# THE SEVEN LIVES OF THE FAMED SEA CLOUD

Luxurious family yacht, floating diplomatic palace, war vessel in the service of the U.S. Navy – the vita of the **SEA CLOUD** is more fascinating to read than many novels. In 1931, the Wall Street broker Edward Francis Hutton had the legendary windjammer built in Kiel calling her “Hussar”. But it was his wife, the extravagant Marjorie Merriweather Post, who gave the tall ship her distinctive character. She furnished the “Hussar” – at that time the largest private yacht in the world – with a sure sense of style and lovingly chosen antiques. At least nine months of the year, the Huttons spent at sea and headed for the most exotic destinations.





## A NEW LIFE UNDER A NEW NAME

But their life in the lap of luxury soon became clouded: In 1935, the affluent couple got divorced, and Ed Hutton signed the “Hussar” over to his ex-wife. She had the previously black hull painted white and also gave her yacht a new name: The “Hussar” became the SEA CLOUD. And before the end of that year, Marjorie got married to her old friend Joseph E. Davies. Henceforth, the attractive

socialite moved not only in the circles of economic magnates but also became familiar with the world of politics and diplomacy. When Davies took on the position of U.S. ambassador in Moscow in 1937, the SEA CLOUD was ordered to Leningrad as a floating (and bug-proof) diplomatic palace. Marjorie excelled at socialising within the diplomatic scene. Besides the Soviet notables, several crowned

heads, among others from the Swedish and Belgian royal dynasties, happily accepted her invitations on board. But when Davies was appointed U.S. ambassador in Belgium in June 1938, the SEA CLOUD had to bid the USSR farewell.

## A YACHT’S WAR SERVICE

Few guests only are aware of the significance of the small plaque that is affixed to the face side of the wheel house: Each of the five brass angles indicates six months of active war service for the USA. After the U.S. entered the war in 1941, the Navy began to acquire private yachts to reinforce the fleet; and Marjorie and Joe Davies committed the

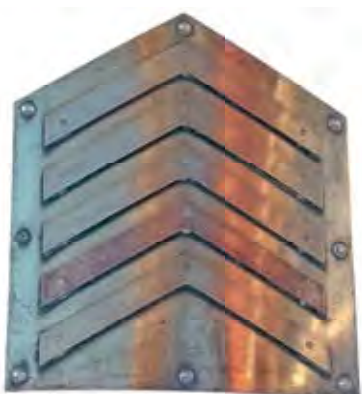
SEA CLOUD to the Coast Guard for the symbolic charter of one dollar – opinions differ whether this was from a patriotic sense of duty or due to economic necessity. With demounted masts and a grey coat of paint, the erstwhile proud luxury yacht cruised between the Azores and Greenland as a floating weather station.



## BACK TO NEW SPLENDOUR

Only in 1949, four years after the end of the war, the windjammer – freshly painted white again – received an entire set of new sails. When the SEA CLOUD first appeared on the horizon under

full sail, Joe said to Marjorie: “Well, dear, there goes your baby.” But meanwhile, someone else also coveted Marjorie’s baby: Rafael Leónidas Trujillo Molina, dictator of the Dominican Republic.



## TEMPORARY RETIREMENT FOR A “QUEEN OF THE SEAS”

In 1955, Trujillo bought the ship and renamed it “Angelita”. Mostly, his son Ramfis used the presidential yacht – for parties with Hollywood stars like Zsa Zsa Gabor and Joan Collins. When Trujillo was shot dead on 30 May, 1961, a revolution unsettled his country. Carrying the dead body, part of the Trujillo clan and enormous amounts of cash, the “Angelita” set sail for Cannes. But the new government forced the crew to turn around: The expensive heirloom was renamed “Patria” and put up for sale again. Five years later, the Operation Sea Cruises Inc. under John Blue bought the ship. However, when the “Antarna” – that was the yacht’s new name – entered the U.S.

on the return journey from Naples, there was trouble with the authorities, and the “Antarna” was impounded. This was when Stephanie Gallagher appeared on the scene: At just 26 years of age, she was obsessed with the idea of an “Oceanic School” and academic learning at sea. Although “Oceanics” settled all unpaid invoices,

John Blue retained the ship’s papers. Stephanie Gallagher set sail nevertheless – and was now chased as a “pirate”. In Panama, Blue finally came on board accompanied by attorneys and the police. Stephanie Gallagher had no choice but to give up.



## RENAISSANCE OF A DREAM YACHT

For eight years, the “Antarna” was berthed unprotected in the port of Colón and exposed to the damp climate. But she was not forgotten by the enthusiasts for proud sailing ships. One such aficionado was the German Hartmut Paschburg, sea captain and economist. Together with a group of merchants from Hamburg, he purchased the luxury yacht –

and gave her back her old name, **SEA CLOUD**. But the hardest piece of work was yet to come: Captain Paschburg had to bring the yacht home across the Atlantic. In 1978, he gathered 40 men and women and together, they made the dilapidated yacht seaworthy again, then sailing her back to Hamburg. The Howaldts-werke-Deutsche Werft AG in Kiel

carried out the extensive overhauling and alteration work; and eight months later in 1979, the **SEA CLOUD**, now reflagged, went on her first cruise. Since her latest refurbishment in 2011, the windjammer not only conforms to the up-to-date SOLAS regulations (Safety Of Life At Sea) but shines in new splendour – as timelessly elegant as ever.

# PASSIONATE ABOUT SAILING

A passion for exclusive tall ships and sophisticated indulgence has shaped the legacy of our two yachts since their creation. The American millionaire couple Edward F. Hutton and Marjorie Merriweather Post were already owners of several luxury vessels when, in 1929, they commissioned the construction of a new ship – one that would be larger and more extravagant than anything that had gone before. The legendary SEA CLOUD was born, a yacht whose beauty would, 70 years later,

go on to inspire the building of its sister ship, the SEA CLOUD II. Yet as elegant as our two windjammers may be, these two vessels are imbued with sailing tradition: On these ships, sailing is not just for show – it is a true craft. When the orders ring out over the deck and the crew climb the masts to hoist the sails, every single manoeuvre marks a centuries-old ritual being brought to life.





