents Sea, travelling thousands of miles back to their spawning grounds along the northern part of Norway. Tens of thousands of tonnes of skrei are caught every year, and end up on dinner plates around the world. The migrating cod has been of great significance to Lofoten since Viking times, and each year a Cod Fishing World Championship is held here.

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3 RIB SAFARI TO SALTSTRAUMEN

Travel by RIB boat to Saltstraumen, the world's strongest tidal current. Four times a day (ebb and flow) an incredible 400 million m3 of water is forced in and out of the three-kilometre long narrow channel at a speed of about 29 knots. It also creates powerful whirlpools. The current is strongest during new or full moon. [EXCURSION: RIB SAFARI TO SALTSTRAUMEN IN BODØ]



4 THE GLACIER'S MAGICAL COLOURS

Join us for a trip to Svartisen which, with its lowest part at just 20 metres above sea level, is the lowest glacier in mainland Europe. During the Little Ice Age, this was just one glacier, today it is split into two. The name derives from the ancient term "Svartis", which describes the characteristic deep blue colour of the ice. It actually has a beautiful spectrum of blue shades, from transparent ice, to turquoise and dark blue. [EXCURSION: SVARTISEN]



YOU ARE NOW IN THE REALM OF THE MIGHTY SEA EAGLE

The Sea Eagle is Northern Europe's largest bird of prey and the fourth largest eagle in the world. Females have a wingspan of up to 2.4 metres, while the males are slightly smaller. They can live to be around 50 years old. Bodø reportedly has the highest density of Sea Eagles in the world. Keep on the lookout, and the binoculars to hand, to spot these majestic birds on your voyage.

A couple we know told us last summer "We have criss-crossed the USA many times and travelled through India by train. We have been all around Asia and visited Berlin, Paris and Amsterdam more than once. Why didn't you tell us just to go to Lofoten?"

There are still many Norwegians who have never been to Lofoten. This archipelago in the sea west of the city Bodø is admittedly

but because it disappoints, no – because it overwhelms, and because they did not take the opportunity to come here sooner! That is how magical and majestic Lofoten is.


It is a cliché to use the term "love" about a place. But in this case it is allowed. This is love at first sight, and a love that just grows stronger with time. And you find yourself asking, as lovers do: When can I see you again? How can I return as quickly as possible?

Travelling northbound on our ship, the first meeting with Lofoten is a dramatic one. Many visitors to Stamsund are struck silent with awe as they come face-to-face with the mighty, several million yearold mountain, Lofotveggen. Rough and jagged, but drenched in patterns, shapes, and a kaleidoscope of colours. The mountains here have an extraordinary, bewitching green tint. The white sandy beaches, the turquoise or blue sea, the green mountain ridges, the orange sun in the sky, Lofoten exudes such bright and rich colours that you just cannot bear to look away.

> On the way to Svolvær you stop in at the Viking Museum in Borg. You see hamlets and fishing villages, all built up around the cod fisheries, and you notice that the scenery could be taken straight out of the epic movie trilogy "The Lord of the Rings". You pass picturesque bays nestled in beautiful fjords and flanked by steep mountains. You see an sea eagle flying over a small weathered house, people fishing or someone who has stopped their car in the middle of the road mesmerised by the sight they are now trying to capture on



While you were sleeping last night, we docked at Sortland and picked up fresh Arctic Char from Sigerfjord. The watersystems of Vesterålen, with rivers of deep cold water, are perfect for these diadromous fish, which migrate between fresh and salt water.

THE NORTHERN LIGHTS AND THE NORTH CAPE ØKSFJORD - BERLEVÅG

Enjoy the magnificent landscape as we continue our journey towards the North Cape. In Honningsvåg, you can join us for a cultural walk through the town and let yourself be charmed by the colourful buildings. We will then sail through the heart of the Sámi homeland to the port of Kjøllefjord. This area is also famous for its rich bird life. Enjoy the sub-Arctic landscape as we cross the 71st parallel north, and be sure to take the opportunity to experience the North Cape - the northernmost point on the continent.



WHAT TO SEE

In autumn and winter, this part of the journey provides the best opportunity for those who want to see the mystical Northern Lights.