## TRULY AUTHENTIC, TRULY ROMANTIC

The sailing crew pulls with all their power on a hemp rope that disappears into the rigging twenty metres above their heads. The mighty sails flap in the fresh sea breeze, starting a tug-of-war with the team down below. Flawlessly polished brass

shines in the sunlight. Then with one final strong tug on the main halyard, the yacht is ready to feel the full force of the wind – mission accomplished! It takes our crew almost one hour to hoist the sails by hand, and it is a fascinating spectacle each and

every time. Once firmly enveloped in a romantic tall ship setting, you will understand just why our vessels are the most beautiful part of the adventure; after all, a voyage aboard a majestic tall ship is much more than just a cruise.

## A PRIVATE YACHT WITH A FASCINATING HISTORY

Golden, swan-shaped taps, splendid marble fireplaces, French antiques – as heiress to a fortune totalling several million dollars, Marjorie Merriweather Post was able to let her imagination run free when it came to building her private yacht. In 1931 the “Hussar” (as the SEA CLOUD was originally named)

was launched in Kiel. Together with her husband, the savvy stockbroker Edward Hutton, Marjorie turned this elegant four-masted barque into a stage for her eccentric lifestyle. Her friends included aristocracy and Hollywood stars, and politicians and diplomats often graced the decks of this windjammer.



## WHERE INDULGENCE MEETS RELAXATION

Even today every detail on board this yacht shines with the glory of a bygone age. The SEA CLOUD's elegance appears timeless; proof that this vessel has lost none of its unconventional charm. 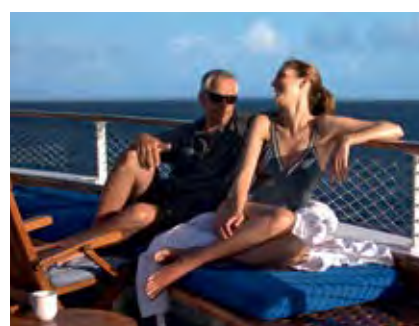

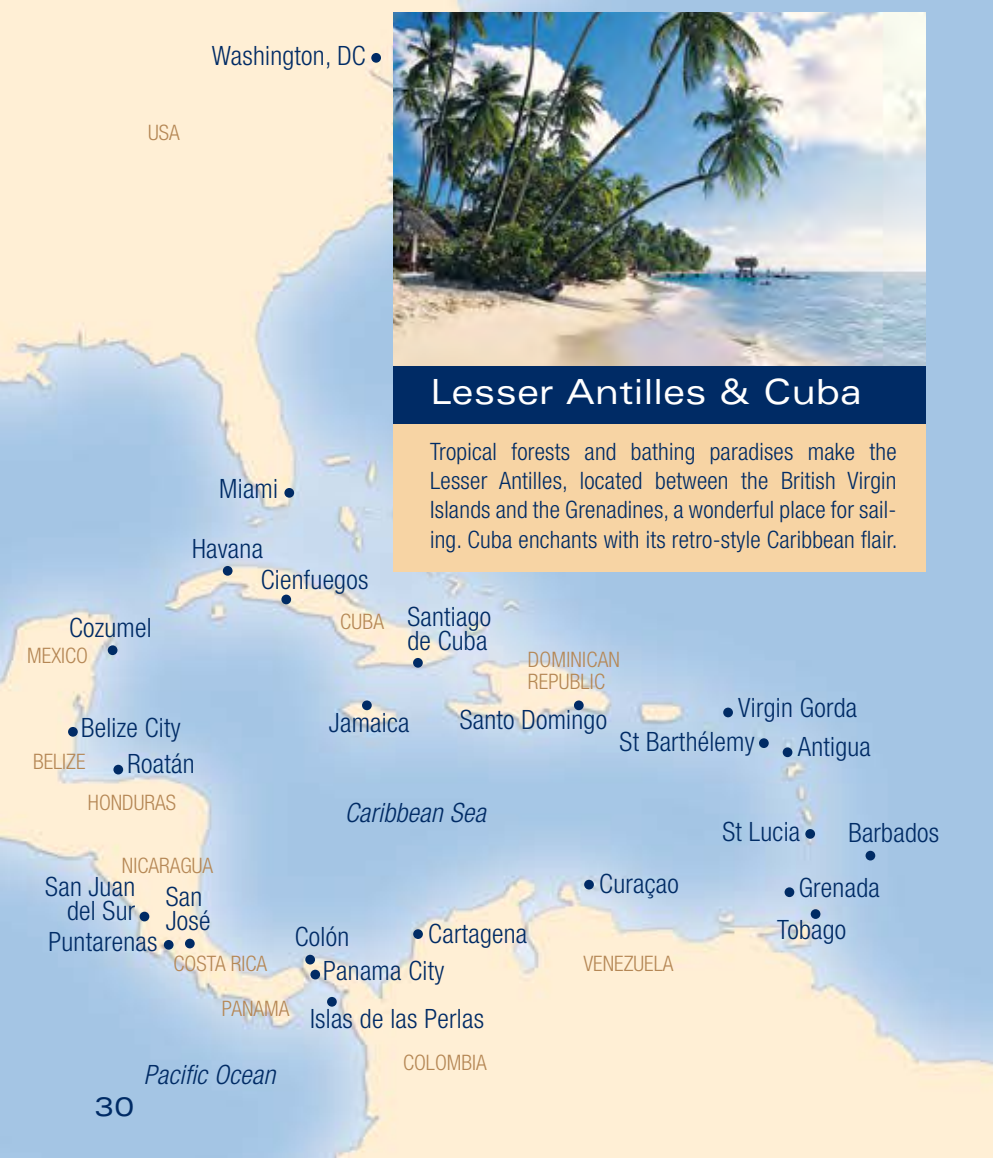

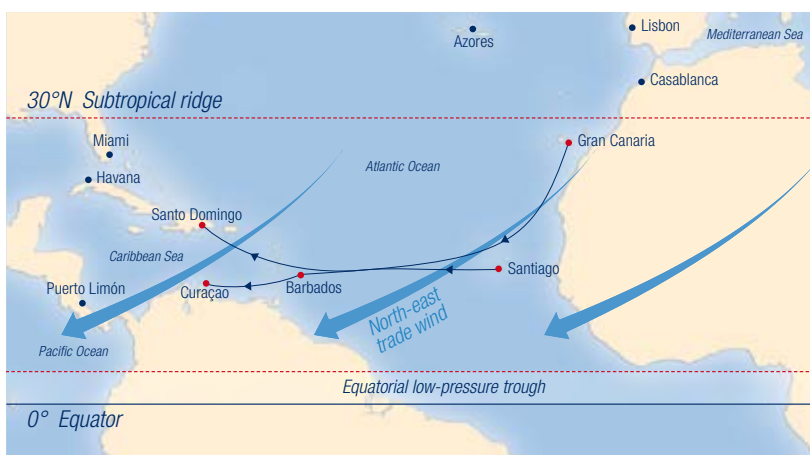
## TRANSATLANTIC FASCINATION

For their cruise to the New World, our windjammers take the same route across the Atlantic as Columbus did in 1492. But what the discoverer did not yet know back then: During the winter months, the trade winds provide ideal sailing conditions in a westward direction.



## Ideal sailing conditions

SEA CLOUD and SEA CLOUD II can rely on these tropical winds to propel them across the seas. Every nautical mile covered brings you closer to summer. At the end of November, when the hurricanes over the Atlantic have long dissolved, our yachts set sail from the Canaries or Cape Verde. From that point, it gets a little warmer every single day. We first head south until we reach the trade winds, before setting a westward course that takes us to the Caribbean. The windjammers experience ideal sailing conditions for two weeks, often even overnight, gliding towards a magnificent sunset every day.



## What are the trade winds?

When, close to the equator, the sun is almost vertical in the sky, it shines straight down heating the air above the ocean surface. Once warm, the air becomes lighter, rises and moves towards the poles on both sides of the equator. At around 30° north and 30° south, the masses of air have

cooled to such an extent that they sink again and return to the equator in the form of steady westerly winds, known as the trade winds. This is what carries our two windjammers across the Atlantic with constant force.

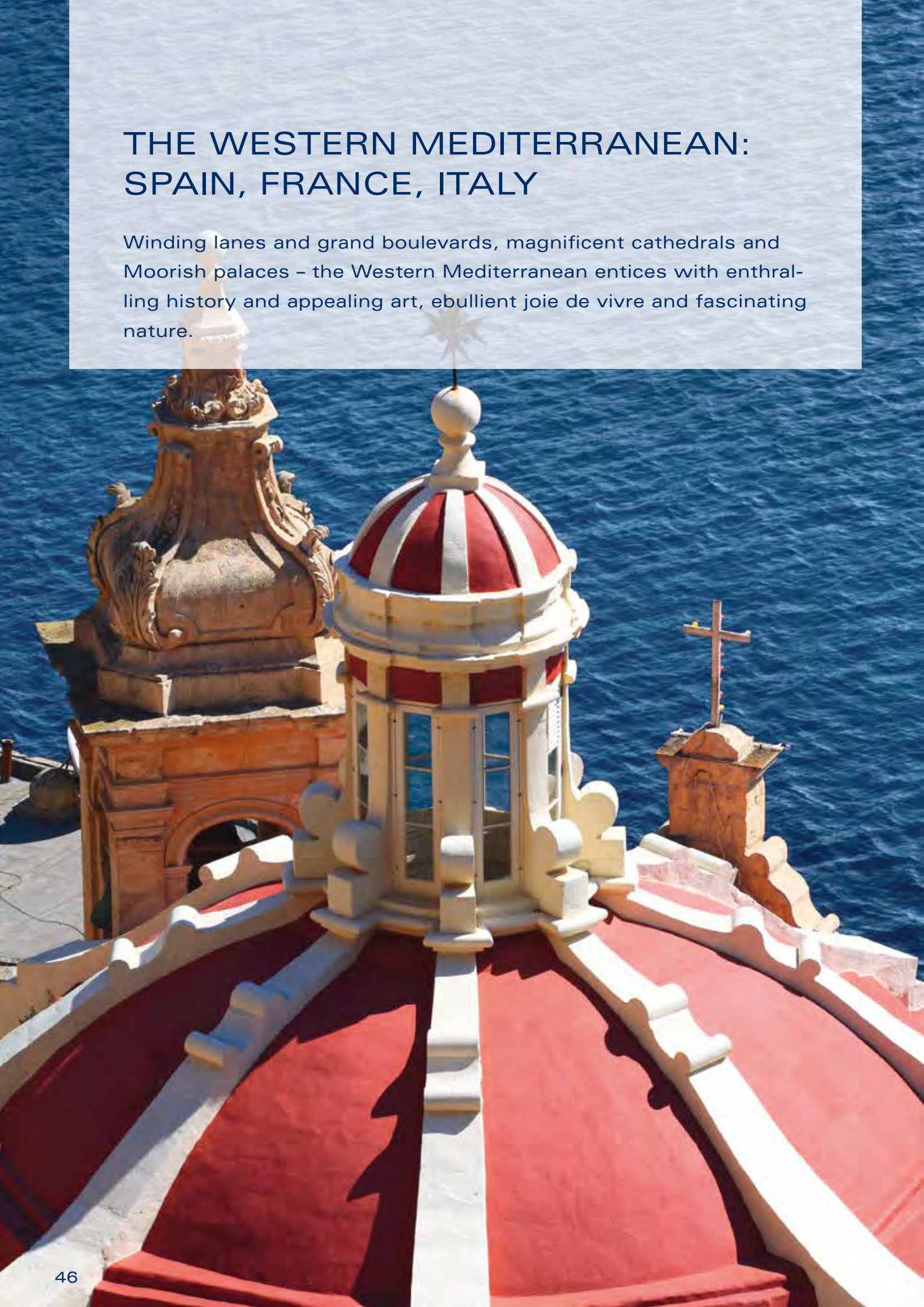

Fans of sailing from all around the world are drawn to their idyllic and tropically warm waters, and the quaint beach bars bring together everyone from luxury yacht owners to solo sailors. It is so easy to get used to the care-free lifestyle, and with your feet in the sand as you gaze out over green hills and the tranquil sea, you will soon forget about the stresses of everyday life back home.