1 GJESVÆRTAPPAN NATURE RESERVE

BIRDWATCHING SAFARI: Not far from the North Cape is Gjesværtappan, one of the world's most impressive nature reserves. Join our birdwatching safari and experience the hustle and bustle during the nesting season. You will see a number of different bird species, and if you are lucky you may also see the mighty Sea Eagle hovering overhead. [EXCURSION: BIRD SAFARI FROM HONNINGSVÅG]

2 A TASTE OF LAPLAND

Join our excursion to an authentic Sámi camp where we meet reindeer herders and the Utsi family in their traditional Sámi costumes. You will be invited into their tents called "Lavvo" while you learn about the Sámi way of life and hear their traditional joik folksongs. You can also try lassoing reindeer before the trip continues up to the Finnmark plateau (300 m above sea level), where you might catch a glimpse of reindeer in their natural habitat.

FINNKJERKA

On the western side of the Nordkinn Peninsula, not far from the fishing village Kjøllefjord, we find what is reputedly the most dramatic sea cliff in Norway. Its peaks were formed by the ocean, and resemble the turrets and spires of a cathedral.



3 SNOWMOBILE TRIP IN THE ARCTIC

In winter, join us on an unforgettable snowmobile trip to one of Europe's most exciting natural areas. Along the way, the guide will tell you about the Sámi people, the geographic and climatic conditions and how the local population works with nature in both the summer and winter months. If you are lucky, you might also see the Northern Lights dance across the polar night sky.

A trip to the top of the world

Many of us have an adventurous inner explorer. Something within us that longs to find out what lies around the next corner, or is on the other side of a mountain or perhaps an ocean. We want to reach as high or as far as we possibly can. We want to find out... What does it look like there? What does it feel like to be there? For such fortunate few, a place like

the North Cape (Nordkapp) will be high up on their list. Europe's northernmost point, the final frontier between civilization and the North Pole.

There is a certain solidity about Nordkapp. A geological confidence within this nearly vertical cliff that rises 307 meters straight out of the sea at 71°10'21" north of the equator, and becomes a plateau from which you can view the world to the north. Beyond this is the horizon to the top of the world. And it

is perhaps exactly this realisation that evokes emotions this place is so famous for. The Italian Negri wrote in 1664: "Here I stand at the North Cape, the outermost tip of Finnmark, at the end of the world. Here, where the world ends, my curiosity ends as may still have a desire to experience the answer to well, and I turn for home happy." When you are standing here on a clear day the word "endless" takes on a whole new meaning. You are now a mere 2,080 kilometres from the North Pole. In the North-

ern Lights season, catching a display of the aurora across the vast polar star-studded sky from atop Nordkapp is a truly special moment. This unique experience can only be compared to seeing the Midnight Sun from the same point at the height of the Nordic summer.


Although you are neither Negri nor Oscar II, you the question: What does it feel like to be standing at the top of the world at North Cape?

When you are standing on the plateau, look down at the little whale-shaped peninsula to the west: this is Knivskjellodden. At the very tip of this, you would be even closer to the North Pole.

Passing through snow-covered terrain, suddenly a mountain cliff comes into view, rising 307 meters above the Arctic Ocean. This is the North Cape. Standing on the northernmost point on the European mainland will give you a profound feeling of being at the top of the world.

TO THE TOP - AND BACK AGAIN **BÅTSFJORD - KIRKENES - BERLEVÅG**

Kirkenes is known as the capital of the Barents Region and is the gateway to the east. The town is also Hurtigruten's easternmost port and the turning point for our 12-day voyage. You will notice that the landscape and sea along the coast of Finnmark become increasingly more dramatic the closer we come to Kirkenes, which is located just a few miles from the Russian border.



WHAT TO SEE

Kirkenes, not far from the Russian border, is Hurtigruten's turning point. Enjoy panoramic views from the lounge as we sail into the last port before turning around and starting our journey south.