### Luxury in a relaxed atmosphere on St Barths

Known for attracting a certain class of visitor, St Barthélemy has been a top holiday destination for the rich and famous from around the world ever since billionaire David Rockefeller discovered the island back in the 1960s. #### Colourful Caribbean underwater world

Eye to eye with parrotfishes, ocean turtles and damselfishes – the Tobago Cays and St Lucia are considered the best diving and snorkelling haunts in the Caribbean. The crystal-clear water with tropical temperatures offers metres deep views and invites to excursions through fascinating, colourful underwater worlds.

#### Grenada – the island of spice

Although Grenada has been blessed with around 45 picture-perfect beaches, the country's real treasure remains its lush, green island interior. Deep volcanic lakes, dense rainforests, waterfalls and small river courses form the primordial backdrop of the island's sugar cane fields and spice plantations. ## Italy at its best – the scenic Amalfi Coast, ancient sites and famous volcanoes: Rome (Civitavecchia) – Malta

### The natural harbour of Bonifacio

Sailing into Bonifacio is quite simply a spectacular experience – a steep, shimmering white chalk cliff, a small town that appears to be floating magnificently on the plateau and a fjord-like bay which gives way to an elegant marina. Those who wish may explore the area’s medieval upper town or take a stroll along the promenade.

### Capri: magic island and dream destination

Ever since the German painter August Kopisch discovered the Blue Grotto 190 years ago, Capri has been considered the epitome of romantic Italy. With its magical light, its pleasant climate and rugged rocks, the island beauty in the Gulf of Naples still instills a yearning to travel. After a stroll through the narrow streets and a visit to the boutiques, stop for a cappuccino in the Piazzetta, and you will have the best view of the island’s hustle and bustle.

### The scenic Amalfi Coast

Violet bougainvillea in front of pastel pink facades; houses clinging to the cliffs like swallows’ nests; a grand open staircase looking out onto the glistening turquoise sea – Sorrent, Positano and Amalfi sometimes seem too good to be true. But the colourful, romantic fishing villages are real. In 1997, the UNESCO declared the Amalfi Coast a World Heritage Site.

### UNESCO World Heritage Site Paestum

The mighty columns of Poseidon’s temple still soar into the blue Campanian sky much like they did 2,500 years ago. Together with the basilica and the Temple of Athena, they form the Doric heart of Paestum. Until its rediscovery in 1750, this Greek and later Roman colony had been hidden in the marsh and today is among the best preserved temple sites in Europe.

### Ravenna – the city of mosaics

Ravenna is a real treasure chest, bursting with magnificent mosaics and well-preserved monuments, including eight UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The Basilica of San Vitale is one such example. Although unremarkable from the outside, its mesmerising interior is covered from floor to ceiling in thousands of glistening tiles.

### Zadar: more than 2,000 years of history

With its modern promenade, which replaced the monotonous concrete harbour wall, Zadar has been given a new lease of life. The city's pride and joy is the unique sea organ from which the waves coax deep soft sounds. On its steps, you can relax after strolling through the fortified old town with the monumental Church of St Donatus, the square of five wells, and four medieval gates.

### Sail through the Bay of Kotor

The emerald-green Gulf of Kotor sprawls over nearly 30 kilometres (18.6 miles) between rugged cliffs. The impressive bay cuts deep into the coast of Montenegro, creating a spectacular fjordscape.

### The glamorous seaside resorts of the Adriatic Riviera

With its mild climate, picturesque towns and clear water, the eastern Adriatic coast has been drawing summer visitors for centuries. Relaxing in style is what it was all about: On the pretty island of Korcula and in the Riviera town of Piran, neo-classical villas and Venetian-style monuments are reminders of the bygone age of glamorous seaside resorts.

### True Greece: the Sporades

## A different approach to the Adriatic Sea – head for ancient treasures and the baroque resplendence of Apulia and Calabria: Dubrovnik – Malta

### Between modernity and tradition: Bari

The wide boulevard Corso Emanuele II in Bari connects two very different worlds. While magnificent patrician houses and elegant shops dominate the new town, history comes alive in the old town with its labyrinth of narrow lanes. Most of this quarter has been reconstructed and so, modern tavernas and young galleries can now be found besides the Castello Svevo and numerous Apulian-Romanic churches.

### The Florence of the South: Lecce

Lecce is considered one of the most beautiful towns in southern Italy. Thanks to a special form of tuff stone, the town evolved into a splendid baroque city with richly decorated facades gleaming in white and gold. In Otranto there is no better way to see out the day than with a stroll through the lively old town.

### Crotone: romantic old town with ancient core

A maze of narrow lanes is hidden behind the town wall that used to protect Crotone against pirate attacks in the old days. Almost every building here includes remnants of ancient times because – as in the cathedral and the castle – vestiges of Greek buildings were recycled when the town was rebuilt. Impressive findings from ancient Kroton can be admired in the archaeological museum.

## Sicily on the starboard side – once right around the varied island and through 3,000 years of cultural history: Malta – Malta

### Sicily's many facets

The largest of the Mediterranean islands is a fabulously diverse microcosm in its own right – with rich cultural history dating back 3,000 years, with different monuments marking each era, with Europe's highest and most active volcano, Mount Etna, and with towns and villages featuring a character and flair all of their own.

### A masterwork of mosaics: the Cappella Palatina

Up to a million people – three times the population of mighty Athens – are claimed to have lived there in antiquity. This city on the small island of Ortigia was later conquered first by the Romans, then by Arabs, Byzantines and Normans. They have left behind a unique architectural heritage: The UNESCO declared Syracuse a World Heritage Site in 2005 due to its archaeological importance.

## Sicily at its best with ancient temples, norman castles and grand volcanic panoramas: Malta – Palma de Mallorca

### Beauty with a volcanic view: Taormina

The Ionic Sea glistens below; Mount Etna greets on the horizon; and on the rock plateau of Monte Tauro, the tiers of the antique “Teatro Greco” from the 2<sup>nd</sup> century B.C. rise into the sky – at this spectacular view, even Goethe was at a loss for words. Taormina did not just enchant the German poet; other famous visitors like Oscar Wilde and Liz Taylor also fell for the unique charme of this tiny, labyrinthine mountain town in northeastern Sicily.

### The small volcanic island of Lipari

Lipari is part of the Aeolian Islands, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In some places, the island’s volcanic rock formations seem to resemble sculptures, and its cultural history stretches back 7,000 years. The tiny harbours are the place to come to if you want to absorb the infectious southern Italian lifestyle.

### Erice: ancient city with spectacular views

Right on arrival, visitors to Erice are rewarded with spectacular views: Like an eagle’s nest, the town is perched on top of Monte Erice and protected by massive town walls. Time seems to have stood still in the old town centre. Surrounded by churches, steeples and castles, it is almost like having been taken back to medieval times – if it was not for the little cafés with their delicious almond pastries.

### Art as far as the eye can see: San Sperate

In 1966, the people of San Sperate decided to do away with white: Under the aegis of local artist Pinuccio Sciola, the residents began to decorate their houses with paintings. Today, the former farming village is transformed into a colourful and creative open-air art gallery, its streets and squares adorned with sculptures, poems, sound stones and installations.

#### Majestic city panorama: Taroudant

Taroudant was once the residence of a Berber ruler, a rich hub for caravans and an important place for trade. The town is lovingly referred to as “Marrakech’s little sister”. The lively Medina is entered through an imposing wall, in front of which lie swathes of olive and orange plantations, and behind which you will see the snow-covered peaks of the High Atlas mountains.

#### Windjammer rendezvous off the Canaries

Sailing from Casablanca to Las Palmas, the two SEA CLOUD sisters follow the same course for several days. #### Lanzarote and its famous architect

With his vision of a harmonious link between mankind and nature, César Manrique transformed Lanzarote into a work of art. ### The rich cultural mix of the Cape Verde Islands

### Megacity in the jungle: Panama City

As an international trade centre, gate to the Panama Canal and starting point for excursions to spectacular national parks, Panama City has evolved into a lively trend metropolis. Away from the sparkling skyline, time still moves at a different pace in the old quarter of the Casco Viejo: Strolling along grand old boulevards lined with bougainvillea is like walking right back into colonial times.

### The Bocas del Toro National Park

Bocas del Toro is the name of a town and a province in the north-west of Panama. It also encompasses six larger islands and countless smaller ones. The region's main attraction is its national marine park – a sanctuary that allows plants and animals to flourish both above and below the waterline. That is why, on our boat and snorkelling excursion, we are able to take you to white sandy beaches and offer you the finest glimpse of the underwater world in crystal clear waters.

Here, where salt and seaweed scents the air and granite rocks dot the green meadows, the cordial inhabitants enjoy a peaty whiskey – toasting their arcane homeland as well as the much longed-for summer sun that lights up the coloured facades in the ports of Tobermory and Stornoway.

### The culinary delights of Northern Spain

Fresh fish, delicious seafood, tasty beef and exquisite cheeses – in the four northern provinces Basque Country, Cantabria, Asturia and Galicia, the sea and the mountains offer everything that makes a gourmet's heart beat faster. According to Galician legend, the Cíes archipelago is the place where God rested on the seventh day after he created the world – and it is easy to see why. The site, now a nature reserve, encompasses a substantial area of sea and three islands which, with their steep coasts, sand dunes and small forests, are perfect for individual hikes.

### Sicily's many facets

The largest of the Mediterranean islands is a fabulously diverse microcosm in its own right – with rich cultural history dating back 3,000 years, with different monuments marking each era, with Europe's highest and most active volcano, Mount Etna, and with towns and villages featuring a character and flair all of their own.

This city on the small island of Ortigia was later conquered first by the Romans, then by Arabs, Byzantines and Normans. They have left behind a unique architectural heritage: The UNESCO declared Syracuse a World Heritage Site in 2005 due to its archaeological importance.

### The scenic Amalfi Coast

Fancy a walk from Monaco's harbour with its luxury yachts up the hill to the palace and cathedral? If you'd rather save your strength, you can simply take the escalator.

### Little Venice in Languedoc: Sète

To one side the blue of the lagoon, as smooth as glass; opposite the Mediterranean Sea: Sète has found itself a comfortable spot by the water. With its colourful facades, the canals and bridges, the harbour town is considered the "Venice of Languedoc". On its main canal, the Canal Royal, you can dine like a king – especially the local oysters are a treat!

1.1. Via your tour application, you are offering SCC, in a binding manner, the opportunity to close a travel agreement. Your tour registration may transpire in writing. The travel agreement will only become binding from the time that we confirm the reservation and the price to you or your travel agent in writing.

1.2. The applicant is liable for all contractual obligations of other tour participants that he/she registers provided that he/she has expressly confirmed to do so.

1.3. You shall receive a travel confirmation upon conclusion of the contract or without delay thereafter. The confirmation shall contain all essential information regarding travel performances you have reserved, provided that said information does not already follow from the travel brochure.

1.4. All personal data, which you submit to us for handling your trip, is subject to the provisions of the Federal Data Protection Act. Data will be protected against improper use.

1.5. If the subject-matter of the confirmation of the holiday deviates from the subject-matter of the booking, then a new offer by SCC is in existence to which it is bound for the duration of 10 days. The contract comes into existence on the basis of this new offer if the traveller declares his/her acceptance to SCC in writing or by payment within the commitment period.