If you are here in winter, we recommend a visit to the Snowhotel in Kirkenes. The hotel first opened in 2006 and is built out of over 15 tonnes of snow and ice. Snow is actually a very good insulator, so when it is minus thirty degrees Celsius outside, the interior at the Snowhotel remains at a stable minus four degrees. Each room is five meters in diameter, decorated with beautiful sculptures of ice and snow and equipped with everything needed for a comfortable night. The beds are surrounded by blocks of ice, insulated mattresses and a sleeping bag that will keep you cosy and warm in temperatures down to minus 35 degrees. [EXCURSION: KIRKENES SNOWHOTEL]



2 SNOWMOBILE ACROSS A FROZEN LANDSCAPE

ARCTIC WINTER: Join our snowmobile or dog sledging excursions over frozen fjords and white plateaus. Along the way, the guide will tell you about the story of the Sámi people, the extreme Arctic climate and the unique wildlife in the area. [EXCURSION: SNOWMOBILE SAFARI]





KING CRAB The red king crab can span

up to over 1 metre in length claw to claw and weigh more than 10 kilograms. It thrives in the cold waters along the coast of Finnmark and is considered one of the region's premier seafood delicacies.



3 THE GATEWAY TO THE EAST

KIRKENES: We are now further east than both Istanbul and St. Petersburg, and the close proximity to the Russian border is noticeable. You might find it an interesting fact that all road signs are written in both the Norwegian alphabet and Cyrillic. The town has several fascinating small museums that tell the story of the cultural heritage and what life is like in this secluded spot.





4 THE TURNING POINT OF OUR JOURNEY

When leaving Kirkenes, so far you have only seen half of what the coast has to offer, so get ready for many more new experiences. The ports previously visited by night on the northbound journey are now seen in broad daylight on the southbound journey. Our first port of call is Vardø where, weather permitting, you'll have the chance to experience ice swimming. On board, during the spring season, there will also be a presentation of the bird life along the Norwegian coast, while in winter local Arctic divers will give a lecture about life in the ocean. We continue along the Varanger peninsula to Båtsfjord before reaching Berlevåg in the evening.

Come dog sledging with Hurtigruten

When travelling with Hurtigruten, you can also experience real dog sledging at two of our ports of call. There is truly no better way to travel across snowcovered plateaus. People living in the polar regions have known that for centuries. So did the Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen when he, with the help of his Greenland dogs, became the first man to reach the South Pole in 1911.

The most common breed used for dog sledging today is the Alaskan Husky. These are hardy dogs that can handle great variations in both temperature and weather conditions. They are happiest when their strong desire to run and pull is fulfilled, which makes them perfect sledge dogs. An author once wrote: "A husky is a mixture of a wolf and an outboard motor",

which is actually a very good description. Dogs that are well equipped to live in the polar regions are not the fastest runners, but they have unparalleled stamina. And they are naturally predisposed never to wear themselves out completely, because the key to survival in this harsh climate is always making sure you never deplete your energy reserves.

Imagine experiencing this: the sledges are being prepared and the dogs' harnesses put on. Once they realise they are going out and running they start howling like there is no tomorrow, they

bark and yelp and pull on their harnesses, but the moment the snow anchor is loosened and the sledge starts to move, everything goes quiet. It is a strange, spine-tingling, experience. The only sound you can hear from the dogs, that just a second ago made such a ruckus, is the rhythmic beat of their breath. That, and the hiss of the sledge runners gliding over the snow, are all that break the polar

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
silence. The dogs want to get going, they know the way, they know exactly what to do. Our dog sledging lasts around half an hour. The scenery is fantastic; you see the ocean, mountains and plateaus. And if you are lucky the Northern Lights will make an appearance too

"The participants go out in small groups so we can give everyone

the attention they need. They connect with the animals, nature and silence. It makes a solid impression, and many tell me afterwards that this has been the best experience of their lives", says one of our dog sledging partners. If you join one of our sledging excursions you will know what he means. You will know what it feels like to sail through the white landscape, just like an explorer, like Roald Amundsen, pulled forward by the pure primal force of man's best friend.

THE EXTREME NORTH MEHAMN - TROMSØ

We now bid the region of Finnmark farewell, as we sail southbound past Fruholmen and Europe's northernmost lighthouse. On Hjelmsøy, you have a great view of Europe's largest colony of guillemots and razorbills, and in Hammerfest you can join in a mountain trek or a guided tour of the town. You can also drink in views of the beautiful Lyngen Alps, either from the comfort of the deck or on a guided hike.



WHAT TO SEE

Founded in 1789, Hammerfest is also home to the UNESCO-listed Meridian Column, erected in 1854 to commemorate the first precise measurement of the globe.

1 THE MAGIC POLAR NIGHT

2 NORWEGIAN ALPS

In spring, we sail into the 120-kilometre long Lyngenfjorden. At this time of the year, the Lyngen Alps are at their most beautiful, and skiers from all around the world come here to enjoy the beautiful and unique landscape. Sharp, snow-covered peaks form a stunning backdrop as we sail into the fjord, and on clear days you can even see the glaciers sparkling in the mountains. On deck, we serve up fresh, sustainably harvested prawns, provided by local fishermen.

3 THE ARCTIC CAPITAL TROMSØ

THE ARCTIC CATHEDRAL: We dock in Tromsø in time to enjoy an unmissable Midnight Concert at the architecturally unique Arctic Cathedral. Alternatively, you can visit some of the town's many pubs and restaurants, and few cities in Norway can boast of a better nightlife. Be sure to try the local brew "Mack", the city's pride and joy. [EXCURSION: MIDNIGHT CONCERT IN TROMSØ'S ARCTIC CATHEDRAL]





THE NORTHERNMOST TOWN IN THE WORLD?

HAMMERFEST: Norway has three of the world's ten most northerly towns; Honningsvåg, Hammerfest and Vardø. Which is the absolute northernmost town in the world, however, is a matter of definition. Qaanaaq (77 degrees north) in Greenland is admittedly considerably further north than the Norwegian ones but has a population of only 630 people, and so the title has traditionally belonged to Hammerfest. In 1891, Hammerfest also became the first town in Norway to have

electric street lighting. Today, it has become a particularly important centre for Norwegian gas production.







LYNGEN SHRIMP

The cold and clear waters of Lyngenfjord give the prawns caught here a unique quality and taste. On this stretch, you have the opportunity to taste this wonderful local delicacy on deck.

FRILUFTSLIV

The longing to be outdoors is in the Norwegian DNA. And it has a name: "Friluftsliv".

The orange flames light up our faces and warm our bodies as we settle down by the crackling campfire. Here we sit, in our scruffy woolly sweaters, with a cup of coffee in our hands and a sparkle in our eyes. The fir trees cast long shadows as the evening draws near. We lie down in the heather and watch the stars light up the dark sky. "This is the life!" the Norwegian thinks to himself.

There is something you should know about us Norwegians; we often have a deep yearning for the outdoors. A backpack, sleeping bag, fishing rod and tent are among the basic belongings we all have, which enable us to live a full life in this coun-

try. Strangely, during the summer vacation, we often meet more of our neighbours in the mountains than in the city we live in. And at Easter, more people head out to the wilderness than to the urban shopping streets. It is in the great outdoors we take our best pictures, which are then proudly posted on Instagram and Facebook.

This longing to be outside is part of our identity, and the old fashioned is sort of modern. It has a name: "friluftsliv", which can best be described as anything to do with outdoor living and

connecting with Mother Nature on both a physical and spiritual level. The concept is as important to the Norwegians as samba is for the Brazilians, sauna for the Finns and pasta for the Italians. The term was coined by the great playwright, Henrik Ibsen, who made the concept of friluftsliv famous in his poem "On the Heights" (1859).

"Learn to love skiing." That was reputedly the advice Norwegian national hero Fridtjof Nansen gave King Haakon on how he could win a place in the Norwegians' hearts. "Why?" you may ask. Because we are brought up to believe that we will


be happier outdoors. Fridtjof Nansen believed it. The renowned Norwegian philosopher, Arne Næss, believed it. They both connect friluftsliv to nature, to our origins, to health and to a sense of identity. Friluftsliv is a resumption of a previous way of life. Man was, until relatively recently, a hunter-gatherer. In earlier times, we were born in nature and we died in nature. We did not know anything else. As more and more people now live comfortably in cities, it is like our primeval selves are trying to tell us something. It comes in the form of a restlessness or longing. We start studying the map and pack our backpacks. We simply must get out!

Hurtigruten's highly skilled expedition team offers lectures, stories and customised excursions.

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An Asian girl who moved to Norway with her family once asked in a newspaper interview: "Where are all the Norwegians on the weekends? We never see anyone around the neighbourhood!" This was actually her first encounter with this concept. The answer: "We are at the cabin or on a Sunday family hike." Every Friday after lunch, you can see long queues of cars out of the cities; people are off to the cabin or for a nature walk.