#### 2. Payment

2.1. You are required to make a down-payment of 10% per person within one week following receipt of the travel confirmation and the invoice. The remaining balance shall be due for payment four weeks prior to commencement of travel and before receipt of travel documents (tickets, etc.). The entire tour price is due for immediate payment in the event of applications made at short notice.

2.2. If the traveller is in default with a payment to SCC, SCC can cancel the contract. In this case SCC can claim cancellation fees in accordance with paragraph 5.2.

2.3. The travel contract will be cancelled automatically if payment is not received by the beginning of travel. In this instance, SCC will be entitled to demand corresponding cancellation charges as compensation for damages according to paragraph 5.2.

2.4. The customer is required to bear the cost of ancillary performances, such as acquiring a visa, etc., as well as the costs for reservations or inquiries made by telephone.

2.5. All payments must be made directly to SCC. **The travel agency is not authorized to receive payments.** Payments to the intermediary travel agency will be made at the traveller's own risk and will have no debt-discharging effect should the travel agency fail to forward the payments to SCC.

#### 3. Performances and Prices

3.1. The scope of contractual performances arises from the services as specified in the offer and in the booking confirmation.

##### 3.2. Flights

SCC only arranges flights as intermediary if this is expressly stated in the confirmation of travel. Carriage is booked in the Tourist Class; also in the Business or First Class at extra tariff cost in as far as these are available. Flights on days other than the travel days booked e.g. as a result of pre- or post-programmes can lead to extra costs. The airlines always only accept seat reservations as non-binding wishes.

The conditions of carriage of the airlines for whose flights we act as intermediary are binding. We shall be pleased to provide these to you on request.

Depending on the selection of flights it can happen that the outward flight is in the late afternoon or evening, but the return flight is in the morning. There is no claim for compensation for catering services not used at the location.

##### 3.3. Luggage conveyance

Up to 20 kg luggage per flight passenger will be conveyed (First Class 30 kg). For travel to some countries (incl. USA, Canada, Mexico and within Germany) measurements are based not on the weight, but instead on the number of luggage items and their dimensions. Excess luggage can in principle be carried at extra cost. Children under the age of two have no claim to luggage conveyance.

Please report damage or delays in delivery promptly on the spot to the relevant airline via a Property Irregularity Report (P.I.R.). The report is a prerequisite for any liability.

##### 3.4. Services not used by traveller

SCC shall endeavour to obtain reimbursement of saved costs from the service provider if the traveller fails to utilize travel services due to premature return journey and in other significant cases. This shall not apply if services are fully irrelevant or if a refund is opposed by legal or official regulations. SCC is entitled to retain 20% of the refundable amount as compensation for additional effort and expenses.

#### 4. Modification of Services and Prices

4.1. A change of airline company, of aircraft or of the departure and arrival airport may become necessary should an airline cancel a flight and e.g. in the event of failure of the airline to comply with the flight schedule. Right is retained to effect such kind of change or modification in such or similar instances.

Only costs, equivalent to a second class railroad journey, will be refunded in the event of substitute transportation.

4.2. Changes in the trip's itinerary are possible for ship voyages, e.g. in case of floodings or low water level, inclement weather conditions, governmental regulations, if the vessel could not adhere to its schedule at the time that travel commences because of

an unforeseen technical defect that causes postponement of the trip itinerary, if the vessel's management alters the vessel's course in the interest of passengers' safety or any other special reason related to the ship travel. In any such cases SCC has the right to make use of other means of transportation such as but not limited to coaches and buses for some routes.

4.3. Any such and comparable divergences from and modifications to individual travel performances contained in the travel agreement, which become necessary after the agreement is closed, and which are not induced by SCC contrary to the principles of good faith and trust, are solely permissible, if they are not substantial and if they do not impede the overall tailored style of the reserved trip.

The modified performance shall supersede the performance due under contract. Contingent claims under warranty shall remain unaffected, in as far as substitute performance is flawed.

In the event that the overall tailored style of the reserved trip is unreasonably modified due to said substitute performances, then we shall grant you the option to change your reservations, free of charge, or to cancel the travel agreement without paying any fees. SCC shall undertake to immediately inform you of any such divergences or modifications, in as far as possible.

4.4. SCC reserves the right to alter the indicated prices, which have been confirmed on booking, in the case of an increase of transportation costs or of fees for particular services, such as port or airport charges, bunker surcharges, insurance fees or in the case of an alteration of the exchange rates applicable to the holiday in question, to the extent to which this increase has an effect on the price of the holiday per person or per seat, provided more than four months lie between the conclusion of the contract and the stipulated date of the holiday.

In the case of a subsequent amendment to the price of the holiday or of an amendment to an essential travel service, SCC must inform the traveller accordingly without delay, at the latest, however, 21 days before commencement of the holiday. Price increases after this period are not permissible. In the case of price increases of more than 5% or in the case of a considerable amendment to an essential travel service, the traveller is entitled to withdraw from the tourist travel contract free of charge or to demand to take a holiday which is at least of the same value, if the tour operator is in a position to offer such a holiday from its range of holidays at no extra cost for the traveller. The customer must assert these rights without delay against SCC after the latter's declaration of the price increase or of the amendment of the travel service.

#### 5. Cancellation, Changing Reservations, Substitute Persons

5.1. You may cancel your trip in writing at any time prior to commencement of travel. Your cancellation notice shall become effective on the date we receive it. If we receive your notice out of office hours (Monday to Friday 9-17h CET), your notice shall become effective on the next working day (except Saturday).

5.2. If one of the parties cancels the contract or if you do not start the journey, SCC may demand reasonable compensation for arrangements it has made in conjunction with the trip and for its expenses, even if SCC has not yet confirmed the trip or if you fail to begin the journey. Our flat rate claim to reimbursement consists of a processing fee of EUR 25 per person for cancellation of a reserved trip up to 150 days prior to commencement of travel. The following annulment fees shall arise in the event of later cancellation:

- 25% of the tour price for cancellation 149 – 50 days prior to commencement of travel;
- 35% of the tour price for cancellation 49 – 22 days prior to commencement of travel;
- 55% of the tour price for cancellation 21 – 15 days prior to commencement of travel;
- 80% of the tour price for cancellation 14 days or less prior to commencement of travel;
- 90% of the tour price for cancellation on the same day as the commencement of travel or failure to appear.