Our need to be close to nature is embedded in our DNA. So the longing to be outdoors and our passion for nature naturally characterise the activities that Hurtigruten create for you. We want to show you what we Norwegians love. And we hope that you will experience a touch of happiness on these trips, around the campfire, or on the trails, or over a cup of coffee or tea made and enjoyed together. We cannot guarantee that the weather will be good. But we can guarantee genuine Norwegian outdoor activities – and fresh, rosy cheeks.



WELCOME TO LOFOTEN TROMSØ - STAMSUND

Make sure you do not oversleep today. The journey past the beautiful Vesterålen islands towards the equally spectacular Lofoten is for many the highlight of the trip. Between Sortland and Stokmarknes, you can see the famous mountain Møysalen, inspiring numerous artists over the years. As we sail south through Vesterålen, we are seemingly heading straight for the mountain wall, but there is an opening there: Raftsundet, which leads to the bewitching and narrow Trollfjord. We end the day with activities in Svolvær, the capital of Lofoten: sea eagle safari, fishing and RIB boat rides, horseback riding and more.



WHAT TO SEE

Sailing through Vesterålen to Lofoten should be top of the list of things to do for every traveller and explorer. The beauty here is unparalleled.

VESTERÅLEN – A RARE NATURAL TREASURE

We dock in Harstad in the morning, where you can join one of the real classics in Hurtigruten's excursion programme: "A Taste of Vesterålen". Learn the history, see unspoiled nature and discover the places Norway is so proud of – such as the white, medieval Trondenes Church, which is one of the nation's premiere cultural heritage sites dating back to the Middle Ages. If you choose to stay on board, you can see the church from deck as we sail towards Risøyrenna, a channel only seven meters deep, made especially for Hurtigruten in the 1920s.

2 THE POST MUST GET THROUGH

Risøyhamn is a small village on the island of Andøya. We stop here to drop off passengers – and to deliver food and post to the approximately 200 inhabitants. Delivering food, money and medicines has been an important task for Hurtigruten from the very beginning, and has been of significant aid to the people living along the coast.



3 AN OPENING BETWEEN THE MOUNTAINS

RAFTSUNDET: A 20-kilometre long strait between Lofoten and Vesterålen, flanked by 1,000-metre high mountains. As we sail through the strait, you will see picturesque villages that are still inhabited as well as some that were abandoned long ago, small white beaches and a beautiful cemetery island, among other things. And then we are at the mouth of Trollfjord, the two-kilometre long, 100-metre wide fjord. Weather permitting, we will venture in...don't forget your camera...

4 WHAT TO DO IN LOFOTEN

SVOLVÆR: This is the perfect place for adventure and exploration. In Svolvær, you can choose between several seasonal excursions. Enjoy a trip out to the Lofoten Islands where you can visit small fishing villages, or a guided walk around the picture postcard area of Svinøya. Hop aboard a local fishing boat and try your hand against the big cod. Go on a mountain hike and see Lofoten's white beaches and turquoise sea from high up. If you want an adrenaline rush, you can join an excursion by RIB around the fantastic Lofoten archipelago. In this high-speed adventure, you get to see a lot of Lofoten, including a magnificent lagoon with a stunning secluded beach. Or maybe you would rather choose a quiet horseback ride through the breathtaking scenery Lofoten has to offer.

TROLLFJORDEN

Mythical and historic, this fjord has an ambiance all its own

How is a memory created? Why do we rememb- touch them. We lean our heads all the way back. er one particular moment for our entire lives, but not what happened immediately afterwards or before? It is nearly midnight. The landscape outside has lost its contours, and the mountains and islands of Lofoten have been swallowed

up by the polar night. We are on our way through Raftsundet towards Trollfjord, a narrow and mythical fjord that has been carved out over millions of years by forces of nature in such a dramatic and bold way that even the locals here in the north feel a sense of awe whenever they enter it. We flock out onto the deck. Wrapped up in our warm clothing we stand there, staring into the narrow, dark gap ahead. Only muffled voices are heard, barely more than whispers. Can a ship of this size really go in there? Is that physically possible?

Can the captain actually see anything? At that very moment the ship's floodlights are turned on and Trollfjord reveals itself - narrow, majestic and alluring, as if we have had a glimpse of a prehistoric time. Slowly we sail in. We are so close to the cliff sides it feels like we can literally reach out and

The mountain on our right side rises two hundred metres straight up, and it seems as if we are sailing into a tunnel. Then we are in the innermost area of the fjord. There is no way forward, seemingly no way out. The engines are turned off, the

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wind, who can row without oars." When the song fades out, he disappears into the night, not even

the crew knew who he was. Soon afterwards the engines start up, the ship rotates and we continue our journey north enriched with a memory that will last a lifetime.

voices subside and all that can be heard is a deafening silence. We stand there together, friends and strangers, united in darkness and nature while the minutes tick slowly by. Then all of a sudden, we hear a beautiful voice coming from a hooded man among us. With a proud stance, he sings while looking out into the night. All turn around, and we hear the words reverberate: "Who can sail without


On calm days, Hurtigruten can sail in and almost brush the sides of the thousand metre high mountains of Trollfjorden. No other place offers you the chance to get as close to an incredible sight like this. You will be in awe of the beauty that awaits you.

A DATE WITH THE SEVEN SISTERS

BODØ - RØRVIK

Even as you tear yourself away reluctantly from Lofoten, the rest of the journey will help to soothe you with equally magnificent sights. In the morning, we cross the Arctic Circle and head for the Helgeland coast with its abundance of islands, islets, reefs, and steep mountain walls. This is the home of the unique rock formation Hestmannen, Torghatten with its distinctive

hole and the spectacular Seven Sisters mountain range. All seven mountains are between 900 and 1,100 metres high, and according to the legend, seven sisters were turned to stone because they forgot to hide from the sun.



BUT WHAT ARE THEY CALLED?

THE SEVEN SISTERS: The mountains from north to south: Botnkrona (1072 m), Grytfoten (1066 m), Skjæringen (1037 m), Tvillingene (980 m), Kvasstinden (1010 m) and Stortinden (910 m).

A STRANGE MOUNTAIN IN THE SEA

TORGHATTEN (258 m.s.l): On the island Torget in the Brønnøy municipality is a mountain so strange that everyone stops talking when we sail past. All they do is stare and take photos. The reason? Torghatten is famous for its distinctive hole right through the mountainside. The hole is 160 metres long, 35 metres high and 20 metres wide and was created during the ice age. The softer rocks gradually eroded, while the harder rocks (around the hole) remained. A walk up to the hole takes around 20 minutes along a natural trail.

COD LIVER OIL TASTING:

We meet on deck for this ritual of crossing the Arctic Circle. Everyone must close their eyes, open their mouth and take a spoonful of cod liver oil. Nothing is healthier or more beneficial to you than this. And if you're good, and swallow every drop, you get to keep the spoon.





2 THE ARCTIC CIRCLE

The day starts early and crossing the Arctic Circle at 66 ° 33' N is an important "rite of passage" as we now leave the Arctic north. We celebrate this with a ceremony out on deck. You should stay outside for a while afterwards, as a range of spectacular mountains are lined up ahead.

3 THE HOME OF THE SALMON

BRØNNØYSUND: Norway is one of the world's largest exporters of fish and seafood. In Brønnøysund, one of the most important salmon farming locations, we offer an excursion to the Norwegian Aquaculture Centre. Here you can learn about modern fish farming, see how the fish live and what they eat. [EXCURSION: VISIT THE SALMON, BRØNNØYSUND]

4 A GLIMPSE OF PRE-HISTORIC TIMES

VEGA: Vega is a large island in the west, just north of Brønnøysund. Around 1,400 people live here on this fertile farmland, amidst fish and seabirds. The inhabitants are surrounded by ancient settlements and 10,000-year-old burial mounds. The fields must be ploughed with the utmost care as 280,000-year-old artefacts have been found in the soil here!

THE FISH THAT BUILT NORWAY

The first inhabitants settled along Norway's northern coast around 10 000 years ago. Why did they stay, you might wonder?

Because of the cod. Because of the ocean and the vast amount of food it contains. The Norwegian coast is a hilly landscape, with many high mountains. Thus for the people living there, the ocean naturally became their main transport route. And that is where the fish were too.