Costs that the service provider charges to SCC, e.g., empty bed fee charged by a hotel for cancellation at short notice or special fees for cruises, shall be additionally invoiced in the event that individual or group trips are annulled.

The traveller is free to prove to SCC that SCC has no loss or that the loss is less than the aforementioned flat rate. In this case the lower proven loss will be applied in place of the flat. SCC reserves the right to charge reimbursement fees beyond the flat rates mentioned above.

In this case SCC has to verify and prove the loss, taking any expenses that have been saved and/or any other potential uses for the travel services into consideration.

5.3. We will endeavour to modify the travel registration (change reservations) subject to availability, at your request, up to 75 days prior to commencement of travel.

Any change of reservations made as of the 74th day prior to commencement of travel will require you to serve notice that you are cancelling the reserved trip, and it will require subsequent re-registration. This shall not apply for requested changes of reservations that solely cause substantiated, minor expenses.

Modification of the travel date, the travel destination, accommodations or the means of transportation shall apply as a change of reservations.

5.4. You may appoint a substitute person for yourself up to commencement of travel. In such case you are required to inform the tour organizer thereof. The tour organizer may object to any such substitute person on the basis of good cause, (e.g., special requirements linked to the trip, statutory bans, refusal by airlines or by hotel operators, etc.). If a third party enters into the contract, then he or she and the registrant are jointly and severally liable in respect of SCC for the price of the holiday and for additional costs incurred through the entry of the third party.

5.5. Cancellation fees and fees for changing reservations are due for immediate payment.

#### 6. Cancellation and Rescission of Agreement by the Tour Organizer

6.1. SCC may rescind the travel agreement after commencement of travel, without complying with a term of notice, if travellers persistently disturb execution of the trip despite an appropriate warning issued by the tour organizer. The same shall apply if anyone should behave in a manner which is gravely in breach of contract and justifies the immediate cancellation. In addition SCC has the right to cancel the travel contract without notice if in the captain's opinion the traveller is unfit for travel due to illness, physical disability or for any other reason or if the traveller requires special assistance but is travelling without this assistance or if the trip has been booked based on incorrect information. SCC shall, however, after cancellation retain its claim to the tour price. The person causing the disturbance is liable for any possible extra cost for return transportation.

However, SCC is required to allow credit for the value of saved costs as well as for advantages which may be obtained from another application of services not used, including possible reimbursements from service providers.

6.2. SCC may rescind the trip up to two weeks prior to commencement of travel due to failure to obtain the minimum number of participants if (a) the minimum number of participants in the brochure is stated as well as the point in time by which the traveller must be informed of the withdrawal prior to the contractually agreed-upon commencement of the travel and (b) the number of minimum participants as well as the latest date of possible cancellation are clearly stated in the travel confirmation or reference is made to the respective travel description where such information is stated. The cancellation notice will be immediately forwarded to you. Your paid tour price will be immediately refunded.

## 7. Rescission of the Contract due to exceptional Circumstances

7.1. SCC or the traveller may both rescind the travel agreement if the trip is rendered considerably difficult, endangered or impeded due to an Act of Providence, (e.g., war, internal unrest, natural catastrophes). SCC shall immediately refund the paid tour price in such instance.

However, SCC may demand compensation for rendered or outstanding travel performances.

7.2. If a trip is cancelled subsequent to commencement of travel, then the tour organizer is obligated to undertake appropriate measures, and he is especially obligated to provide return transportation for travellers, if possible. The contracting parties shall each bear one half of the costs for return transportation. The traveller will be required to bear all additional expenses.

## 8. Liability

8.1. We shall bear liability within the scope of the due diligence of a prudent businessman:

8.1.1. for conscientious preparation of the trip;

8.1.2. for careful selection and monitoring of service providers, (e.g., transportation corporations, hotel operators, etc.);

8.1.3. for due and proper rendering of contractually covenanted tour performances, under consideration of applicable legal provisions of the respective country and place of destination.

8.2. However, we are not liable for information contained in hotel and local site brochures. We have no influence on their origin. We also bear no liability if national political conditions and contingent entry regulations change at the point of destination, after this brochure is printed, that encumber entry into the affected country or point of destination or which render the same infeasible. We shall inform you at short notice of any such essential, subsequent changes, in as far as possible.

8.3. We are liable for the fault of a person entrusted with rendering a service, unless otherwise stipulated under these Terms and Conditions of Travel or stipulated by prevailing conditions, and provided that the person entrusted to render service had caused an instance of damage not only upon the occasion of performing contract. The measure of indebted diligence shall be determined by conditions at the site of service rendered. Your tour will primarily take you to foreign countries, where foreign living conditions and where laws, that are partially foreign to us, prevail.

### 8.4. Scope of liability

SCC is not liable for faulty performances among mediated third party services, provided that expressed reference is made to mediated services in the travel documents and on the travel confirmation. Having stated this requirement, the following provisions shall solely apply for flights for which the traveller receives a corresponding ticket:

SCC, in its capacity as a mediator, is not liable for performance of transportation services, rather the corporate carrier is responsible. SCC is not an air freight carrier. The liability of airline companies is based on their own terms and conditions of transportation, which can be provided by SCC upon request. For all remaining purposes, airlines' liability is restricted by international conventions and regulations, e.g., by the Warsaw Convention and EU Directive No. 295/91 dated February 4, 1991. We will send these to you upon request. Liability for damages caused by delay is excluded.

### 8.5. Warranty

8.5.1. The traveller may demand relief if the tour is not performed in compliance with contract. SCC may refuse relief if it necessitates disproportionate expense.

8.5.2. After returning from the tour, the traveller may demand reduction of the tour price, commensurate with reduced performance, in the event that the demand for relief was unsuccessful and the trip was not performed in compliance with contract. This shall not affect contingent, more extensive claims for subsequent reduction of the tour price.