Hunting methods were developed and the ocean explored, and a particular fish caught their attention: "skrei" or Lofoten cod, which between January and April each year migrate thousands of miles from their home in the Barents Sea to the Lofoten Islands to reproduce. Nobody knows exactly when the coastal population became aware of the cod's spawning pattern, but archaeological findings suggest that the annual Lofoten fishery may date as far back as 6000 years.

The method of drying the fish on large wooden racks was probably started by the Vikings. It was ac-

tually the Vikings who first organised the Lofoten fishery, and people from all parts of the country travelled up there to take part. The very first rorbu cabins (fishing hut) probably also stem from this time. So do the first exports of stockfish. Egil's saga describes how, in the year 875, the Viking chief Torolv sent some of his men to Lofoten to fish cod. They then sailed to England where the fish was bartered for wheat, honey, wine and fabrics.

The Lofoten cod has since then dominated life along the coast, and has been one of Norway's most important exports for over a thousand years. It is largely exported as stockfish; unsalted cod, dried by cold air and wind on

wooden racks on the shore, which are called "hjell" in Norwegian. From your Hurtigruten ship, you can see these "hjell" on many parts of the coast, perched on the rock-face and hillsides by the sea. You might even say that Norway was built on cod and seafood. The seafood in our ocean is probably also the reason why so many of our captains' and crews' ancestors chose to settle along the coast. A bountiful, succulent catch is harvested daily, and served fresh to our passengers.


Norway is the world's second largest exporter of seafood. Stockfish. Lutefisk. Salmon. Every day more than 31 million meals are created around the world, using ingredients from the waters along and off the Norwegian coast. The ocean is our expertise, it is what we are famous for. That applies both to Norway and to Hurtigruten.



Every year, millions of cod come down from the Barents Sea to the north Norwegian coast, particularly Lofoten. The reason for this innumerable return is to find a mate and to spawn the next generation of cod, who will continue the cycle by journeying back to the Barents Sea. With good reason then, the cod has earned the local nickname of the Valentine Fish.

THE OLD CITIES AND THE SEA TRONDHEIM - ÅLESUND

After visiting Trondheim in the morning, the ship heads slowly out of the majestic Trondheimsfjord past Munkholmen, Hitra and thousands of islands and islets before docking in Kristiansund – often referred to as Norway's "cured cod capital" because of its long-time export of salted dried fish. From Kristiansund, we cross the open sea on our way towards Molde.

2 A WALK THROUGH 1000 YEARS

TRONDHEIM: The walk through Trondheim is a journey through the city's 1000-year long history. The walk starts at Stiftsgården, the royal residence in Trondheim, and continues to the market square. From here, we walk to Nidaros Cathedral, Norway's national monument and only Gothic cathedral. We then cross the old city bridge, and enter the area of the city called Bakklandet with its beautiful wooden architecture. [EXCURSION: TRONDHEIM CITY WALK]

THE FJORD AND THE CITY

The ship heads slowly out of the majestic Trondheimsfjord, which is 170 kilometres long and up to 25 kilometres wide. Like all other Norwegian fjords it is deep, up to 577 metres. The Hurtigruten brochures include pictures and descriptions of wildlife, which may be seen from the ships and during excursions. Spending time on outside decks increase your chance of spotting wildlife and natural phenomena but there is no guarantee of sightings.

When ashore, bring your litter back to the vessel or dispose this at designated places. We are often near wildlife on our voyages. Please heed the advice from our tour leader/expedition leader and excursion guides and strive towards acting in a way that does not alter the wildlife's natural behaviour.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATION

The standard of the hotels we use is equivalent to 3 or 4-star. There is no official hotel rating system in Norway. All rooms have private facilities (except for the Snowhotel in Kirkenes). Single rooms may be smaller and less conveniently situated and may be double rooms for sole occupancy or purpose built single rooms. Hotels may charge for some facilities e.g. saunas.

Norwegian and English are the official on board languages. The personnel at the reception and some of the service crew often also speak German. The Tour Leader speaks Norwegian, English and German. Expedition leaders speak Norwegian and English.

LAUNDRY

Laundry rooms with washing machines, dryers and irons are available on all ships. Tokens can be purchased at reception

MEAL

Breakfast is usually served from 0730hrs (open seating), lunch from 1200 (open seating), and dinner from 1800. It is possible to book individual seating times for dinner, subject to availability and ticket type. During the high season, there will be limited availability for some dining slots unless pre-booked. Lunch may also be served in two seatings due to capacity issues. The voyage begins with a buffet dinner on departure from Bergen, and ends with brunch on arrival back in Bergen.

Norway's culinary traditions have much in common with the scenery of the coastline. It is always fresh, distinctive and full of variety. We have always strived to give our guests a truly unique and authentic experience, and local produce and old food traditions are incorporated into every element of the culinary experience on board as well.

We pride ourselves on using many local suppliers and ingredients from up and down Norway's coast, with our "Norway's Coastal Kitchen" on board our ships. Breakfast consists of a good selection of cold meats, cheeses, eggs, cereals and fruit, with freshly baked bread, pastries and dinners, while for those guests who wish to enjoy an enhanced dining experience, we offer Norway's Coastal Kitchen's "a la carte" menu available for a small additional charge.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

There is no doctor or pharmacy on board. However, officers are trained in first aid and can provide emergency medical assistance. The ships are also close to land should urgent medical assistance be required.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Norwegian currency is used on board. Most major currencies may be exchanged. Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Diners Card are all accepted. A cruise card can be obtained and used for payment for extras and settled at the end of your voyage. This may be subject to change.

PORTERAGE

Ice spikes and other winter clothing can be purchased in the ships store. Do not carry large amounts of cash and keep valuable items, including mobile telephones and cameras, out of sight.

SHOPS

Our on board shops carries a selected range of high quality knitwear, clothing, souvenirs and gift items. In addition, there is also a small selection of toiletries available for purchase. On MS Lofoten, this service is handled by the cafeteria.

SHORE EXCURSIONS

Pre-booking excursions (where possible) is recommended as only the remaining places will be sold on board. Excursions booked on board will be payable in Norwegian Kroner and the price may vary as a result of exchange rate fluctuations. Pre-booking of shore-excursions is possible until 4 weeks prior to departure. If you choose to pay by credit-card, pre-bookings can be made until 2 weeks prior to departure. SMOKING

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas on the outsides decks. It is not permitted when the ships are in port and fuelling. The staff will advise when it's not allowed to smoke outside. Smoking

With the exception of MS Lofoten, all of our vessels are equipped with stabilizers.

TELEPHONE/MOBILE PHONES

Private mobile telephones may be used on board although reception may vary. Check with your provider for costs when using your phone abroad.

WHAT TO WEAR

On board dress is informal. Although some passengers choose to change for dinner, the dress code is casual rather than formal. The weather in Norway can vary during the course of each voyage or even during the day. To cater for these variations we recommend the layered dress approach that enables you to adapt to changes in temperature, wind and precipitation conditions easily. For all voyages we advise you to take breathable rain and windproof clothing. A warm hat, gloves, scarf and thermal clothing can be useful, together with thermal underwear, during the winter months. On land where it may be icy, sturdy shoes are important for shore excursions and a walking stick/trekking pole may be useful.

WORKING SHIPS

Our ships function as working ships calling at ports around the clock. You may expect some noise and vibration in some cabins during docking and loading of goods. This varies depending on the location of your cabin and the type of ship. Also, noise affects people differently and what may be a problem for one person may not be a problem for another.

We reserve the right to require any Passenger to produce medical evidence of fitness to travel in order to assess whether that Passenger can be carried safely in accordance with applicable international, EU or national law. If we consider it necessary, we are entitled to administer a health questionnaire prior to boarding.

If it appears to us, the Master or the Company's nominated medical representative that a Passenger is for any reason unfit to travel, likely to endanger safety, or likely to be refused permission to land at any port, or likely to ren-der the Carrier liable for Passenger maintenance, support be refused permission to land at any port, or likely to en-der the Carrier liable for Passenger maintenance, support or repatriation, then the Carrier or the Master shall have the right to take any of the following courses: (i) Refuse to embark the Passenger at any port; (ii) Disembark the Pas-senger at any port; (iii) Transfer the Passenger to another erth or cabin; (iv) If the Company's no representative considers it advisable, to place or confin him/her or to transfer the Passenger to a health facility at any port, at the Passenger's expense (v) to adminis ter first aid and administer any drug, medicine or other substance or to admit and/or confine the Passenger to a nospital or other similar institution at any port pro that the ship's nominated medical repr . ative and/o siders that any such steps are necessar