8.5.3. The traveller may rescind the travel agreement if the tour organizer failed to perform relief, within a reasonable term, or if the tour organizer formally states that relief cannot be performed, and if the trip will be considerably impaired due to performance of services under noncompliance with contract. If the agreement is rescinded in this manner, then SCC is obligated to take appropriate measures, and especially to provide return transportation for travellers, if required.

8.6. The traveller may demand compensation for damages, and more precisely for vacation time spent to no avail, provided that the tour organizer is liable for a circumstance that caused a flaw in the tour.

### 8.7. Restriction of liability

8.7.1. The tour operator's contractual liability is limited to three times the tour price, provided that damages sustained by the traveller are not caused by intent or gross negligence. The same applies in as far as the tour organizer is responsible for damages incurred by a traveller solely through the fault of a service provider.

8.7.2. The tour organizer is not liable for defective performances that arise in conjunction with services mediated as third party performances, (e.g., sporting events, attendance at theatres, exhibitions, etc.), and which are expressly identified as third party performances in the brochure.

8.7.3. A claim to damage against the tour organizer is restricted or excluded, if – under legal provisions applicable to required, rendered performances of a service provider – a claim for damage against a service provider may solely be asserted under certain conditions or limitations or if such claim is excluded under certain conditions.

8.7.4. If the tour organizer assumes a position equivalent to a freight carrier, then his liability shall be regulated by the provisions of the Air Transportation Act in conjunction with conventions covenanted in Warsaw, The Hague, Guadalajara and the Montreal Agreement (solely for flights to Canada and the USA). As a rule, the Warsaw Convention limits the freight carrier's liability for death or physical injury and for loss and damage of luggage. If the tour organizer constitutes a service provider, in other instances, then he shall bear liability in accordance with provisions that apply for a service provider.

8.7.5. If the tour organizer assumes a position equivalent to a carrier, within the scope of sea voyages, then his liability shall be regulated in compliance with provisions of the Commercial Code and the Inland Waterways Transportation Act.

## 8.8. Duty to cooperate, complaints

8.8.1. In the event of defective performance, each traveller is required to undertake whatever may be reasonably expected of him/her to contribute to alleviate the defect and to keep any potential damages to a minimum.

8.8.2. If you should have reason for complaints, contrary to our expectations, then immediately inform our tour management on site. If a respective local tour manager or tour agent is not available or cannot be reached, or if they cannot alleviate a defective performance, then please turn to the service provider (transfer company, hotel operator) and/or the tour organizer or to his contact address in the area of destination. A traveller is not entitled to claims if he/she culpably fails to perform the above obligations.

8.8.3. Tour guides are not authorized to formally recognize any claims whatsoever.

## 9. Exclusion of Claims and Statute of Limitation

9.1. Your claims are to be asserted within one month following the contractually covenanted date of return. Claims are to be stated in writing and forwarded to SEA CLOUD CRUISES GmbH, An der Alster 9, 20099 Hamburg, Germany. You may only assert claims after expiration of the above term, if you were hindered from complying with the deadline through no fault of your own.

9.2. All claims arising from the travel agreement shall lapse one year following the contractually covenanted date of return.

9.3. Claims for damages due to prohibited actions shall lapse in two years.

9.4. The statute of limitations is suspended if the tour organizer initially states to you that complaints and claims are being examined. The suspension is lifted when the tour organizer informs the customer of the results of his examination with regard to the customer's claims.

## 10. Insurance Coverage

10.1. You are insured against transportation risk during flights, within the scope of lawful provisions.

10.2. For your own safety, we recommend that you take out a travel insurance policy that includes cancellation, interruption, health, luggage, accident and liability coverage.

## 11. Passport, Visa, Customs, Foreign Exchange and Health Regulations

11.1. You will receive essential information on the formalities required for your trip. This information will be conveyed along with travel documents and through the travel description contained in the catalogue. Please heed this information, as each traveller is himself/herself responsible for compliance with these regulations. You shall bear all costs and the negative impact of failure to comply with said information.

11.2. You have to ensure that your passport, which you will require for your trip, is still valid, for a period of six months beyond the planned travel date. Children require a children's passport which is appropriate to the respective destination. This information applies for German citizens. Foreign nationals and holders of foreign passports are requested to turn to their relevant consulate or embassy for appropriate information.

11.3. You are liable to SCC for all consequences and damages, especially penalties, fees and expenses, that must be paid or deposited as a result of your failure to follow applicable regulations for entry into, exit out of or transit through a country, or if in case you have not provided the necessary documents or not provided them in the prescribed manner. You are obliged to immediately reimburse any funds that SCC must pay or deposit.

## 12. General Remarks

12.1. Printing errors and computational errors in the brochure or on the travel confirmation shall entitle SCC to avoid the validity of the travel agreement. In such instance, SCC is required to compensate the traveller for the proven loss incurred by relying on a declaration.

12.2. All information in our tour description corresponds to the current status of information at the time of printing.

12.3. Invalidity of individual provisions of the travel agreement shall not result in invalidity of the entire travel agreement. The same shall apply for these same Terms and Conditions of Travel.

12.4. Oral agreements are only valid if we have confirmed them in writing.

12.5. The conditions of the respective shipowner or transportation corporation shall apply in the event of travel by ship, combined air and ship travel, combined train and ship travel and for bus trips. We will provide you with a copy of their conditions upon request.

12.6. German law is solely applicable to the contractual relationship between the traveller and SCC.

12.7. The Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg is deemed venue for courts of law for all registered businessmen, and for persons who do not have a domestic place of jurisdiction, as well as for persons who moved their place of residence or usual abode to a foreign country, after closing the travel agreement, or whose place of residence or usual abode is not known at the time that a suit is filed, and for litigation as a defendant.

12.8. SCC does not participate in the voluntary procedure for alternative dispute resolution for customer disputes in accordance with the Customer Dispute Resolution Law (Verbraucherstreitbeilegungsgesetz) and is not obliged to do so.
